7	(B) The absences required under subdivision (b)(2)(A) of	
8	this section shall not count towards the requirement that a public school	
9	district or open-enrollment public charter school dismiss or drop from its	
10	attendance records a student who is absent from daily attendance for more	
11	than ten (10) consecutive school days under § 6-18-213(f).	
12	(3)(A) At the conclusion of a pregnancy-related or parenting-	
13	related period of absence, allow a student to make up missed work in a	
14	reasonable amount of time that shall not be less than the number of days the	
15	student was absent.	
16	(B) A student may choose from various options to make up	
17	missed work, including without limitation:	
18	(i) Retaking a semester at the public school	
19	district or open-enrollment public charter school in which he or she is	
20	enrolled;	
21	(ii) Participating in an online course credit	
22	recovery program;	
23	(iii) Being granted six (6) weeks to continue at the	
24	same pace and finish the semester at a later date, provided that the student	
25	may:	
26	(a) Complete his or her coursework within the	
27	current school year; or	
28	(b) Attend previously scheduled summer school	
29	classes made available by the public school district or open-enrollment	
30	public charter school in which he or she is enrolled; and	
31	(iv) Receiving home-based instruction services;	
32	(4) Provide that, for absences or checkouts for reasons listed	
33	under subdivision (b)(1) of this section, the following shall be accepted as

35	(A) Documentation from a student's physician; or

2	(5)(A) Provide for reasonable accommodations for a lactating		
3	student on the public school district or open-enrollment public charter		
4	school campus to express breast milk, breastfeed, or address other		
5	breastfeeding needs, including without limitation:		
6	(i) Access to a private and secure room other than a		
7	restroom to express breast milk or breastfeed a child;		
8	(ii) Permission to bring a breast pump and any other		
9	equipment used to express breast milk to school;		
10	(iii) Access to a power source for a breast pump or		
11	any other equipment used to express breast milk; and		
12	(iv) Access to a place to safely store breast milk.		
13	(B) However, this section does not require a public school		
14	district or open-enrollment public charter school to provide a lactating		
15	student additional excused absences from the school day to breastfeed a child		
16	off the public school district or open-enrollment public charter school		
17	campus;		
18	(6) Ensure that a lactating student shall be provided a		
19	reasonable amount of time to accommodate the need to express breast milk; and		
20	(7) Provide that a student shall not incur an academic penalty		
21	as a result of the use, during the school day, of the reasonable		
22	accommodations provided under subdivisions (b)(5) and (6) of this section and		
23	shall be provided the opportunity to make up any work missed due to the use		
24	of the reasonable accommodations provided under subdivisions (b)(5) and (6)		
25	of this section.		
26	(c)(1) A public school district that is associated with a public high		
27	school that provides access to child care either on campus or off campus		
28	shall adopt a policy that requires information regarding the child care		
29	provided on campus or off campus be provided to student mothers and student		
30	fathers.		
31	(2) If a public high school does not provide child care either		
32	on campus or off campus, the public school district associated with the		
33	public high school shall adopt a policy that identifies and notifies students		
34	of child care providers available to the students.		
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
