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23	SECTION 1. Ark	tansas Code § 6-10-106(a), concerning t	he dates for the
24	beginning and end of	the school year, is amended to read as	follows:
25	(a)(l)(A) <del>Begi</del>	nning with the 2023-2024 Each school y	ear, the first day
26	of the school year fo	or student attendance in public element	ary and secondary
27	schools shall <del>not</del> be	earlier than the Monday two (2) weeks	<del>before Labor Day</del> :
28		(i) On or after the Monday of the	week in which
29	August 19 falls;		
30		(ii) Not earlier than August 14; a	<u>nd</u>
31		(iii) Not later than August 26.	
32	(B)	The date for beginning the school ye	ar shall be
33	determined by the boa	ard of directors of each school distric	t <del>in accordance</del>
34	with subdivision (a)	(1)(A) of this section.	
35	(C)	Labor Day shall be celebrated as a s	chool holiday in
36	all the school distri	icts of the state, and school shall not	be held on that

1	date.
2	(D) As used in this section, "week" means a seven-day
3	period that begins on a Sunday and ends on a Saturday.
4	(2) <del>(A)</del> The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education may
5	grant a school district a waiver to begin school on an earlier or a later
6	date if the division determines that there exists a material and substantial
7	reason for the school district to begin school on an earlier or a later date
8	due to very exceptional or emergency circumstances such as a contagious
9	disease outbreak, inclement weather, or other acts of God.
10	(B) The division shall not grant a public school district
11	a waiver under § 6-15-103 to begin school on an earlier date.
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13	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-10-106(f) and (g), concerning make-up
14	days built into a school calendar and alternate school calendars, are amended
15	to read as follows:
16	(f) Except as provided under subsection (g) of this section, a $\underline{\Lambda}$
17	school district shall adopt an academic calendar that includes five (5) make-
18	up days, in addition to the number of student-teacher interaction days
19	required by the Standards for Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools and
20	School Districts established by the State Board of Education, for days
21	unavoidably lost due to exceptional or emergency circumstances resulting from
22	a contagious disease outbreak, inclement weather, or other acts of God.
23	(g)(1) Beginning with the 2022-2023 school year, a public school
24	district board of directors may elect to implement an alternate school
25	calendar.
26	(2)(A) An alternate school calendar implemented under
27	subdivision (g)(1) of this section shall consist of:
28	(i) At least one thousand sixty-eight (1,068) hours
29	of instructional time; and
30	(ii)(a) At least thirty (30) make-up hours, in
31	addition to the number of hours required of instructional time, for days
32	unavoidably lost due to exceptional or emergency circumstances resulting from
33	inclement weather.
34	(b) If additional make-up hours are needed,
35	the public school district board of directors shall modify its alternate

school calendar to include make-up hours for the additional hours needed.

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T	(B) nowever, there shall not be a minimum number of school
2	days required to meet the required one thousand sixty-eight (1,068) hours of
3	instructional time.
4	(3) A public school district board of directors that elects to
5	implement an alternate school calendar under subdivision (g)(1) of this
6	section shall:
7	(A) Notify the division by July 1 of each year that the
8	public school district intends to implement the alternate school calendar;
9	(B) Post the alternate school calendar on the public
10	school district's website by August 1 of each year that the public school
11	district intends to implement the alternate school calendar;
12	(C) Input into eSchool, eFinance, or the Arkansas Public
13	School Computer Network all data that:
14	(i) Affects the average daily membership of the
15	public school district; and
16	(ii) Ensures compliance with the required minimum
17	number of school instructional hours under subdivision (g)(2)(A)(i) of this
18	section; and
19	(D)(i) Not be eligible for the use of alternative methods
20	of instruction granted under § 6-10-127.
21	(ii) However, a public school district that
22	implements an alternate school calendar under subdivision (g)(l) of this
23	section may submit an application to operate a virtual learning option.
24	(4) The total number of instructional hours under an alternate
25	school calendar shall be converted to school days for purposes of the:
26	(A) Number of days required in a teacher employment basic
27	<del>contract under § 6-17-2402(1);</del>
28	(B) Number of days counted during the official reporting
29	period for attendance under § 6-18-213(b)(1); and
30	(C) Average daily membership calculated under § 6-20-
31	<del>2303(3).</del>
32	(5) The division may promulgate rules as necessary to administer
33	this section.
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35	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code $\S$ 6-16-102(a)(1)-(3), concerning the
36	definition of "school day", are amended to read as follows:

1	(a)(1) $\frac{(A)}{(A)}$ Except as provided under subdivision (a)(1)(B) of this
2	$\frac{\text{section, as}}{\text{section}}$ used in this section, "school day" shall mean a day in which
3	classes are in session and students receive at least six (6) hours of
4	instructional time.
5	(B) However, "school day" for purposes of a public school
6	district that implements an alternate school calendar under § 6-10-106(g)
7	means a day in which classes are in session and students are under the
8	guidance and direction of a teacher or public school employee.
9	(2) $(A)$ Any day in which less than six (6) hours of instructional
10	time are provided to students shall be counted as one-half ( $^1\!\! 2$ ) of a school
11	day if at least three (3) hours of instructional time are provided to
12	students.
13	(B) However, subdivision (a)(2)(A) of this section shall
14	not apply to a public school district that implements an alternate school
15	calendar under § 6-10-106(g).
16	(3) $(A)$ Any day in which less than three (3) hours of
17	instructional time are provided to students shall not be counted as any part
18	of a school day.
19	(B) However, subdivision (a)(3)(A) of this section shall
20	not apply to a public school district that implements an alternate school
21	calendar under § 6-10-106(g).
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23	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-16-102(c), concerning planned
24	instructional time during a school day, is amended to read as follows:
25	(c) $(1)$ A school district is deemed to have fulfilled the requirements
26	of subsection (a) of this section if the planned instructional time in each
27	school day does not average less than six (6) hours each day or thirty (30)
28	hours each week.
29	(2) However, subdivision (c)(1) of this section shall not apply
30	to a public school district that implements an alternate school calendar
31	under § 6-10-106(g).
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33	SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
34	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that public schools need a certain
35	amount of time to determine the school calendar for the upcoming school year,
36	which requires meetings and determinations of dates certain; that for

T	purposes of teacher and administrator contracts, establishing the school
2	calendar is important; and that this act is immediately necessary because
3	public schools need to know as soon as practicable what the statutory
4	requirements are with respect to establishing the school calendars for the
5	upcoming school year. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this
6	act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace,
7	health, and safety shall become effective on:
8	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
9	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
10	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
11	bill; or
12	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
13	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
