If there is not sufficient 12 appropriation, from funds deposited in the State Treasury or Cash Accounts of 13 an agency, for personal services, or personal services matching for any state 14 agency for the period ending June 30, 2022 2023, for State agencies that 15 process payroll through the Arkansas Administrative Statewide Information 16 System for federal and state tax reporting as necessary to comply with the 17 payment of stipends under United States Internal Revenue Code (IRC), 2001-18 Code-Vol, Sec 3401 and Treasury Regulations §31.3401(c)-1(a) and §1.1402(c)-19 2(b), and others which govern the reporting of income and payment of 20 withholding and matching taxes for personal services, the agency shall 21 request a transfer from appropriation provided for Personal Services and 22 Personal Services Matching in the appropriation for Various State Agencies -23 U.S. IRC and Treasury Regulations herein, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of 24 the State, stating clearly the amounts required for each item. Upon approval 25 of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the State Auditor shall be notified 26 as to the amount and the purposes for which the appropriation is to be made 27 and such appropriation as needed shall be established upon the books of the 28 Department of Finance and Administration and the State Auditor. Provided, 29 however, that in the event the total amount of transfer requested in any 30 fiscal year exceeds Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000), the Chief Fiscal Officer 31 of the State shall seek prior review by the Arkansas Legislative Council or 32 Joint Budget Committee before the transfer shall be made. 33 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2021

34 <u>2022</u> through June 30, 2022 <u>2023</u>.

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SECTION 70. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

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1 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. POSITION 2 ESTABLISHMENT. The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall have the authority 3 to establish such positions as necessary for State agencies to process 4 payroll through the Arkansas Administrative Statewide Information System for 5 federal and state tax reporting purposes as necessary to comply with the 6 United States Internal Revenue Code (IRC), 2001-Code-Vol, Sec 3401 and 7 Treasury Regulations §31.3401(c)-1(a) and §1.1402(c)-2(b), and others which 8 govern the reporting of income and payment of withholding and matching taxes 9 for personal services. The positions established shall not be considered as 10 part of the total number of authorized positions for an agency and shall only 11 be considered as placeholders for payments to individuals who are board or 12 commission members or elected officials of the State that do not otherwise 13 receive salaries or wages as defined in Arkansas Code § 19-4-521 for their 14 personal services. Further, none of the positions established under this 15 section shall imply eligibility for state retirement or state health 16 insurance benefits. The establishment of such positions shall not exceed 250 17 positions in any fiscal year.

18 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2021}{2022}$ through June 30, $\frac{2022}{2023}$.

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21 SECTION 71. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 22 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 23 AUTHORIZED - ARKANSAS CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL. The Arkansas Children's Hospital may request the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State to transfer funds made 24 25 available for the following by this Act sums not to exceed \$1,000,000 for the 26 Arkansas Children's Hospital Burn Center, \$700,000 for the Children's 27 Hospital Payments, \$600,000 for the Reproductive Health Monitoring, and 28 \$233,600 for the Intensive Care Nursery each fiscal year from the 29 Miscellaneous Agencies Fund Account to the Department of Human Services Grants Fund Account. The transferred funds shall be used to match federal 30 31 funds used for supplemental Medicaid payments to Arkansas Children's 32 Hospital.

33 The Arkansas Children's Hospital may also request the Chief Fiscal Officer 34 of the State to transfer the sum not to exceed \$1,000,000 each fiscal year 35 from the Miscellaneous Agencies Fund Account from funds made available by 36 this Act for the Intensive Care Nursery to the Department of Human Services

Grants Fund Account. The transferred funds shall be used to match federal
 Medicaid funds for cost-based reimbursement for helicopter patient transport.
 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2021
 2022 through June 30, 2022 2023.

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6 SECTION 72. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 8 INNOVATION AND PROJECT DEVELOPMENT FUND TRANSFERS. The Department of 9 Transformation & Shared Services - Division of Information Systems is a cost 10 recovery agency subject to the requirements of the United States Office of 11 Management and Budget Circular A-87 Cost Principles for State, Local and 12 Indian Tribal Government (A-87) and Cost Principles for Developing Cost Allocation Plans and Indirect Cost Rates for Agreements with the Federal 13 14 Government Implementation Guide for the Office of Management and Budget 15 Circular A-87 (ASMBC-10). To comply with these federal rules, it is necessary 16 to establish an Innovation and Project Development appropriation and general 17 revenue fund account within the Department of Finance and Administration -Disbursing Officer for the Department of Transformation & Shared Services -18 19 Division of Information Systems. This fund shall be used for state enterprise 20 innovation projects that would enhance the technology operations of the State 21 that cannot be cost allocated to federal programs. The Department of 22 Transformation & Shared Services - Division of Information Systems will 23 maintain documentation for projects billed for these purposes. Fund transfers 24 may be made from the General Revenue Fund Account, upon the approval of the 25 Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and prior review of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, to reimburse the Department of 26 27 Transformation & Shared Services - Division of Information Systems for the 28 amounts billed.

