1 lottery; 2 (2) The net proceeds from the state lottery, in addition to 3 existing nonlottery state educational resources for scholarships and grants, 4 will: 5 (A) Encourage associate degree, certificate of proficiency 6 program, and technical certificate program recipients and university juniors 7 to complete a baccalaureate degree; 8 (B) Provide opportunities for students more than one (1) 9 year out of high school to enter or reenter higher education; 10 (C) Provide an improved system of communication to 11 students and parents about opportunities for higher education scholarships 12 and grants in Arkansas; and (D) Provide an evaluation and analysis of all state 13 14 funding for scholarships and grants and how the funding advances the state's 15 goals for higher education; and 16 (3) Changes to the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship 17 Program — Part 2 may be necessary from time to time to ensure the solvency of 18 the program by spreading the program liabilities over a period of time while 19 ensuring that there are scholarship dollars available for students who 20 successfully complete their courses. 21 22 6-85-202. Creation. 23 The Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program - Part 2 is hereby 24 created and established. 25 26 6-85-203. Applicability. 27 (a) This subchapter is applicable to students who apply for a scholarship under the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program - Part 28 2 for the academic year 2010-2011 and each academic year thereafter. 29 (b) Except to the extent of an award amount under § 6-85-107(b)(2), a 30 recipient of a scholarship under the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship 31 32 Program - Part 1, § 6-85-101 et seq., is not eligible for an additional scholarship under this subchapter. 33 34 (e) Recipients of Arkansas Governor's Distinguished Scholarships are 35 prohibited from receiving Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarships under this

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subchapter.

3	As used in this subchapter:
4	(1) "ACT" means the ACT Assessment administered by ACT, Inc.;
5	(2) "ACT equivalent" means the SAT, COMPASS, Accuplacer

8	higher education to assess a person's college readiness;

25	(D) Is approved by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing;

27	participate in the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program; and
28	(F) Is not a two-year or four-year college or university;
29	(5) "Arkansas resident" means a natural person who provides
30	evidence deemed sufficient by the division that:

funding available for state-supported scholarships and grants for students

6-85-205. Authority and duties of the Division of Higher Education.

- 1 The Division of Higher Education shall develop and promulgate 2 rules for the administration of the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program consistent with the purposes and requirements of this subchapter. 3
 - The rules developed and promulgated by the Division of Higher Education under this section shall pertain to:
 - (1) Student eligibility criteria based on this subchapter;
- 7 (2) The method for selecting scholarship recipients and for 8 determining continuing eligibility;
- 9 The procedures for making payment to an approved institution (3) 10 of higher education where the recipient is enrolled; and
- 11 (4) Other administrative procedures that may be necessary for 12 the implementation and operation of the program.
- 13 (c) The Division of Higher Education shall implement a complete 14 financial aid management system that uses a single application form that may 15 be accessed as a web-based application for all Arkansas state-supported 16 student financial assistance administered by the Division of Higher 17 Education, including:
- 18 (1) Scholarships awarded under this subchapter or other state 19 law that are funded with net proceeds from the state lottery; and
 - Scholarships, grants, or other financial assistance for higher education students funded with nonlottery state educational resources.
- 22 The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education and the 23 Division of Higher Education are directed to shall develop appropriate 24 informational materials on the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship 25 Program program and to ensure distribution of the materials to Arkansas 26 students in grade seven through grade twelve (7-12) each year as a part of 27 the packet of materials on precollegiate preparation distributed by the 28 Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board under § 6-61-217 and by the 29 Division of Elementary and Secondary Education under the Higher Education
- Awareness Act of 1993, § 6-5-401 et seq. 31 (2) The distribution of informational materials under this 32 section shall be accomplished through the collaboration of school counselors 33 and other appropriate public school or Division of Higher Education

- 2 (e) The Director of the Division of Higher Education shall review and 3 evaluate the operation of the program with regard to eligibility criteria and 4 size of the scholarship award to ensure that the program's operation meets 5 the intent of this subchapter.
 - (f) The Division of Higher Education may determine the necessary procedures for the awarding of scholarships if the number of eligible applicants exceeds the funds available based on the criteria under this subchapter.
- 10 (g)(1)(A)(f)(1)(A) By July 15 of each year, the Director of the
 11 Division of Higher Education director shall provide a report to the
 12 Legislative Council on:
- 13 (i) The implementation of this subchapter;
- 14 (ii) The number of recipients that either:

- 16 (b) Lost the scholarship during the academic

30	amount deposited into the Scholarship Shortfall Reserve Trust Account and
31	loans made to the Division of Higher Education for the Arkansas Academic
32	Challenge Scholarship Program - Part 2, are amended to read as follows:
33	(b)(1) An amount equal to four percent (4%) of the total amount of net
34	proceeds disbursed during the preceding fiscal year in the form of
35	scholarships and grants for higher education shall be deposited from lottery
36	proceeds each year until the amount in the account equals twenty million

