## For An Act To Be Entitled

9 AN ACT TO AMEND THE ARKANSAS ACADEMIC CHALLENGE  
10 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM - PART 2; TO ESTABLISH PROCEDURES  
11 AND FUNDING REQUIREMENTS FOR THE CREATION OR  
12 AMENDMENT OF SCHOLARSHIPS FUNDED WITH NET REVENUE  
13 AVAILABLE; TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER  
14 PURPOSES.

18 TO AMEND THE ARKANSAS ACADEMIC CHALLENGE  
19 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM; TO ESTABLISH  
20 PROCEDURES AND FUNDING REQUIREMENTS TO  
21 CREATE OR AMEND SCHOLARSHIPS FUNDED WITH

26 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
27

28 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 85, Subchapter 2, is amended  
29 to read as follows:

30 Subchapter 2 – Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program —~~Part 2~~  
31

32 6-85-201. Findings.

33 The General Assembly finds that:

34 (1) In approving Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 87, the  
35 citizens of this state provided an opportunity to increase the resources  
36 provided for higher education scholarships and grants through a state



1 lottery;

2 (2) The net proceeds from the state lottery, in addition to  
3 existing nonlottery state educational resources for scholarships and grants,  
4 will:

5 (A) Encourage associate degree, certificate of proficiency  
6 program, and technical certificate program recipients and university juniors  
7 to complete a baccalaureate degree;

8 (B) Provide opportunities for students more than one (1)  
9 year out of high school to enter or reenter higher education;

10 (C) Provide an improved system of communication to  
11 students and parents about opportunities for higher education scholarships  
12 and grants in Arkansas; and

13 (D) Provide an evaluation and analysis of all state  
14 funding for scholarships and grants and how the funding advances the state's  
15 goals for higher education; and

16 (3) Changes to the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship  
17 Program —~~Part 2~~ may be necessary from time to time to ensure the solvency of  
18 the program by spreading the program liabilities over a period of time while  
19 ensuring that there are scholarship dollars available for students who  
20 successfully complete their courses.

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22 6-85-202. Creation.

23 The Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program —~~Part 2~~ is hereby  
24 created and established.

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26 6-85-203. Applicability.

27 ~~(a) This subchapter is applicable to students who apply for a~~  
28 ~~scholarship under the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program — Part~~  
29 ~~2 for the academic year 2010-2011 and each academic year thereafter.~~

30 ~~(b) Except to the extent of an award amount under § 6-85-107(b)(2), a~~  
31 ~~recipient of a scholarship under the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship~~  
32 ~~Program — Part 1, § 6-85-101 et seq., is not eligible for an additional~~  
33 ~~scholarship under this subchapter.~~

34 (e) Recipients of Arkansas Governor's Distinguished Scholarships are  
35 prohibited from receiving Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarships under this  
36 subchapter.

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6-85-204. Definitions.

As used in this subchapter:

(1) "ACT" means the ACT ~~Assessment~~ administered by ACT, Inc.;

(2) "ACT equivalent" means the SAT, COMPASS, ~~Accuplacer~~ ACCUPLACER, or other nationally normed test that is correlated with the ACT and approved by the Division of Higher Education for use by institutions of higher education to assess a person's college readiness;

(3) "Approved institution of higher education" means an institution of higher education approved by the division to participate in the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program ~~—Part 2~~ and that is:

(A) A state-supported two-year or four-year college or university;

(B) A private, nonprofit two-year or four-year college or university with its primary headquarters located in Arkansas that is eligible to receive Title IV federal student aid funds; or

(C) An approved school of nursing, subject to the provisions of § 6-85-213(c);

(4) "Approved school of nursing" means a school of nursing with its primary headquarters located in Arkansas that:

(A) Prepares students as registered nurses;

(B) Grants nursing diplomas;

(C) Is eligible to participate in the Higher Education Act of 1965, Title IV federal student aid programs;

(D) Is approved by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing;

(E) Has been approved by the division as eligible to participate in the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program; and

(F) Is not a two-year or four-year college or university;

(5) "Arkansas resident" means a natural person who provides evidence deemed sufficient by the division that:

(A) For the twelve-month period required under § 6-85-206(1), the person:

(i) Maintained a permanent home in Arkansas where the person resides for an average of no less than four (4) days and nights per calendar week; and

(ii) Either:

- 1 (a) Is an Arkansas registered voter;
- 2 (b) Holds a valid Arkansas motor vehicle
- 3 driver's license;
- 4 (c) Receives benefits under an Arkansas public
- 5 assistance program;
- 6 (d) Uses an Arkansas residence address for
- 7 federal or state tax purposes; or
- 8 (e) Claims Arkansas as a residence to hold
- 9 public office or for judicial actions; or

10 (B) Before the deadline for filing a scholarship  
 11 application under this subchapter the applicant:

- 12 (i) Is on active military status;
- 13 (ii) Qualifies for in-state tuition and fees under §
- 14 6-60-205; and
- 15 (iii) Meets one (1) of the conditions under
- 16 subdivision (5)(A)(ii) of this section;

17 (6) "Continuously enrolled" means:

18 (A) For a traditional student, he or she successfully  
 19 completes at an approved institution of higher education twenty-seven (27)  
 20 semester hours in the first academic year as a recipient and, except as  
 21 provided in ~~§ 6-85-212(e)(1)(A)(iv)(e)~~ § 6-85-212(d)(1)(A)(iv)(c),  
 22 successfully completes thirty (30) semester hours each academic year  
 23 thereafter;

24 (B) For a full-time nontraditional student, he or she  
 25 successfully completes at an approved institution of higher education at  
 26 least fifteen (15) semester hours of courses in consecutive semesters;

27 ~~(C) For a full-time current achiever student, he or she~~

28 ~~(i) Before receiving a scholarship under this~~  
 29 ~~subchapter, successfully completed at least twelve (12) semester hours of~~  
 30 ~~courses in consecutive semesters; and~~

31 ~~(ii) As a recipient of a scholarship under this~~  
 32 ~~subchapter, successfully completes at an approved institution of higher~~  
 33 ~~education at least fifteen (15) semester hours of courses in consecutive~~  
 34 ~~semesters;~~

35 ~~(D)~~(C) For a part-time nontraditional student, he or she  
 36 successfully completes at an approved institution of higher education at

1 least six (6) semester hours of courses in consecutive semesters; and

2 ~~(E)(D)~~ For a student who is enrolled in a degree plan that  
 3 has a maximum number of semester hours in a semester that is less than the  
 4 requirements of subdivisions ~~(6)(A)-(D)~~ (6)(A)-(C) of this section, he or she  
 5 successfully completes at an approved institution of higher education the  
 6 maximum number of hours required by the degree plan for the semester;

7 ~~(7) “Current achiever student” means a student;~~

8 ~~(A) Who meets the requirements of § 6-85-209; and~~

9 ~~(B) Is not a traditional student or a nontraditional~~  
 10 ~~student;~~

11 ~~(8) “End-of-course assessment” means an examination taken at the~~  
 12 ~~completion of a course of study to determine whether a student demonstrates~~  
 13 ~~attainment of the knowledge and skills necessary for mastery of that subject;~~

14 ~~(9)(7)~~ (7) “Enrolled” means that the approved institution of higher  
 15 education where the student is attending class counts the student as enrolled  
 16 for the hours claimed on the last day to add or drop a class at the approved  
 17 institution of higher education;

18 ~~(10) “High school equivalency test” means a test measuring the~~  
 19 ~~knowledge and skills usually learned in high school that is administered by a~~  
 20 ~~state-approved institution or organization;~~

21 ~~(11)(8)~~ (8) “High school grade point average” means the numbered  
 22 grade average on a student’s high school transcript calculated:

23 (A) For a traditional student, using the first seven (7)  
 24 of the last eight (8) semesters the student completed prior to graduating  
 25 high school; or

26 (B) For a nontraditional student, using the last eight (8)  
 27 semesters the student completed before graduating high school;

28 ~~(12)(9)~~ (9) “Lawful permanent resident” means a non-United States  
 29 citizen who resides in the United States under a legally recognized and  
 30 lawfully recorded permanent residence and who may receive state public  
 31 benefits under 8 U.S.C. § 1622;

32 ~~(13)(10)~~ (10) “Net proceeds from the state lottery” means lottery  
 33 proceeds for one (1) fiscal year less the operating expenses defined in § 23-  
 34 115-103 for the fiscal year;

35 ~~(14)(11)~~ (11) “Nonlottery state educational resources” means the  
 36 funding available for state-supported scholarships and grants for students

1 enrolled in postsecondary education in this state that:

2 (A) The General Assembly makes available from general  
3 revenue to the Higher Education Grants Fund Account without consideration of  
4 the availability of proceeds from the state lottery; and