29 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2021}{30}$ 30 $\frac{2022}{2023}$ through June 30, $\frac{2022}{2023}$.

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32 SECTION 73. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 33 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. WORK 34 FORCE 2000 DISTRIBUTION. After the amounts to be made available to the 35 various technical institutes or comprehensive lifelong learning centers have 36 been determined as set out in Arkansas Code §§ 26-51-205(d)(2)(A) and 26-51-

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1 205(d)(2)(B), such documents as may be necessary shall be processed so that 2 funds may be transferred from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund to the State Treasury fund or fund account from which the technical institute or 3 4 comprehensive lifelong learning center draws its general revenue support. 5 Such funds as may be transferred shall not exceed 6.309% of the total funds 6 available from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund during each fiscal year. 7 In the event that a technical college, community college or educational 8 institution which receives support from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund 9 as determined by law transfers from the Arkansas Technical College and 10 Community College System for which Work Force 2000 Development Fund monies 11 are determined by law, then the actual amount of support from the Work Force 12 2000 Development Fund in the preceding fiscal year for such educational institution shall be made available irrespective of any other provision of 13 14 law which sets out maximum levels of support from such fund.

15 The funds distributed under Arkansas Code § 26-51-205(d)(2)(C) in excess 16 of those amounts collected and distributed prior to June 30, 2014 shall be 17 deposited into the Skills Development Fund to be used only for personal 18 services, grants, operation, support, and improvement of occupational, 19 vocational, technical, and workforce development programs by the Department 20 of Commerce - Office of Skills Development. The distributions of funds under 21 Arkansas Code § 26-51-205(d)(2)(C) in excess of those amounts collected and 22 distributed prior to June 30, 2014 shall not apply to proceeds allocated to 23 schools, colleges and educational institutions under Arkansas Code §§ 26-51-24 205(d)(2)(A) and 26-51-205(d)(2)(B).

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SECTION 74. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 28 29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 30 PROCEDURES - PERSONAL SERVICES EXTRA HELP. In the event that there is not 31 sufficient appropriation provided for by the General Assembly for payment of 32 personal services related to Extra Help for any state agency for the period 33 ending June 30, 2022 2023, said agency may request a transfer from 34 appropriations provided for Personal Services Extra Help in the Miscellaneous 35 Transfers Section herein, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, stating 36 clearly the amount required. Upon approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of

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1 the State, and after seeking prior review by the Arkansas Legislative Council 2 or Joint Budget Committee, the State Auditor shall be notified as to the amount and the purposes for which said appropriation is to be made. The 3 4 appropriation shall then be established upon the books of the Department of 5 Finance and Administration and the State Auditor. Provided further, that if 6 desired, said appropriation shall be supplemental to those regularly 7 appropriated for such purposes by the General Assembly for the agency. 8 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2021 9 2022 through June 30, 2022 2023.

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11 SECTION 75. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 13 INTRASTATE METRO PLANNING GRANTS. As referenced in Section 9 of Act 637 of 14 1995, the authorized funding for Intrastate Metro Planning Grants that are 15 evenly distributed among planning and development districts under the 16 Miscellaneous Grants and Expenses Section of this Act shall include the West 17 Central Arkansas Economic Development District.

18 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2021}{2022}$ through June 30, $\frac{2022}{2023}$.

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21 SECTION 76. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 22 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND 23 USAGE AUTHORIZED. The Arkansas Children's Hospital President and C.E.O. may 24 request the Department of Human Services-Division of Medical Services to 25 retain in the Department of Human Services Grant Fund account an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000 for funds made available by the act to be used to match 26 27 federal funds used for supplemental Medicaid payments to Arkansas Children's 28 Hospital.

29 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2021}{30}$ 30 $\frac{2022}{2023}$ through June 30, $\frac{2022}{2023}$.

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32 SECTION 77. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 33 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 34 PROCEDURES - MEDICAL MARIJUANA IMPLEMENTATION AND REGULATION. In the event 35 that sufficient appropriation is not provided by the General Assembly for 36 expenditures resulting from the implementation and regulation of the Arkansas

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1 Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016 for any state agency, pursuant to 2 Arkansas Code § 19-4-701 et seq., said agency shall request a transfer of 3 appropriation from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, stating clearly the 4 amount required. Upon approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State said 5 appropriations shall be established upon the books of the Department of 6 Finance and Administration in compliance with the applicable classifications 7 of appropriations as enumerated in Arkansas Code §§ 19-4-521 through 19-4-8 527.

