1 (4) A driver's license or An identification card that is valid 2 for a period that exceeds the time prescribed by the United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement, an agency of the Department of Homeland 3 4 Security, can be used to circumvent federal law and cause confusion on the 5 status of the individual to whom it is issued. 6 The purpose of \S 27-16-1111 and \S 27-16-1112 is to ensure that 7 driver's licenses and identification cards issued by the state are not used 8 to circumvent federal immigration laws or federal authority on immigration 9 matters by preventing an applicant for the issuance or renewal of a driver's 10 license or an identification card from obtaining an identity document issued 11 by the state that is valid for a period that exceeds the applicant's 12 authorization to be lawfully present in the United States. 13 14 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 27-16-1111, is amended to read as follows: 15 27-16-1111. 15	(d) This section does not authorize the issuance of a commercial		
16	driver's license or commercial driver's learner's permit to a person who is		
17	not lawfully present in the United States.