5 (B) The Department of Finance and Administration estimates  
6 is available for distribution to the Higher Education Grants Fund Account  
7 during a fiscal year from the Educational Excellence Trust Fund;

8 ~~(15) “Nontraditional student” means a student who is not a~~  
9 ~~traditional student or a current achiever student;~~

10 ~~(16) “Personally identifiable student data” means any~~  
11 ~~information that, alone or in combination with other available information,~~  
12 ~~is linked or linkable to a specific student that would allow a reasonable~~  
13 ~~person in the student’s school community to identify the student with~~  
14 ~~reasonable certainty;~~

15 ~~(17) “Postsecondary grade point average” means the cumulative~~  
16 ~~numbered grade average for college credit courses as calculated using a 4.0~~  
17 ~~scale;~~

18 ~~(18)~~(12) “Qualified certificate program” means a program:

19 (A) That is offered by an approved institution of higher  
20 education;

21 (B) For which credit hours are awarded that are creditable  
22 toward an associate degree or baccalaureate degree; and

23 (C) Recognized by the United States Department of  
24 Education for financial aid purposes;

25 ~~(19)~~(13) “Recipient” means an applicant awarded a scholarship  
26 funded through the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program — ~~Part 2;~~

27 ~~(20) “Scholarship hold” means the temporary suspension of a~~  
28 ~~scholarship award to a traditional student under this subchapter approved by~~  
29 ~~the division under § 6-85-221;~~

30 ~~(21)~~(14) “Semester” means one-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of a traditional academic  
31 year at an institution of higher education, or an equivalent approved by the  
32 division, in which a student enrolls for not less than:

33 (A) Fifteen (15) credit hours as a full-time student,  
34 except that in the first semester as a first-time full-time freshman, a  
35 traditional student shall enroll in not less than twelve (12) credit hours;

36 or

1 (B) Six (6) credit hours as a part-time student;

2 ~~(22) “Smart Core” means:~~

3 ~~(A) The college and career readiness curriculum by that~~  
4 ~~name under rules of the State Board of Education; or~~

5 ~~(B) A college and career readiness curriculum that is:~~

6 ~~(i) Established by rules of the State Board of~~  
7 ~~Education in coordination with the division; and~~

8 ~~(ii) Substituted for the curriculum named “Smart~~  
9 ~~Core”;~~

10 ~~(23)~~(15) “State-supported student financial assistance” means a  
11 state-supported scholarship, grant, tuition waiver, or tuition reimbursement  
12 funded with state funds or net proceeds from the state lottery awarded by:

13 (A) The division; or

14 (B) A scholarship or grant awarded by an institution of  
15 higher education in this state in whole or in part by state funds, including  
16 without limitation:

17 (i) Scholarships awarded on the basis of entrance  
18 exam scores or high school academic achievement;

19 (ii) Tuition waivers based on age, military service,  
20 occupation, or other factors;

21 (iii) Out-of-state tuition waivers for undergraduate  
22 students from contiguous states in close proximity to a college or  
23 university;

24 (iv) Scholarships for transfers from two-year  
25 institutions;

26 (v) Performance scholarships for band, musical  
27 performing groups, arts, theater, forensics, and similar activities that are  
28 not awarded on the basis of entrance exam scores or high school academic  
29 achievement; and

30 (vi) Any other publicly funded program under which  
31 students are not charged or are reimbursed by the institution of higher  
32 education for tuition, fees, books, or other costs of attendance;

33 ~~(24) “Successfully completed” means that a student completed a~~  
34 ~~course at an institution of higher education and received the equivalent of a~~  
35 ~~minimum letter grade of “D”;~~

36 ~~(25)~~(16)(A) “Superscore” means the final composite score that is

1 calculated according to a combination of the highest individual section  
2 scores across all of the ACT tests taken by an individual+.

3 (B)(i) The division shall promulgate rules in consultation  
4 with ACT, Inc. to determine the mechanism for calculating and disseminating  
5 an applicant’s superscore on the ACT.

6 (ii) However, a rule promulgated under subdivision  
7 (16)(B)(i) of this section shall not result in a negative amount of net  
8 revenue available; and

9 ~~(26)(A)~~(17)(A) “Supplant” means that the net proceeds from the  
10 state lottery are used in place of, not in addition to, state nonlottery  
11 educational resources provided for state-supported student financial  
12 assistance for a specified fiscal year.

