1 GENERAL FACILITIES AND SUPPLEMENTAL MILLAGE APPROPRIATION; TO DECLARE AN 2 EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES. 3 4 Subtitle TO AMEND THE PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEES' HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM FUNDING; AND 5 6 TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY. 7 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 9 SECTION 1. DO NOT CODIFY. Legislative findings. 10 11 The General Assembly finds that: 12 (1) It is vital that the State and Public School Life and Health 13 Insurance Program remain solvent; 14 (2) It is the responsibility of the House Committee on Education 15 and the Senate Committee on Education, through the biennial adequacy review process required under § 10-3-2102, to determine the health insurance 16 17 contribution rate to be paid by each public school district each month for 18 each eligible employee electing to participate in the public school employees' health insurance program; and 19 20 (3) In order to determine the contribution rate, the House 21 Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on Education shall review the 22 amount of funding provided through the matrix and state appropriation for 23 public school employee health insurance. 24 25 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-17-1117(a), concerning the funding of the 26 public school employees' health insurance program by a public school 27 district, is amended to read as follows: (a)(1) Beginning January 1, 2014 2023, a school district shall pay the 28 29 health insurance contribution rate of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150) per established by the House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on 30 31 Education through the biennial adequacy review process required by § 10-3-32 2102 each month for each eligible employee electing to participate in the 33 public school employees' health insurance program. 34 (2) The minimum contribution rate under subdivision (a)(1) of 35 this section shall increase annually by the same percentage that the General 36 Assembly increases the per-student foundation funding amount under § 6-20-

2	(3)(A) Unless exempt under subdivision $(a)(5)$ of this section,
3	the local contribution rate of a school district shall also increase by the
4	same percentage that a school district increases the base salary for licensed
5	personnel with a minimum of a bachelor's degree under the licensed salary
6	schedule adopted by the school district.
7	(B) As used in this section, "local contribution rate"
8	means the minimum rate required under subdivision (a)(1) of this section in
9	addition to the contribution amount a school district provides for health
10	insurance above that minimum contribution rate.
11	(4) A change to the local contribution rate under subdivision
12	(a)(3) of this section is effective for the plan year after the change to the
13	licensed salary schedule is adopted by a school district.
14	(5) A school district is not required to increase the local
15	contribution rate as directed under subdivision (a)(3) of this section if the
16	school district:
17	(A) Is required to raise the base salary of licensed
18	personnel with a minimum of a bachelor's degree due to an increase in the
19	minimum teacher compensation schedule under § 6-17-2403;
20	(B) Has a participation rate of seventy-five percent (75%)
21	or more of all eligible personnel participating in the public school
22	employees' health insurance program; or
23	(C) Has a local contribution rate of one hundred twenty-
24	five percent (125%) or more of the minimum contribution rate required under
25	this subsection.
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27	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-17-1117(b)(1), concerning the funding of
28	the public school employees' health insurance program by the Division of
29	Elementary and Secondary Education, is amended to read as follows:
30	(b)(1) $\frac{A}{A}$ The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education shall pay
31	the Employee Benefits Division a minimum of sixty-one dollars (\$61.00) per
32	month the amount established by the House Committee on Education and the
33	Senate Committee on Education through the biennial adequacy review process
34	required by § 10-3-2102, factored according to the medical component of the
35	Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers, for each eligible employee
36	electing to participate in the public school employees' health insurance

1 program administered by the State Board of Finance. 2 (B) The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education 3 shall make the total contributions under subdivision (b)(1)(A) of this 4 section by transferring fifty-five million dollars (\$55,000,000) to the 5 Employee Benefits Division in twelve (12) equal monthly installments. 6 7 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-17-1117(b)(3)(C), concerning the payment 8 of excess funding towards the public school employees' health insurance 9 program by the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education, is amended to 10 read as follows: 11 (C) If funding and appropriation are provided and exceed 12 the amount needed to make the minimum contribution under subdivision 13 (b)(1)(A) of this section, the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education 14 shall pay a proportional share of the excess on behalf of each participant. 15 16 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2305(a)(2)(B), concerning the 17 foundation funding amount for the 2022-2023 school year and each year 18 thereafter, is amended to read as follows: 19 (B) For the 2022-2023 school year and each school year 20 thereafter, the foundation funding amount is equal to seven thousand three 21 hundred forty nine dollars (\$7,349) seven thousand four hundred thirteen 22 dollars (\$7,413) multiplied by the school district's average daily membership 23 for the previous school year. 24 25 SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2503(e) and (f), concerning the 26 general facilities and supplemental millage appropriations as they relate to 27 bonded debt assistance, are repealed. 28 (e) The funded general facilities funding appropriation shall be distributed to the Employee Benefits Division for the exclusive benefit of 29 30 public school employees participating in the State and Public School Life and 31 Health Insurance Program. 32 (f) The funded supplemental millage appropriation shall be distributed 33 to the Employee Benefits Division for the exclusive benefit of public school 34 employees participating in the State and Public School Life and Health 35 Insurance Program.

1	SECTION 7. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
2	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the State and Public School
3	Life and Health Insurance Program is inadequate to provide sustainable
4	affordable health benefits for public school employees and state employees;
5	that an urgent need exists to address the state's funding and administration
6	of benefits for public school employees and state employees in order for the
7	program to remain viable and to avoid severe financial hardship to plan
8	participants; and that this act is immediately necessary to provide
9	affordable health benefit options in a timely manner to the state's public
10	school employees participating in the program and state employees
11	participating in the program. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist,
12	and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public
13	peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:
14	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
15	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
16	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
17	bill; or
18	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
19	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto."
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
