36	(a) A person may apply to the Director o	f the Alcoholic Beverage

T	control division for a wine direct snipper permit that authorizes the wine
2	direct shipper permit holder to ship vinous liquor and mead directly to a
3	consumer's home or business address pursuant to the Direct Shipment of Vinous
4	Liquor Act, § 3-5-1701 et seq.
5	(b) The wine direct shipper permit may be issued by the Alcoholic
6	Beverage Control Division to a qualified person.
7	(c) A person applying for a wine direct shipper permit shall provide
8	the division with a copy of the person's current license to manufacture,
9	supply, or import wine or mead issued by:
10	(1) The person's state of domicile; and
11	(2) The Alcohol and Tobacco Tax and Trade Bureau of the
12	United States Department of the Treasury.
13	(d)(1) A wine direct shipper permit shall be issued initially for a
14	fee of one hundred dollars (\$100).
15	(2) A wine direct shipper permit shall expire on June 30 of each
16	year and may be renewed annually for a fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00).
17	(e) A wine direct shipper permit holder shall collect and pay all
18	sales taxes and excise taxes due on a sale in this state as required under
19	the Direct Shipment of Vinous Liquor Act, § 3-5-1701 et seq.

22	The Alcoholic Beverage Control Division may adopt rules to:
23	(1) Carry out this subchapter;
24	(2) Establish appropriate application forms, permit forms, and

1	alcoholic beverage made through the fermentation of honey as the primary
2	ingredient.
3	(B) "Mead" includes without limitation cyser, braggot,
4	metheglin, and melomels;
5	(2) "Person" means an individual, partnership, limited liability
6	company, limited liability partnership, corporation, firm, company, or other
7	entity doing business in this state; and
8	$\frac{(2)}{(3)}$ "Vinous liquor" means the fermented juices of fruits
9	containing more than five percent (5%) and not more than twenty-one percent
10	(21%) of alcohol by weight <del>; and</del>
11	(3) "Winery" means an establishment that makes vinous liquor.
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13	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 3-5-1703 is amended to read as follows:
14	3-5-1703. Registration - Renewal fee - Wine direct shipper permit.
15	(a) <del>(l)</del> Unless registered under this subchapter, a winery person
16	licensed as a wine or mead manufacturer, supplier, or importer by this state

18	shall not ship vinous liquor or mead to an Arkansas consumer consumer's home
19	or business address.
20	(2) This section does not apply to a small farm winery licensed
21	under § 3-5-1601 et seq.
22	(b) Prior to the winery's first shipment into or within the state, the
23	winery person seeking to ship vinous liquor or mead directly to a consumer's
24	home or business address in this state shall:
25	(1) Register File an application with the Alcoholic Beverage
26	Control Division;
27	(2) Provide the division with a copy of the winery's person's
28	current license to manufacture, supply, or import mead or wine issued by:
29	(A) The <u>person's</u> state of domicile; and
30	(B) The Alcohol and Tobacco Tax and Trade Bureau of the
31	United States Department of the Treasury; and
32	(3) Pay a registration fee of twenty-five one hundred dollars
33	<del>(\$25.00)</del> <u>(\$100);</u>
34	(4) Consent to the jurisdiction of the division or any other
35	state agency and the state courts concerning enforcement of this section or
36	related state laws or rules; and

1	(5) Obtain a wine direct shipper permit.
2	(c) A winery shall renew its application each year with the division
3	<del>by:</del>
4	(1) Providing the division with a copy of the licenses required under
5	subdivision (b)(2) of this section; and
6	(2) Paying a renewal fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) The wine
7	$\underline{\text{direct shipper permit holder shall allow the division to perform an audit of}$
8	the wine direct shipper permit holder's records regarding the shipment of
9	wine or mead into the state upon request.
10	(d) If the wine direct shipper permit holder is located outside of the
11	state, the wine direct shipper permit holder is required to report annually
12	$\underline{\mbox{to the division}}$ the total amount of wine or mead shipped into the state $\underline{\mbox{each}}$
13	preceding calendar year.
14	(e) The wine direct shipper permit holder may renew a wine direct
15	shipper permit each year with the division by:
16	(1) Providing the division with a copy of the license and the
17	permit required under subdivision (b)(2) of this section; and
18	(2) Paying a renewal fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00).