9 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2021
10 2022 through June 30, 2022 2023.

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12 SECTION 78. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND 13 14 TRANSFER AUTHORITY. From time to time, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State 15 may transfer from his or her books and those of the Treasurer of State and 16 the Auditor of State from the Medical Marijuana Implementation and Operations 17 Fund to various state agencies' funds the amounts necessary to fund the 18 expenses for the implementation, administration, and/or enforcement of the 19 Arkansas Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016.

20 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2021 21 <u>2022</u> through June 30, 2022 <u>2023</u>.

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23 SECTION 79. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BLANKET 25 BOND PROGRAM. The Secretary of the Department of Finance and Administration 26 is authorized to transfer Appropriation between the Blanket Surety Bond 27 Program appropriations authorized for State Employees (Appropriation 2DM), 28 County Employees (Appropriation 2DN), Municipal Employees (Appropriation 2DP) 29 and Public School Employees (Appropriation 2DQ).

30 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2021
31 2022 through June 30, 2022 2023.

SECTION 80. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
 PROCEDURES - VARIOUS TEMPORARY APPROPRIATION FOR STATE AGENCIES AND
 INSTITUTIONS. (i) In the event that sufficient appropriation is not provided

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1 by the General Assembly for any state agency or institution, an agency or 2 institution may request a transfer of appropriation, as provided in the 3 Various Temporary Appropriation for State Agencies and Institutions 4 Appropriation Section of this Act, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the 5 State, stating clearly the amount requested, purpose and any additional 6 information requested by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State. 7 (ii) After reviewing a request the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State may 8 deny, modify or approve the agencies or institutions request based on the 9 estimated amount of appropriation needed and currently available, purpose, 10 estimated funding available and preferred spending priority. Upon approval 11 or modification of a request by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and 12 after meeting the requirements of subsection (iii) herein, the Department of 13 Finance and Administration shall establish the transfer of appropriation on 14 the books of the Department of Finance and Administration and the State 15 Auditor, in compliance with the applicable classifications of appropriations 16 as enumerated in Arkansas Code 19-4-521 through 19-4-525. 17 (iii) Any request approved as authorized in subsection (ii) herein, 18 including requests that establish a new commitment item or new appropriation 19 shall require prior approval by the Arkansas Legislative Council or if 20 meeting in Regular or Fiscal Session the Joint Budget Committee. 21 Any appropriation approved as authorized in this Section shall not be (iv) 22 carried forward to the next fiscal year and shall be identified as a change 23 level increase by the state agency or institution, if requested. 24 (v) Determining the maximum amount of appropriation for a state agency or 25 institution each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. 26 This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the 27 appropriation act(s) for a state agency or institution. Further, the General 28 Assembly has determined that a state agency or institution may operate more 29 efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the state agency or 30 institution authorizing broad powers under this section. Therefore, it is 31 both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight 32 by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget 33 Committee as provided by this section. 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SECTION 81. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 5 6 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 7 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 8 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 9 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 10 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 11 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 12 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 13 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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15 SECTION 82. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 16 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 17 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 18 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 19 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 20 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 21 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 22 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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27 SECTION 84. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the efficient construction, 28 29 repair, reconstruction, and improvement of the infrastructure in the state is 30 crucial to the public peace, health, and safety; that Arkansas is in need of additional funding to dedicate to the construction, repair, reconstruction, 31 32 and improvement of the infrastructure in the state to protect and serve the 33 residents of the state; that the United States Congress passed the 34 Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, Pub. L. No. 117-58, in 2021, which will provide funding to state agencies, constitutional offices, and 35

36 *institutions for a variety of purposes, including without limitation*

1	repairing and reconstructing roads and bridges in the state and supporting
2	other critical infrastructure projects; that ensuring the appropriate use of
3	these federal funds will positively impact the quality of the critical
4	infrastructure of this state; and that Sections 38 and 40 of this act are
5	immediately necessary because ensuring the appropriate use of the funds
6	received under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, Pub. L. No. 117-
7	58, will preserve public peace, health, and safety in the state by allocating
8	the funds to the most appropriate and effective use. Therefore, an emergency
9	is declared to exist, and Sections 38 and 40 of this act being immediately
10	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
11	become effective on:
12	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
13	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
14	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
15	bill; or
16	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
17	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
