8	SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
9	TO ENCOURAGE THE GOVERNOR TO SUBMIT A STATE PLAN
10	AMENDMENT TO THE CENTERS FOR MEDICARE AND MEDICAID
11	SERVICES TO PROVIDE ACCESS TO COVERAGE FOR MIGRANT
12	MEN, WOMEN, AND CHILDREN FROM THE COMPACT OF FREE
13	ASSOCIATION ISLANDS.

16	Subtitle
17	TO ENCOURAGE THE GOVERNOR TO SUBMIT A
18	STATE PLAN AMENDMENT TO THE CENTERS FOR
19	MEDICARE AND MEDICAID SERVICES TO PROVIDE
20	ACCESS TO COVERAGE FOR MIGRANT MEN,
21	WOMEN, AND CHILDREN FROM THE COMPACT OF
22	FREE ASSOCIATION ISLANDS.

25	WHEREAS, shortly after World War II, the United States of America
26	assumed administration of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands under a
27	United Nations strategic trusteeship that provided for control over
28	development of the economies and international relations of the islands; and
29	
30	WHEREAS, the areas of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands
31	includes three (3) groups of islands that have become the sovereign nations
32	of the Republic of Palau, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the
33	Federated States of Micronesia; and
34	
35	WHEREAS, these three (3) nations are also known as the "Compact of Free
36	Association islands"; and

2	WHEREAS, the United States Atomic Energy Commission established the
3	Pacific Proving Grounds in what is now the Republic of the Marshall Islands,
4	one (1) of the three (3) Pacific island groups formerly under the
5	trusteeship; and
6	
7	WHEREAS, sixty-seven (67) atmospheric nuclear weapons were tested in
8	the Marshall Islands between the years of 1946 and 1958 on a number of
9	islands that were inhabited and on some islands that had not been evacuated;
10	and
11	
12	WHEREAS, many residents that were in the vicinity of the nuclear
13	weapons test proving grounds and their descendants continue to exhibit
14	medical conditions that may have resulted from exposure to the nuclear
15	fallout that occurred and is still measurable on some islands; and
16	
17	WHEREAS, under the Compact of Free Association treaty between the
18	United States and the three (3) island nations of the Republic of Palau, the
19	Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the Federated States of Micronesia,
20	citizens of the Compact of Free Association islands may freely enter the
21	United States without visas to study, lawfully reside, and work; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, many citizens of the Compact of Free Association islands have
24	served honorable in the United States Armed Services, serving in times of
25	peace and conflict, and have shed blood in the defense of our nation; and
26	
27	WHEREAS, Arkansas' relationship with the citizens of the Compact of
28	Association islands has benefitted all the people of Arkansas through their
29	economic impact of approximately one hundred twenty-three million dollars
30	(\$123,000,000); and
31	
32	WHEREAS, prior to the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity
33	Reconciliation Act of 1996, Pub. L. 104-193, migrants from the Compact of
34	Free Association islands were eligible for the traditional Arkansas Medicaid
35	Program and other federally funded programs; and

1	WHEREAS, while eligibility for federally funded programs has been
2	incrementally restored for other legal immigrants to be considered qualified
3	immigrants, migrants from the Compact of Free Association islands have
4	continued to be excluded; and
5	
6	WHEREAS, under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental
7	Appropriations Act of 2021, United States Congress has restored Medicaid
8	eligibility for migrants from the Compact of Free Association islands; and
9	
10	WHEREAS, it is necessary to amend Arkansas's Medicaid state plan to
11	formally allow migrants from the Compact of Free Association islands to
12	participate in the Arkansas Medicaid Program; and
13	
14	WHEREAS, currently, the vast majority of Marshallese migrants reside in
15	Hawaii and Arkansas; and
16	
17	WHEREAS, migrants from the Compact of Free Association islands continue
18	to suffer from the effects of nuclear contamination and have high rates of
19	cancer as well as chronic conditions, including without limitation obesity,
20	diabetes, and cardiovascular disease; and
21	
22	WHEREAS, the State of Arkansas incurs additional and significant
23	uncompensated care costs for healthcare services provided to migrants from
24	the Compact of Free Association islands,
25	
26	NOW THEREFORE,
27	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
28	STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:
29	
30	THAT the Senate of the Ninety-Third General Assembly, the House of
31	Representatives concurring, encourage the Governor to submit a state plan
32	amendment to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to provide access
33	to coverage for migrant men, women, and children from the Compact of Free
34	Association islands.