13 (B) Supplanting does not occur if the General Assembly  
14 provided the state nonlottery educational resources as if the lotteries under  
15 the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery Act, § 23-115-101 et seq., do not exist; and

16 ~~(27)(A)~~(18)(A) “Traditional student” means a student who:

17 (i) Will enter postsecondary education as a full-  
18 time first-time freshman on or before the fall semester of the academic year  
19 that begins immediately following:

20 (a) The student’s graduation from high school;

21 or

22 (b) The last day of the school year:

23 (1) That would have been the student’s  
24 junior or senior year of high school; and

25 (2) In which the student completes the  
26 requirements for high school graduation and obtains a Certificate of General  
27 Educational Development instead of receiving a diploma; and

28 (ii) Remains continuously enrolled as a full-time  
29 student.

30 (B) “Traditional student” includes a student who otherwise  
31 meets this definition but delays entering postsecondary education under a  
32 scholarship hold approved by the division.

33 ~~(C) “Traditional student” does not include a current~~  
34 ~~achiever student.~~

36 6-85-205. Authority and duties of ~~the~~ Division of Higher Education.



1 (a) The Division of Higher Education shall develop and promulgate  
2 rules for the administration of the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship  
3 Program consistent with the purposes and requirements of this subchapter.

4 (b) The rules developed and promulgated by the Division of Higher  
5 Education under this section shall pertain to:

6 (1) Student eligibility criteria based on this subchapter;

7 (2) The method for selecting scholarship recipients and for  
8 determining continuing eligibility;

9 (3) The procedures for making payment to an approved institution  
10 of higher education where the recipient is enrolled; and

11 (4) Other administrative procedures that may be necessary for  
12 the implementation and operation of the program.

13 (c) The Division of Higher Education shall implement a complete  
14 financial aid management system that uses a single application form that may  
15 be accessed as a web-based application for all Arkansas state-supported  
16 student financial assistance administered by the Division of Higher  
17 Education, including:

18 (1) Scholarships awarded under this subchapter or other state  
19 law that are funded with net proceeds from the state lottery; and

20 (2) Scholarships, grants, or other financial assistance for  
21 higher education students funded with nonlottery state educational resources.

22 (d)(1) The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education and the  
23 Division of Higher Education ~~are directed to~~ shall develop appropriate  
24 informational materials on the ~~Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship~~  
25 ~~Program~~ program and ~~to~~ ensure distribution of the materials to Arkansas  
26 students in grade seven through grade twelve (7-12) each year as a part of  
27 the packet of materials on precollegiate preparation distributed by the  
28 Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board under § 6-61-217 and by the  
29 Division of Elementary and Secondary Education under the Higher Education  
30 Awareness Act of 1993, § 6-5-401 et seq.

31 (2) The distribution of informational materials under this  
32 section shall be accomplished through the collaboration of school counselors  
33 and other appropriate public school or Division of Higher Education  
34 personnel.

35 (3) The Division of Higher Education shall provide a copy of the  
36 informational materials developed under this section to the Legislative

1 Council for review.

2 (e) The Director of the Division of Higher Education shall review and  
3 evaluate the operation of the program with regard to eligibility criteria and  
4 size of the scholarship award to ensure that the program's operation meets  
5 the intent of this subchapter.

6 ~~(f) The Division of Higher Education may determine the necessary~~  
7 ~~procedures for the awarding of scholarships if the number of eligible~~  
8 ~~applicants exceeds the funds available based on the criteria under this~~  
9 ~~subchapter.~~

10 ~~(g)(1)(A)~~(f)(1)(A) By July 15 of each year, the ~~Director of the~~  
11 ~~Division of Higher Education~~ director shall provide a report to the  
12 Legislative Council on:

- 13 (i) The implementation of this subchapter;
- 14 (ii) The number of recipients that either:
  - 15 (a) Dropped out during the academic year; or
  - 16 (b) Lost the scholarship during the academic
- 17 year; and
- 18 (iii) Any additional information requested by the
- 19 Legislative Council.

20 (B) The Legislative Council shall include the information  
21 reported under this subsection in its annual report to the General Assembly  
22 under § 6-85-220.

23 (2) By August 1 of each year, the Division of Higher Education  
24 shall provide to the Legislative Council an unaudited financial report on the  
25 administration of the ~~Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program~~ program  
26 for the fiscal year just ended.

27  
28 6-85-206. Basic eligibility requirements.

29 The basic requirements for an applicant to be eligible for an award  
30 from the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program ~~—Part 2~~ are:

31 (1)(A) The applicant has been an Arkansas resident for at least  
32 the twelve (12) months immediately preceding the date the applicant will  
33 enroll in an approved institution of higher education.