- 1 dollars (\$20,000,000).
- 2 (2)(A) Thereafter, only the amount necessary to maintain the
- 3 account in an amount equal to twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000) shall be
- 4 deposited into the account after the repayment of any loan made from the
- 5 Executive Discretionary Division Section 3(d) of the General Improvement
- 6 Distribution Act of 2015, identical Acts 2015, Nos. 1146 and 1147, before
- 7 June 30, 2016, to the Division of Higher Education for the Arkansas Academic
- 8 Challenge Scholarship Program Part 2 has been satisfied.
- 9 (B) A loan made from the Executive Discretionary Division
- 10 Section 3(d) of the General Improvement Distribution Act of 2015, identical
- 11 Acts 2015, Nos. 1146 and 1147, to the division for the Arkansas Academic
- 12 Challenge Scholarship Program Part 2 shall not exceed one million five
- 13 hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000).
- 14 (3) Any amount in the account exceeding twenty million dollars
- 15 (\$20,000,000) shall be considered net proceeds and shall be deposited
- 16 annually into one (1) or more trust accounts at one (1) or more financial
- 17 institutions by July 1 of each year.
- 18 (c)(1)(A) Except as provided in subdivision (c)(2) of this section, if
- 19 net proceeds in any year are not sufficient to meet the amount allocated for
- 20 higher education scholarships under the Arkansas Academic Challenge
- 21 <u>Scholarship Program, § 6-85-201 et seq.</u>, the account may be drawn upon to
- 22 meet the deficiency according to the procedural requirements established
- 23 under subdivision (c)(3)(B) of this section.
- 24 (B) In the event that the funding available in the account
- 25 <u>is not sufficient to meet the remaining amount allocated for scholarships</u>
- 26 <u>funded with net proceeds from the state lottery, up to the first twenty</u>
- 27 million dollars (\$20,000,000) of funds allocated in the Higher Education
- 28 Grants Fund Account may be drawn upon to meet the deficiency.
- 29 (2) The Except as provided in subdivision (c)(3)(B) of this
- 30 <u>section</u>, the account shall not be drawn upon to fund Arkansas Workforce
- 31 Challenge Scholarships under the Arkansas Workforce Challenge Scholarship
- 32 Program, § 6-85-301 et seq., or Arkansas Concurrent Challenge Scholarships
- 33 under the Arkansas Concurrent Challenge Scholarship Program, § 6-85-401 et
- 34 seq, or any other scholarship funded with net proceeds from the state
- 35 <u>lottery</u>.
- 36 (3)(A) Determining the maximum amount of loans from the account

- 1 to the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program, § 6-85-201 et seq.,
- 2 the Arkansas Workforce Challenge Scholarship Program, § 6-85-301 et seq., or
- 3 the Arkansas Concurrent Challenge Scholarship Program, § 6-85-401 et seq., is
- 4 the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by the
- 5 General Assembly's delineating such funding allocations for the various
- 6 scholarship programs, with the approval of the Administrative Rules
- 7 Subcommittee of the Legislative Council and through oversight as required by
- 8 law by the Lottery Oversight Subcommittee of the Legislative Council.
- 9 Further, the General Assembly determines that the division may operate more
- 10 efficiently with some flexibility, therefore it is both necessary and
- 11 appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior
- 12 approval of the Legislative Council or the Joint Budget Committee as provided

- (B) If the division determines it is necessary to borrow

- 19 review and approval from the Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly
- 20 <u>is in session</u>, the Joint Budget Committee.

- 22 SECTION 8. TEMPORARY LANGUAGE. DO NOT CODIFY.
- 23 (a) The contents of the Lottery Scholarship Trust Account as
- 24 established under § 23-115-801 at the end of the 2021 fiscal year shall be
- 25 <u>used to fund scholarships awarded to recipients of only the following</u>
- 26 <u>scholarships for the 2021-2022 academic year:</u>
- 27 (1) Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program, § 6-85-201
- 28 et seq.;
- 29 (2) Arkansas Workforce Challenge Scholarship Program, § 6-85-301
- 30 et seq; and
- 31 (3) Arkansas Concurrent Challenge Scholarship Program, § 6-85-
- 32 401 et seq.
- 33 (b)(1) Thereafter, funds that accrue in the Lottery Scholarship Trust
- 34 Account as established under § 23-115-801 shall be used to fund recipients of
- 35 <u>the following scholarships:</u>
- 36 (A) Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program, § 6-

1	85-201 et seq.;
2	(B) Arkansas Workforce Challenge Scholarship Program, § 6-
3	85-301 et seq.;
4	(C) Arkansas Concurrent Challenge Scholarship Program, §
5	6-85-401 et seq.; and
6	(D) Any other scholarship funded with net proceeds from
7	the state lottery.
8	(2) Scholarships funded with net proceeds from the state lottery
9	deposited into the Lottery Scholarship Trust Account established under § 23-
10	115-801 shall be funded based on the total amount of net proceeds from the
11	state lottery in the Lottery Scholarship Trust Account at the end of the
12	immediately preceding fiscal year.
13	
14	SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE. Section 6 of this act is effective on and
15	after July 1, 2021.
16	
17	SECTION 10. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
18	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that it is imperative to ensure
19	existing scholarships can be funded with current available funds; that it is
20	necessary to determine whether enacting a new scholarship is fiscally
21	prudent; and that this act is immediately necessary in order to review each
22	bill that creates or amends a lottery-funded scholarship in light of existing
23	scholarships and available funds to ensure financial solvency of the lottery.
24	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately
25	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
26	become effective on:
27	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
28	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
29	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
30	bill; or
31	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
32	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
