In addition, all unclassified 2 positions employed to provide patient care at the University of Arkansas for 3 Medical Sciences will be eligible to receive incentive pay not to exceed 1.2 4 times their base hourly rate. Employees required to work in specialty areas 5 will be eligible to receive up to ten percent (10%) of the hourly rate paid 6 as a specialty differential while working in such areas. When overtime, 7 shift differentials, standby pay, incentive pay and/or specialty differential 8 are provided to employees as herein described, the total may exceed the line 9 item maximum salaries for those positions as included in this Act. The 10 positions of Patient Care Administrator, Associate Administrator, and 11 Assistant Administrator of Patient Care as authorized in the Regular Salaries 12 - Operations section of this Act shall be excluded from coverage of this 13 Section. In addition, the Board of Trustees may also make special 14 compensation allowances available, in such amounts as the Board may determine 15 or justify equitable in view of the current requirements for Registered 16 Nurses in the Clinical Programs of the University of Arkansas for Medical 17 Sciences and the availability of Registered Nurses for employment in the 18 Little Rock metropolitan area. However, under no condition shall the special 19 allowances approved by the Board of Trustees for a single individual exceed 20 the state line item maximum by more than twenty percent (20%) for those positions included in this Act. 21

Maintenance of statewide 25 screening and assessment protocols as well as evidence-based training of 26 mental health professionals are to be considered critical components of the 27 overall goals. For the provision of assessment and therapeutic services, 28 these funds are to be provided to the Child Safety Centers through contracts 29 from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. The contracts will 30 stipulate the terms of the agreement and reporting requirements; an amount 31 not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) may be utilized for 32 administrative costs as may be necessary to administer the program or if 33 determined not to be needed for administrative costs may be placed in reserve 34 for future needs of the program. The remaining two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) shall be allocated and made available to the Department of 35 36 Pediatrics for expenses for medical examinations, consultation, education and

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training as stipulated in the terms of agreement between the Chancellor of
 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Department of
 Pediatrics.

4 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2020

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7 SECTION 56. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. DHS AND 9 UAMS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING. The University of Arkansas for Medical 10 Sciences (UAMS) and the Department of Human Services shall enter into a 11 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to determine any reimbursement, 12 administrative charges or fees for the State Olmstead plan or for processing 13 or administration of State match funds charges as reimbursement funding for 14 federal financial participation under the Medicaid's Disproportionate Share 15 (DSH) reimbursement program or any other arrangements or agreements that 16 could benefit UAMS for Fiscal Year 2019 and forward upon prior review of the 17 Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint 18 Budget Committee.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2020
20 <u>2021</u> through June 30, 2021 <u>2022</u>.

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22 SECTION 57. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 23 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 24 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 25 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 26 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 27 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures 28 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this 29 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied 30 31 with in disbursement of said funds.

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33 SECTION 58. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 34 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 35 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 36 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive

Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. SECTION 59. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits

the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2021 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2021 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental

programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act

being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health

and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2021.