34 (B) If the applicant is less than twenty-one (21) years of  
35 age, either the applicant or a parent or guardian of the applicant shall have  
36 maintained Arkansas residency for at least the twelve (12) months immediately

1 preceding the date the applicant will enroll in an approved institution of  
2 higher education.

3 (C)(i) To be considered an Arkansas resident, an applicant  
4 shall demonstrate residency by evidence deemed sufficient to the Division of  
5 Higher Education.

6 (ii) Evidence of residency may include without  
7 limitation information provided by the applicant on the Free Application for  
8 Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or a subsequent application required by the  
9 United States Department of Education for federal financial aid.

10 (D) During the twelve (12) months immediately preceding  
11 the date an applicant will enroll in an approved institution of higher  
12 education if the person for whom the twelve-month period is calculated under  
13 subdivision (1)(A) or subdivision (1)(B) of this section is deployed outside  
14 of Arkansas under military orders, the division shall calculate the twelve  
15 (12) months by:

16 (i) Excluding months of military deployment outside  
17 of Arkansas that are within the twelve (12) months immediately preceding the  
18 date the applicant will enroll in an approved institution of higher  
19 education; and

20 (ii) Including months the person maintained Arkansas  
21 residency immediately preceding the military deployment outside of Arkansas;

22 (2) The applicant is a citizen of the United States or is a  
23 lawful permanent resident;

24 (3)(A) The applicant is accepted for admission as a full-time  
25 student or part-time student at:

26 (i) An approved institution of higher education in a  
27 program of study that leads to or is creditable toward:

28 (a) A baccalaureate degree;

29 (b) An associate degree;

30 (c) A certificate from a qualified certificate  
31 program; or

32 (d) A graduate-level or professional degree;

33 or

34 (ii) An approved school of nursing in a program of  
35 study that leads to a nursing diploma under § 6-85-213.

36 (B) A full-time student shall enroll in at least twenty-

1 seven (27) semester hours the first academic year and thirty (30) semester  
 2 hours per academic year thereafter or the equivalent, as described in this  
 3 subchapter, or the equivalent as defined by the division.

4 (C) A part-time student shall complete at least six (6)  
 5 semester hours but less than the minimum number of semester hours for a full-  
 6 time student, as defined by the division;

7 (4) The applicant has not met the maximum continuing education  
 8 eligibility requirements under § 6-85-210;

9 (5) The applicant does not owe a refund on a federal or state  
 10 student financial aid grant for higher education;

11 (6) The applicant is not in default on a state or federal  
 12 student financial aid loan for higher education;

13 (7) The applicant has not borrowed, as determined by the  
 14 approved institution of higher education to be attended, in excess of the  
 15 annual loan limits of the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program in the  
 16 same academic year for which the student has applied for assistance under  
 17 this subchapter;

18 (8) The applicant is not incarcerated at the time of the  
 19 application for or during the time the applicant receives a scholarship under  
 20 this subchapter;

21 (9) The applicant has complied with United States Selective  
 22 Service System requirements for registration;

23 (10) The applicant has completed and submitted to the United  
 24 States Department of Education a Free Application for Federal Student Aid  
 25 (FAFSA) or a subsequent application required by the United States Department  
 26 of Education for federal financial aid; and

27 (11) The applicant certifies that he or she is drug-free and  
 28 pledges in writing on the application form to refrain from the use or abuse  
 29 of illegal substances in order to become eligible and maintain eligibility  
 30 for ~~this program~~ the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program.

31  
 32 6-85-207. Additional eligibility requirements for traditional  
 33 students.

34 In addition to the basic eligibility requirements of § 6-85-206, an  
 35 applicant is eligible as a traditional student if the applicant:

36 (1)~~(A)~~ Graduated from an Arkansas public high school and has a

1 minimum superscore of nineteen (19) on the ACT or the equivalent score on an  
2 ACT equivalent.