30	winery, including without limitation taxes under §§ 3-5-1605, 3-7-104, 3-7-

33	<u>holder</u> shall be submitted to the Department of Finance and Administration as
34	directed without limitation under §§ 3-5-1605, 3-7-104, 3-7-111, and 3-7-201.
35	(3)(c) A winery wine direct shipper permit holder shall source
36	the collection of sales and use taxes to the purchaser's delivery address in

    Beverage Control Board shall notify by mail all small farm wineries licensed
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    under § 3-5-1602 and holding a small farm wine wholesale permit under § 3-5-
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    1602(e)(1)(E) issued on or before April 15, 2017, that they are eligible for
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    a small farm winery private-resident shipping permit if the winery produced
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    by fermentation at least eight hundred gallons (800 gals.) of wine in the

    previous calendar year as shown on the winery's TTB F 5120-17.
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                (2) The board shall issue a small farm winery private-resident
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    shipping permit to a small farm winery holding a small farm wine wholesale

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    small farm winery private-resident shipping permits to small farm wineries
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    licensed under § 3-5-1602 and holding a small farm wine wholesale permit
    under § 3-5-1602(c)(1)(E) issued after April 15, 2017, if the winery produced
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    by fermentation at least eight hundred gallons (800 gals.) of wine in the
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    previous calendar year as shown on the winery's TTB F 5120-17.
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                 (2) The board shall notify the public at large by legal notice
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    and internet posting that the board will accept applications for small farm
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    winery private-resident shipping permits.
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                 (3) The notice required under subdivision (b)(2) of this section
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    shall include:
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                       (A) The number of permits to be issued;
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1	(B) The last date applications will be accepted; and
2	(C) The date of a drawing to determine which applicants
3	will be awarded a permit if the number of applicants exceeds the number of
4	permits authorized by the board.
5	(4) The board shall not accept an application more than ninety
6	(90) days after the date of publication of the notice required under
7	subdivision (b)(2) of this section.
8	$(5)(\Lambda)$ If the number of applicants for a permit exceeds the
9	number of permits authorized by the board, the Director of the Alcoholic
10	Beverage Control Division shall conduct a drawing not earlier than one
11	hundred twenty (120) days after the publication of the notice specified in
12	subdivision (b)(2) of this section, nor later than one hundred eighty (180)
13	days after publication of the notice.
14	(B)(i) On the date of the drawing, each applicant for a
15	permit or his or her agent shall draw a number between one (1) and a number
16	equal to the number of permits to be granted of applications filed.
17	(ii) Position numbers shall not be transferred or
18	assigned.
19	(6) Upon payment of a licensing fee of twenty-five dollars
20	(\$25.00), the director shall issue a permit to each eligible licensee that
21	draws a number one (1) through the number authorized by the board for the
22	drawing.
23	(c) A small farm winery shall renew its small farm winery private-
24	resident shipping permit each year with the division by paying a renewal fee
25	of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).
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27	SECTION 10. Arkansas Code Title 3, Chapter 5, Subchapter 17, is
28	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:
29	3-5-1711. Administration and penalties.
30	(a)(1) The Alcoholic Beverage Control Division may enforce this
31	subchapter by administrative proceedings to suspend or revoke a wine direct
32	shipper permit.
33	(2) The division may accept payment of an offer in compromise in
34	lieu of suspension of the wine direct shipper permit holder's permit as
35	determined by rule promulgated by the division.
36	(b) A person that does not hold a wine direct shipper permit shall not

1	ship wine or mead directly to a consumer's nome or business address.	
2	(c) A person that knowingly makes, participates in, transports,	
3	imports, or receives a shipment from a person without a wine direct shipper	
4	permit upon conviction may be subject to the following:	
5	(1) An administrative penalty as established by the division for	
6	a first offense;	
7	(2) A Class C misdemeanor for a second offense; and	
8	(3) A Class D felony for a third and subsequent offense.	
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
