21 Miscellaneous Agencies Fund Account to the Department of Human Services
22 Grants Fund Account. The transferred funds shall be used to match federal
23 funds used for supplemental Medicaid payments to Arkansas Children's
24 Hospital.

25 The Arkansas Children's Hospital may also request the Chief Fiscal Officer
26 of the State to transfer the sum not to exceed \$1,000,000 each fiscal year
27 from the Miscellaneous Agencies Fund Account from funds made available by
28 this Act for the Intensive Care Nursery to the Department of Human Services
29 Grants Fund Account. The transferred funds shall be used to match federal
30 Medicaid funds for cost-based reimbursement for helicopter patient transport.

31 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2022~~
32 2023 through June 30, ~~2023~~ 2024.

33
34 SECTION 69. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
36 INNOVATION AND PROJECT DEVELOPMENT FUND TRANSFERS. The Department of

1 Transformation & Shared Services - Division of Information Systems is a cost
2 recovery agency subject to the requirements of the United States Office of
3 Management and Budget Circular A-87 Cost Principles for State, Local and
4 Indian Tribal Government (A-87) and Cost Principles for Developing Cost
5 Allocation Plans and Indirect Cost Rates for Agreements with the Federal
6 Government Implementation Guide for the Office of Management and Budget
7 Circular A-87 (ASMBC-10). To comply with these federal rules, it is necessary
8 to establish an Innovation and Project Development appropriation and general
9 revenue fund account within the Department of Finance and Administration -
10 Disbursing Officer for the Department of Transformation & Shared Services -
11 Division of Information Systems. This fund shall be used for state enterprise
12 innovation projects that would enhance the technology operations of the State
13 that cannot be cost allocated to federal programs. The Department of
14 Transformation & Shared Services - Division of Information Systems will
15 maintain documentation for projects billed for these purposes. Fund transfers
16 may be made from the General Revenue Fund Account, upon the approval of the
17 Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and prior review of the Arkansas
18 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, to reimburse the Department of
19 Transformation & Shared Services - Division of Information Systems for the
20 amounts billed.

21 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2022~~
22 2023 through June 30, ~~2023~~ 2024.

23

24 SECTION 70. SPECIAL LANGUAGE – CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 26-51-
25 205, concerning the state income tax on corporations and the Work Force 2000
26 Development Fund, is amended to codify special language in appropriation acts
27 and to add an additional subsection to read as follows:

28 (e)(1)(A) After the amounts to be made available to the various
29 technical institutes or comprehensive lifelong learning centers have been
30 determined under subdivisions (d)(2)(A) and (d)(2)(B) of this section, such
31 documents as may be necessary shall be processed so that funds may be
32 transferred from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund to the State Treasury
33 fund or fund account from which the technical institute or comprehensive
34 lifelong learning center draws its general revenue support.

35 (B) The amount of the funds transferred under subdivision
36 (e)(1)(A) of this section shall not exceed six and three hundred nine

1 thousandths percent (6.309%) of the total funds available from the Work Force
2 2000 Development Fund during each fiscal year.

3 (2) If a technical college, community college, or educational
4 institution that receives support from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund
5 as determined by law transfers from the Arkansas Technical College and
6 Community College System for which Work Force 2000 Development Fund moneys
7 are determined by law, then the actual amount of support from the Work Force
8 2000 Development Fund in the preceding fiscal year for the transferring
9 educational institution shall be made available regardless of any other
10 provision of law that sets out maximum levels of support from such fund.

11 (3)(A) The funds distributed under subdivision (d)(2)(C) of this
12 section in excess of those amounts collected and distributed before June 30,
13 2014, shall be deposited into the Skills Development Fund to be used only for
14 personal services, grants, operation, support, and improvement of
15 occupational, vocational, technical, and workforce development programs by
16 the Office of Skills Development of the Department of Commerce.

17 (B) The distributions of funds under subdivision (d)(2)(C)
18 of this section in excess of those amounts collected and distributed before
19 June 30, 2014, shall not apply to proceeds allocated to schools, colleges,
20 and educational institutions under subdivisions (d)(2)(A) and (d)(2)(B) of
21 this section.

22
23 SECTION 71. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
25 PROCEDURES – PERSONAL SERVICES EXTRA HELP. In the event that there is not
26 sufficient appropriation provided for by the General Assembly for payment of
27 personal services related to Extra Help for any state agency for the period
28 ending June 30, ~~2023~~ 2024, said agency may request a transfer from
29 appropriations provided for Personal Services Extra Help in the Miscellaneous
30 Transfers Section herein, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, stating
31 clearly the amount required. Upon approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of
32 the State, and after seeking prior review by the Arkansas Legislative Council
33 or Joint Budget Committee, the State Auditor shall be notified as to the
34 amount and the purposes for which said appropriation is to be made. The
35 appropriation shall then be established upon the books of the Department of
36 Finance and Administration and the State Auditor. Provided further, that if

1 desired, said appropriation shall be supplemental to those regularly
2 appropriated for such purposes by the General Assembly for the agency.

3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2022~~
4 2023 through June 30, ~~2023~~ 2024.

