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1 development schedule under § 6-17-709. 2 (2) The professional development under this section may be 3 accomplished through self-review of suitable suicide prevention materials 4 approved by the division shall include components approved by the division 5 that provide training for public school counselors, teachers, nurses, 6 administrators, school resource officers, social workers, and other public 7 school employees, as applicable, to: 8 (A) Recognize public school students who are at risk of 9 attempting suicide, including without limitation public school students who 10 are or may be the victims of or who engage in bullying; 11 (B) Recognize public school students who display early 12 warning signs of substance abuse and a possible need for early mental health 13 intervention or substance abuse intervention as described under § 6-18-113; 14 (C) Effectively intervene with public school students 15 described under subdivisions (a)(2)(A) and (a)(2)(B) of this section by providing notice to the parent, legal guardian, or person standing in loco 16 17 parentis of the public school student so that appropriate action, including 18 without limitation seeking mental health services or substance abuse 19 services, may be taken by the parent, legal guardian, or person standing in 20 loco parentis of the public school student; and (D) Assist public school students in returning to public 21 22 school following treatment of a mental health concern or a suicide attempt. 23 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 18, Subchapter 1, is amended 24 25 to add an additional section to read as follows: 26 6-18-113. Mental health promotion and intervention - Substance abuse 27 prevention and intervention - Suicide prevention - Development of practices 28 and procedures. 29 (a) Each public school district and open-enrollment public charter 30 school shall develop practices and procedures concerning: 31 (1) Mental health promotion and intervention; 32 (2) Substance abuse prevention and intervention; and (3) Suicide prevention and intervention. 33 34 (b) The practices and procedures required under subsection (a) of this 35 section shall:

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(1) Include a procedure for providing notice of a recommendation

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1	for early mental health intervention or substance abuse intervention for a
2	public school student to the public school student's parent, legal guardian,
3	or person standing in loco parentis within a reasonable amount of time after
4	the identification of early warning signs, which may include without
5	limitation:
6	(A) Declining academic performance;
7	(B) Depression;
8	(C) Anxiety;
9	(D) Isolation;
10	(E) Unexplained changes in sleeping or eating habits; and
11	(F) The public school student exhibiting destructive
12	behavior towards himself or herself or towards others;
13	(2) Include a procedure for providing notice of a public school
14	student identified as at risk of attempting suicide to the parent, legal
15	guardian, or person standing in loco parentis of the public school student
16	within a reasonable amount of time after the identification of early warning
17	signs described under subdivision (b)(1) of this section;
18	(3) Establish available counseling alternatives for a public
19	school student's parent, legal guardian, or person standing in loco parentis
20	to consider when their child is identified as possibly being in need of early
21	mental health intervention, substance abuse intervention, or suicide
22	prevention; and
23	(4) Include procedures to support the return of a public school
24	student following his or her hospitalization or residential treatment for a
25	mental health condition, substance abuse, or suicide attempt.
26	(c) The practices and procedures required under subsection (b) of this
27	section:
28	(1) May address multiple areas described under subsection (a) of
29	this section together;
30	(2) Shall prohibit the use without the prior consent of a public
31	school student's parent, legal guardian, or person standing in loco parentis
32	of a medical screening of a public school student as part of the process of
33	identifying whether the public school student is possibly in need of early
34	mental health intervention, substance abuse intervention, or suicide
35	prevention; and
36	(3) Shall be included in the student handbook.

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1	(d) A public school district or open-enrollment public charter school
2	may develop a reporting mechanism and designate at least one (1) public
3	school employee to serve as a liaison officer for the purposes of identifying
4	public school students in need of early mental health intervention, substance
5	abuse intervention, or suicide prevention.
6	(e) The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education may promulgate
7	rules to implement this section.
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
