17 TO EXTEND THE FIRST EXTRAORDINARY SESSION
18 OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO
19 CONSIDER A BILL BY SENATOR GARNER TO
20 PROHIBIT THE PROPAGATION OF DIVISIVE
21 CONCEPTS IN CERTAIN PUBLIC ENTITIES.

26 WHEREAS, Arkansas Constitution, Article 6, § 19, provides that, after
27 the General Assembly has disposed of the business set forth in the Governor's
28 proclamation to convene an extraordinary session, the General Assembly may,
29 by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all the members elected to both houses,
30 remain in session for a period not to exceed fifteen (15) days for the
31 purpose of transacting other legislative business; and

33 WHEREAS, the General Assembly has disposed of the matters set forth in
34 the Governor's proclamation calling the First Extraordinary Session of the
35 Ninety-Third General Assembly,



1 NOW THEREFORE,
2 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL
3 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

5 THAT the First Extraordinary Session of the Ninety-Third General
6 Assembly has completed action deemed to be necessary with respect to the
7 business set forth in the Governor's proclamation to convene the
8 extraordinary session.

9
10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the First Extraordinary Session of the
11 Ninety-Third General Assembly is extended in accordance with Arkansas
12 Constitution, Article 6, § 19, and shall remain in session for a period not
13 to exceed fifteen (15) days for the purpose of considering a bill by Senator
14 Garner to prohibit the propagation of divisive concepts in certain public
15 entities, including public schools and education service cooperatives.