6 SECTION 72. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

8 INTRASTATE METRO PLANNING GRANTS. As referenced in Section 9 of Act 637 of
9 1995, the authorized funding for Intrastate Metro Planning Grants that are
10 evenly distributed among planning and development districts under the
11 Miscellaneous Grants and Expenses Section of this Act shall include the West
12 Central Arkansas Economic Development District.

13 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2022~~
14 2023 through June 30, ~~2023~~ 2024.

15

16 SECTION 73. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
17 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
18 USAGE AUTHORIZED. The Arkansas Children's Hospital President and C.E.O. may
19 request the Department of Human Services-Division of Medical Services to
20 retain in the Department of Human Services Grant Fund account an amount not
21 to exceed \$1,000,000 for funds made available by the act to be used to match
22 federal funds used for supplemental Medicaid payments to Arkansas Children's
23 Hospital.

24 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2022~~
25 2023 through June 30, ~~2023~~ 2024.

26

27 SECTION 74. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
28 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
29 PROCEDURES - MEDICAL MARIJUANA IMPLEMENTATION AND REGULATION. In the event
30 that sufficient appropriation is not provided by the General Assembly for
31 expenditures resulting from the implementation and regulation of the Arkansas
32 Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016 for any state agency, pursuant to
33 Arkansas Code § 19-4-701 et seq., said agency shall request a transfer of
34 appropriation from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, stating clearly the
35 amount required. Upon approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State said
36 appropriations shall be established upon the books of the Department of

1 Finance and Administration in compliance with the applicable classifications
2 of appropriations as enumerated in Arkansas Code §§ 19-4-521 through 19-4-
3 527.

4 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2022~~
5 2023 through June 30, ~~2023~~ 2024.

6
7 SECTION 75. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
9 TRANSFER AUTHORITY. From time to time, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State
10 may transfer from his or her books and those of the Treasurer of State and
11 the Auditor of State from the Medical Marijuana Implementation and Operations
12 Fund to various state agencies' funds the amounts necessary to fund the
13 expenses for the implementation, administration, and/or enforcement of the
14 Arkansas Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016.

15 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2022~~
16 2023 through June 30, ~~2023~~ 2024.

17
18 SECTION 76. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
19 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BLANKET
20 BOND PROGRAM. The Secretary of the Department of Finance and Administration
21 is authorized to transfer Appropriation between the Blanket Surety Bond
22 Program appropriations authorized for State Employees (Appropriation 2DM),
23 County Employees (Appropriation 2DN), Municipal Employees (Appropriation 2DP)
24 and Public School Employees (Appropriation 2DQ).

25 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2022~~
26 2023 through June 30, ~~2023~~ 2024.

27
28 SECTION 77. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
30 PROCEDURES - VARIOUS TEMPORARY APPROPRIATION FOR STATE AGENCIES AND
31 INSTITUTIONS. (i) In the event that sufficient appropriation is not provided
32 by the General Assembly for any state agency or institution, an agency or
33 institution may request a transfer of appropriation, as provided in the
34 Various Temporary Appropriation for State Agencies and Institutions
35 Appropriation Section of this Act, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
36 State, stating clearly the amount requested, purpose and any additional

1 information requested by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State.

2 (ii) After reviewing a request the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State may
3 deny, modify or approve the agencies or institutions request based on the
4 estimated amount of appropriation needed and currently available, purpose,
5 estimated funding available and preferred spending priority. Upon approval
6 or modification of a request by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and
7 after meeting the requirements of subsection (iii) herein, the Department of
8 Finance and Administration shall establish the transfer of appropriation on
9 the books of the Department of Finance and Administration and the State
10 Auditor, in compliance with the applicable classifications of appropriations
11 as enumerated in Arkansas Code 19-4-521 through 19-4-525.

12 (iii) Any request approved as authorized in subsection (ii) herein,
13 including requests that establish a new commitment item or new appropriation
14 shall require prior approval by the Arkansas Legislative Council or if
15 meeting in Regular or Fiscal Session the Joint Budget Committee.

16 (iv) Any appropriation approved as authorized in this Section shall not be
17 carried forward to the next fiscal year and shall be identified as a change
18 level increase by the state agency or institution, if requested.

19 (v) Determining the maximum amount of appropriation for a state agency or
20 institution each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly.
21 This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the
22 appropriation act(s) for a state agency or institution. Further, the General
23 Assembly has determined that a state agency or institution may operate more
24 efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the state agency or
25 institution authorizing broad powers under this section. Therefore, it is
26 both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight
27 by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget
28 Committee as provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the
29 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this
30 section. If the requirement or approval by the Legislative Council or Joint
31 Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent
32 jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

33 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2022~~
34 2023 through June 30, ~~2023~~ 2024.

35
36 SECTION 78. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds

1 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
2 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
3 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
4 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
5 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
6 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
7 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
8 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

9
10 SECTION 79. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
11 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
12 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
13 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
14 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
15 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
16 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
17 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

18
19 SECTION 80. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
20 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
21 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
22 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2023 is essential to the operation of
23 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
24 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
25 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2023 could work irreparable harm
26 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
27 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
28 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
29 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2023.