3 ~~(B) The Division of Higher Education shall promulgate~~  
4 ~~rules in consultation with ACT, Inc. to determine the mechanism for~~  
5 ~~calculating and disseminating an applicant's superscore on the ACT;~~

6 (2) Has a disability identified under the Individuals with  
7 Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. § 1400 et seq., as it existed on July  
8 1, 2009, and graduated from an Arkansas public high school, and either:

9 (A) Had a minimum composite score of nineteen (19) on the  
10 ACT or the equivalent score on an ACT equivalent; or

11 (B) Scored proficient or higher on all state-mandated end-  
12 of-course assessments, including without limitation end-of-course assessments  
13 on:

- 14 (i) Algebra I;
- 15 (ii) Geometry;
- 16 (iii) Biology; and
- 17 (iv) Literacy;

18 (3) Achieved a minimum superscore of nineteen (19) on the ACT or  
19 the equivalent score on an ACT equivalent and:

20 (A) Graduated from a private high school, an out-of-state  
21 high school, or a home school high school; or

22 (B) In the year in which the student would have been a  
23 junior or senior in high school, completed the requirements for high school  
24 graduation and obtained a high school equivalency diploma approved by the  
25 Adult Education Section instead of receiving a diploma; or

26 (4) Meets the following criteria:

27 (A) Was enrolled at an institution of higher education in  
28 the immediately preceding academic year as a full-time, first-time freshman;

29 (B) Did not receive a scholarship under this subchapter as  
30 a full-time, first-time freshman;

31 (C) Successfully completed with the equivalent of a  
32 minimum letter grade of "D" at least twenty-seven (27) semester hours of  
33 courses as a full-time, first-time freshman; and

34 (D) Achieved a postsecondary grade point average of at  
35 least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale as a full-time, first-time freshman.

1           6-85-208. Additional eligibility requirements for a nontraditional  
2 student.

3           An applicant is eligible as a nontraditional student if, in addition to  
4 the basic eligibility requirements of § 6-85-206, the applicant meets one (1)  
5 of the following requirements:

6                   (1) If the applicant has not been enrolled in an approved  
7 institution of higher education, has either:

8                           (A) Graduated from an Arkansas public high school and  
9 achieved a 2.5 high school grade point average; or

10                           (B)~~(i)~~ Graduated from an Arkansas public high school, a

29 (c)(1) The Director of the Division of Higher Education shall certify  
 30 to the office the amount of net proceeds from the state lottery needed to  
 31 fund the scholarships awarded to recipients under ~~§ 6-85-201 et seq., the~~  
 32 following scholarship programs for each semester of an academic year based on  
 33 the contents of the Lottery Scholarship Trust Account at the end of the  
 34 immediately preceding fiscal year:

15 (b) Distribution of scholarships with  
 16 remaining available funds on a pro rata basis under subdivision  
 17 (c)(2)(D)(ii)(a) of this section shall ensure the equal distribution of  
 18 scholarships to student scholarship recipients enrolled in two-year  
 19 institutions of higher education and four-year institutions of higher  
 20 education.

21 (3) By August 1 of each year, the director shall provide to the  
 22 Secretary of the Department of Finance and Administration and to the  
 23 Legislative Council for the academic year just ended an accounting of all

22 SECTION 8. TEMPORARY LANGUAGE. DO NOT CODIFY.

23 (a) The contents of the Lottery Scholarship Trust Account as  
24 established under § 23-115-801 at the end of the 2021 fiscal year shall be  
25 used to fund scholarships awarded to recipients of only the following  
26 scholarships for the 2021-2022 academic year:

33 (b)(1) Thereafter, funds that accrue in the Lottery Scholarship Trust  
34 Account as established under § 23-115-801 shall be used to fund recipients of  
35 the following scholarships:

36 (A) Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program, § 6-

1 85-201 et seq.;

2 (B) Arkansas Workforce Challenge Scholarship Program, § 6-

3 85-301 et seq.;

4 (C) Arkansas Concurrent Challenge Scholarship Program, §

5 6-85-401 et seq.; and

6 (D) Any other scholarship funded with net proceeds from  
7 the state lottery.

8 (2) Scholarships funded with net proceeds from the state lottery  
9 deposited into the Lottery Scholarship Trust Account established under § 23-  
10 115-801 shall be funded based on the total amount of net proceeds from the  
11 state lottery in the Lottery Scholarship Trust Account at the end of the  
12 immediately preceding fiscal year.

14 SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE. Section 6 of this act is effective on and  
15 after July 1, 2021.

16  
17 SECTION 10. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the  
18 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that it is imperative to ensure  
19 existing scholarships can be funded with current available funds; that it is  
20 necessary to determine whether enacting a new scholarship is fiscally  
21 prudent; and that this act is immediately necessary in order to review each  
22 bill that creates or amends a lottery-funded scholarship in light of existing  
23 scholarships and available funds to ensure financial solvency of the lottery.  
24 Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately  
25 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall  
26 become effective on:

27 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

28 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,  
29 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the  
30 bill; or

31 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is  
32 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
