8	TO REMEMBER AND COMMEMORATE UNITED STATES SENATOR
9	HATTIE OPHELIA WYATT CARAWAY FOR HER MANY NOTABLE
10	CONTRIBUTIONS TO WOMEN'S HISTORY.

14	TO REMEMBER AND COMMEMORATE UNITED STATES
15	SENATOR HATTIE OPHELIA WYATT CARAWAY FOR
16	HER MANY NOTABLE CONTRIBUTIONS TO WOMEN'S
17	HISTORY.

20	WHEREAS, March 1 is the first day of Women's History Month which is
21	annually declared and nationally celebrated to highlight the contributions of
22	women to events in history and contemporary society; and
23	
24	WHEREAS, Women's History Month is also celebrated during March in the
25	United Kingdom and Australia; and
26	
27	WHEREAS, Arkansas holds a significant role in the history and the
28	accomplishment of women by being home to the first woman ever elected to the
29	United States Senate, Mrs. Hattie Ophelia Wyatt Caraway (D-AR), in 1932; and
30	
31	WHEREAS, Hattie Caraway was appointed to the United States Senate in
32	1931 to fill the vacancy caused by the death of her husband, United States
33	Senator Thaddeus Caraway; and
34	
35	WHEREAS, party leaders assumed the widow had no intention of running
36	for a full term, but they clearly underestimated Hattie Caraway; and

2	WHEREAS, when on May 9, 1932, Hattie Caraway surprised everyone and
3	declared her candidacy for reelection, she noted in her diary, "I pitched a
4	coin and heads came [up] three times", and she added, "I really want to try
5	out my own theory of a woman running for office"; and
6	
7	WHEREAS, Hattie Caraway's male competitors joked that she would be
8	lucky to attract 1 percent (1%) of the vote, but the tenacious "little lady
9	from Arkansas" enlisted the persuasive skills of her friend, Louisiana United
10	States Senator Huey Long; and
11	
12	WHEREAS, the highlight of her 1932 campaign came in August, when the
13	controversial Senator Huey Long joined Hattie Caraway for a week-long road
14	trip nicknamed the "Hattie and Huey Tour"; and
15	
16	WHEREAS, when the Hattie and Huey Tour went storming through Arkansas
17	with his big sound trucks, Long bellowed: "We're here to pull a lot of pot-
18	bellied politicians off a little woman's neck"; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, giving her own stump speeches alongside the "Louisiana
21	Kingfish", Hattie Caraway won the election with double the vote of her
22	nearest rival and continued serving in the United States Senate until 1945;
23	and
24	
25	WHEREAS, Hattie Caraway was known for her silent strength, gaining the
26	nickname "Silent Hattie" and reserving her opinions for smaller committee
27	meetings and quiet room discussions instead of the United States Senate
28	floor; and
29	
30	WHEREAS, Hattie Caraway became an effective legislator and continued to
31	break many gender barriers in the United States Senate, including becoming
32	the first woman to chair a United States Senate committee in 1933; and
33	
34	WHEREAS, on October 19, 1943, in the absence of the Vice-President and
35	the President Pro Tempore, the gavel was handed to Senator Hattie Caraway of

Arkansas, making her the first woman to formally preside over the United

1	States Senate, and that day in October 1943 remains a milestone in United
2	States Senate history; and
3	
4	WHEREAS, when asked about her experience presiding over the United
5	States Senate, Hattie Caraway told reporters, "Nothing to it", and added that
6 7	after all, the Senate is the "best behaved crowd of men you ever saw"; and
8	WHEREAS, as her career drew to a close, journalist Drew Pearson
9	commented: "In that turbulent [Senate] chamber, where a person's good
10	points or bad quickly shine through the gloss, [Hattie Caraway] held her
11	own".; and
12	
13	WHEREAS, on her final day in office, the United States Senate tendered
14	Hattie Caraway the high honor of a standing ovation; and
15	
16	WHEREAS, we, as the elected women of the General Assembly, recognizing
17	our fellow Arkansan's courage, strength, and resolve to break all norms of
18	the 1930's society and political standards, proudly honor United States
19	Senator Hattie Ophelia Wyatt Caraway on this first day of March at the
20	commencement of Women's History Month as Senator Caraway serves as an
21	inspiration to each of us and to our state for her incredible achievements
22	and place in American history,
23	
24	NOW THEREFORE,
25	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
26	STATE OF ARKANSAS:
27	
28	THAT the Senate remember and commemorate United States Senator Hattie
29	Ophelia Wyatt Caraway for her many notable contributions to women's history.
