Forces become integrated under a 1948 executive order by President Harry S.
Truman; and

8 WHEREAS, Black History Month distinguishes more commonly celebrated 9 individuals such as Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., George Washington Carver, 10 Thurgood Marshall, Rosa Parks, Jackie Robinson, the Little Rock Nine, and 11 Maya Angelou, to name just a few, but there are less well-known yet equally 12 impactful individuals whom we should all educate ourselves on such as Crispus 13 Attucks, William Harvey Carney, the Greensboro Four, Constance Baker Motley, 14 and a plethora of other historical African-American giants,
