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4	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 12, Chapter 1, is amended to add an		
5	additional section to read as follows:		
6	12-1-103. Public Safety Equipment Grant Program.		
7	(a)(1) There is created within the Department of Public Safety the		
8	Public Safety Equipment Grant Program to be administered by the Secretary of		
9	the Department of Public Safety.		
10	(2) The secretary may hire personnel necessary to carry out the		
11	duties of administering the program.		
12	(3) The secretary has exclusive authority to award grants under		
13	the program.		
14	(b)(1) The secretary shall award grants under the program to law		
15	enforcement agencies, detention centers, and corrections agencies for		
16	equipment that aids in improving trust and relationships between law		
17	enforcement agencies, detention centers, and corrections agencies and the		
18	communities that they serve.		
19	(2) Grants may be made for equipment, training, or accreditation		
20	including without limitation:		
21	(A) Body cameras with auto-activation capabilities,		
22	including those with the ability to wirelessly activate based on situational		
23	needs such as unholstering a firearm, conducted electrical device, or call		
24	for service dispatch activity;		
25	(B) In-car cameras with auto-activation capabilities;		
26	(C) Cloud-based storage services;		
27	(D) Conducted electrical devices and related training		
28	programs;		
29	(E) Virtual reality training related to de-escalation;		
30	(F) Agency accreditation programs;		
31	(G) Bulletproof vests;		
32	(H) Pepper spray;		
33	(I) Rubber bullets; and		
34	(J) Other equipment as deemed necessary by the secretary.		
35	(3) As a condition for receiving a grant under this section, the		
36	secretary may require a law enforcement agency, detention center, or		

1	corrections agency to provide matching funds at a percentage to be determined		
2	by the secretary.		
3	(4) As a part of the grant application process, the secretary		
4	may:		
5	(A) Design procedures and criteria for awarding grants		
6	under this section;		
7	(B) Receive and review applications for grants under this		
8	section;		
9	(C) Prescribe the form, nature, and extent of the		
10	information that shall be contained in an application for a grant under this		
11	section;		
12	(D) Audit and inspect the records of grant recipients; and		
13	(E) Require reports from grant recipients.		
14	(c) On or before October 1 of each year, the secretary shall submit a		
15	report to the Governor and the cochairs of the Legislative Council providing		
16	an account of the activities and expenditures of the program during the		
17	preceding calendar year.		
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19	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 19, Chapter 5, Subchapter 12, is		
20	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:		
21	19-5-1269. Public Safety Equipment Grant Program Fund.		
22	(a) There is created on the books of the Treasurer of State, the		
23	Auditor of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a miscellaneous		
24	fund to be known as the "Public Safety Equipment Grant Program Fund".		
25	(b) The fund shall consist of:		
26	(1) General revenues authorized by law;		
27	(2) Moneys obtained from private grants or other sources that		
28	are designated to be credited to the fund; and		
29	(3) Any other revenues authorized by law.		
30	(c) The fund shall be used by the Secretary of the Department of		
31	Public Safety as provided in § 12-1-103.		
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33	SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
34	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that nonlethal equipment can save		
35	lives and improve transparency between law enforcement and the communities		
36	that they serve; and that this act provides for the nonlethal equipment		

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1	necessary to save lives and improve transparency. Therefore, an emergency is		
2	declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the		
3	improvement of transparency between law enforcement and the communities that		
4	they serve shall become effective on:		
5	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
6	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
7	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
8	bill; or		
9	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
10	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
