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| 28 | BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL |
| 29 | ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: |
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| 31 | THAT Representative Evans or Representative Wardlaw is authorized to |
| 32 | introduce a bill which as introduced will read substantially as follows: |

- 7 TO AMEND THE PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEES' HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM FUNDING; AND
- 8 TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY.

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10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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- 12 SECTION 1. DO NOT CODIFY. <u>Legislative findings</u>.
- 13 <u>The General Assembly finds that:</u>
- 14 (1) It is vital that the State and Public School Life and Health
- 15 <u>Insurance Program remain solvent;</u>
- 16 (2) It is the responsibility of the House Committee on Education
- 17 and the Senate Committee on Education, through the biennial adequacy review
- 18 process required under § 10-3-2102, to determine the health insurance
- 19 contribution rate to be paid by each public school district each month for
- 20 <u>each eligible employee electing to participate in the public school</u>
- 21 employees' health insurance program; and
- 22 (3) In order to determine the contribution rate, the House
- 23 Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on Education shall review the
- 24 amount of funding provided through the matrix and state appropriation for
- 25 <u>public school employee health insurance.</u>

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- 27 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-17-1117(a), concerning the funding of the
- 28 public school employees' health insurance program by a public school
- 29 district, is amended to read as follows:
- 30 (a) $\frac{(1)}{(1)}$ Beginning January 1, $\frac{2014}{2023}$, a school district shall pay the
- 31 health insurance contribution rate of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150) per
- 32 established by the House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on
- 33 Education through the biennial adequacy review process required by § 10-3-
- 34 2102 each month for each eligible employee electing to participate in the
- 35 public school employees' health insurance program.
- 36 (2) The minimum contribution rate under subdivision (a)(1) of

1 this section shall increase annually by the same percentage that the General 2 Assembly increases the per-student foundation funding amount under § 6-20-2305. 3 4 (3)(A) Unless exempt under subdivision (a)(5) of this section, 5 the local contribution rate of a school district shall also increase by the 6 same percentage that a school district increases the base salary for licensed 7 personnel with a minimum of a bachelor's degree under the licensed salary 8 schedule adopted by the school district. 9 (B) As used in this section, "local contribution rate" 10 means the minimum rate required under subdivision (a)(1) of this section in 11 addition to the contribution amount a school district provides for health 12 insurance above that minimum contribution rate. 13 (4) A change to the local contribution rate under subdivision 14 (a)(3) of this section is effective for the plan year after the change to the licensed salary schedule is adopted by a school district. 15 16 (5) A school district is not required to increase the local 17 contribution rate as directed under subdivision (a)(3) of this section if the 18 school district: 19 (A) Is required to raise the base salary of licensed personnel with a minimum of a bachelor's degree due to an increase in the 20 21 minimum teacher compensation schedule under § 6-17-2403; 22 (B) Has a participation rate of seventy-five percent (75%) 23 or more of all eligible personnel participating in the public school 24 employees' health insurance program; or (C) Has a local contribution rate of one hundred twenty-25 26 five percent (125%) or more of the minimum contribution rate required under 27 this subsection. 28 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-17-1117(b)(1), concerning the funding of 29 30 the public school employees' health insurance program by the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education, is amended to read as follows: 31 32 (b)(1) $\frac{A}{A}$ The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education shall pay 33 the Employee Benefits Division a minimum of sixty-one dollars (\$61.00) per 34 month the amount established by the House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on Education through the biennial adequacy review process 35 required by § 10-3-2102, factored according to the medical component of the 36

1 Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers, for each eligible employee 2 electing to participate in the public school employees' health insurance 3 program administered by the State Board of Finance. 4 (B) The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education 5 shall make the total contributions under subdivision (b)(1)(A) of this 6 section by transferring fifty-five million dollars (\$55,000,000) to the 7 Employee Benefits Division in twelve (12) equal monthly installments. 8 9 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-17-1117(b)(3)(C), concerning the payment 10 of excess funding towards the public school employees' health insurance 11 program by the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education, is amended to 12 read as follows: 13 (C) If funding and appropriation are provided and exceed 14 the amount needed to make the minimum contribution under subdivision 15 (b)(1)(A) of this section, the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education 16 shall pay a proportional share of the excess on behalf of each participant. 17 18 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2305(a)(2)(B), concerning the 19 foundation funding amount for the 2022-2023 school year and each year 20 thereafter, is amended to read as follows: 21 (B) For the 2022-2023 school year and each school year 22 thereafter, the foundation funding amount is equal to seven thousand three 23 hundred forty nine dollars (\$7,349) seven thousand four hundred thirteen dollars (\$7,413) multiplied by the school district's average daily membership 24 25 for the previous school year. 26 27 SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2503(e) and (f), concerning the 28 general facilities and supplemental millage appropriations as they relate to bonded debt assistance, are repealed. 29 30 (e) The funded general facilities funding appropriation shall be distributed to the Employee Benefits Division for the exclusive benefit of 31 32 public school employees participating in the State and Public School Life and 33 Health Insurance Program. 34 (f) The funded supplemental millage appropriation shall be distributed 35 to the Employee Benefits Division for the exclusive benefit of public school

employees participating in the State and Public School Life and Health

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| 3 | SECTION 7. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the |
| 4 | General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the State and Public School |
| 5 | Life and Health Insurance Program is inadequate to provide sustainable |
| 6 | affordable health benefits for public school employees and state employees; |
| 7 | that an urgent need exists to address the state's funding and administration |
| 8 | of benefits for public school employees and state employees in order for the |
| 9 | program to remain viable and to avoid severe financial hardship to plan |
| 10 | participants; and that this act is immediately necessary to provide |
| 11 | affordable health benefit options in a timely manner to the state's public |
| 12 | school employees participating in the program and state employees |
| 13 | participating in the program. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, |
| 14 | and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public |
| 15 | peace, health, and safety shall become effective on: |
| 16 | (1) The date of its approval by the Governor; |
| 17 | (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, |
| 18 | the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the |
| 19 | <pre>bill; or</pre> |
| 20 | (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is |
| 21 | overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto." |
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
