5	6-13-903. Powers.	
6	(a) Public school districts in the State of Arkansas are empowered to	
7	voluntarily agree to share programs, personnel, materials, and equipment for	
8	the purpose of enlarging curriculum or services or providing new services to	
9	students in their respective school districts.	
10	(b) The educational cooperatives are empowered to receive state,	
11	local, and federal funds that have been assigned to the educational	
12	cooperatives by the member school districts and are also empowered to spend	
13	those funds on behalf of the school districts assigning those funds.	
14	(c) The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education shall not	
15	distribute state equalization aid directly to any educational cooperative.	
16		
17	6-13-904. Agents for school districts.	
18	(a) The educational cooperatives will act as an agency for all or some	
19	of the member school districts in dealings with other governmental and	
20	private agencies.	
21	(b) The educational cooperatives will have the power to contract and	
22	handle funds for the member school districts under conditions specified in	
23	the agreement between the member school districts and federal law and	
24	regulations and state law and rule.	
25		
26	6-13-905. Board of directors.	
27	(a) Each educational cooperative will be governed by a board of	
28	directors consisting of one (1) representative appointed by the board of	
29	directors of each cooperating school district.	
30	(b) The board of directors shall be empowered to hire a director and	
31	other employees and to contract for services, supplies, and equipment.	
32	(c) Policies for the operation of the educational cooperative will be	
33	developed by the board of directors and be filed with the Division of	
34	Elementary and Secondary Education as required by law of school districts	
35	generally.	

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1	6-13-906. Rules and reports.
2	(a) The educational cooperative will:
3	(1) Abide by all rules of the Division of Elementary and
4	Secondary Education which apply to school districts generally; and
5	(2) Make all reports as required by law and rule which apply to
6	school districts generally to the division.
7	(b)(1) Records of the expenditures and receipts of the educational
8	cooperatives shall be kept in such manner and on such forms as may be
9	specified by the division or the School Audit Section of Arkansas Legislative
10	Audit.
11	(2) Reports on expenditures and receipts shall be made for the
12	cooperative as a single agency or shall be made separately by the school
13	districts to reflect the status of each member school district at such time
14	and in such manner as specified by the division.
15	
16	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-13-1006 is amended to read as follows:
17	6-13-1006. Board of directors.
18	(a) Each education service cooperative shall be governed by a board of
19	directors consisting of the following members who shall reside one (1)
20	representative appointed by each school district board of directors within
21	the boundary of the education service cooperative:
22	(1) Two (2) members appointed by the Speaker of the House of
23	Representatives;
24	(2) Two (2) members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of
25	the Senate;
26	(3) Two (2) members appointed by the Governor; and
27	(4) One (1) member appointed by the Secretary of the Department
28	of Education.
29	(b) No school district may have official representation on more than
30	one (1) education service cooperative board of directors.
31	(e)(b) The board of directors of each established education service
32	cooperative shall:
33	(1) Function as a public corporate body;
34	(2) Meet, except as otherwise provided in § 6-13-1007, at least
35	eight (8) times each year; and
36	(3) Exercise general fiduciary responsibilities for the

1	education service cooperative with regard to policies and practices which
2	guard the integrity of the agency and maintain public trust in its operation.
3	(c) The first meeting of the board of directors shall be:
4	(1) Called by the member appointed by the Secretary of the
5	Department of Education under subdivision (a)(4) of this section; and
6	(2) Held within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this
7	act.
8	(d) At its first regular meeting, the board of directors shall elect a
9	chair.
10	(e)(1) The terms for the initial members appointed under subsection
11	(a) of this section shall be staggered as determined by lot with:
12	(A) One (1) member's term expiring December 31, 2025;
13	(B) Two (2) members' terms expiring December 31, 2026;
14	(C) Two (2) members' terms expiring December 31, 2027; and
15	(D) Two (2) members' terms expiring December 31, 2028.
16	(2) Each succeeding appointment to a board of directors shall be
17	for a term of four (4) years, with each appointed member serving until the
18	member's successor is appointed.
19	(d) Such responsibilities (f) Responsibilities of the board of
20	directors, consistent with funds available, shall include, but not be limited
21	to without limitation the following:
22	(1) Employment of a director of the education service
23	cooperative who shall serve as the nonvoting executive officer of the board
24	of directors;
25	(2) Establishment of policies and procedures for the operation
26	and management of the education service cooperative, which shall be in
27	written form and shall be filed with the State Board of Education;
28	(3) Preparation of an annual budget estimating income and
29	expenditures for programs and services in accordance with procedures
30	established by the state board;
31	(4) Receipt and expenditure of funds needed to provide programs
32	and services in the area;
33	(5) Making such surveys or other inquiries which may be required
34	to determine the service needs of school districts in the education service
35	cooperative and developing plans to provide such needed services;
36	(6) Employment, upon the recommendation of the director of the

- 1 education service cooperative, of such personnel as may be required to 2 provide the services requested by the school districts in the area; Implementation of policies established by the state board 3 4 for the operation of education service cooperatives; 5 (8) Cooperation with other education service cooperatives, 6 school districts, and other agencies to provide programs and services for 7 children and adults residing within their respective areas; 8 (9) For facilities and buildings as may be required to provide 9 authorized programs and services: 10 (A) Renting, leasing, purchasing, constructing, or 11 receiving by gift; 12 (B) Borrowing from the Revolving Loan Fund under § 6-20-13 818; or 14 (C) Borrowing from other sources for limited or unusual 15 circumstances upon approval of the Commissioner of Elementary and Secondary 16 Education and the Secretary of the Department of Finance and Administration; 17 and 18 (10) Carrying out such other duties as may be required for the 19 efficient operation of the education service cooperative for which the board 20 of directors is responsible. 21 (g) Members of the board of directors shall be paid per diem and 22 mileage at the rate established by law for attending meetings of the board of 23 directors. 24 25 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-13-1007 is repealed. 26 6-13-1007. Executive committee. 27 (a)(1) In a meeting, with a majority of its members present and voting, the board of directors of an education service cooperative may elect 28 29 from its membership an executive committee of seven (7), nine (9), or eleven 30 (11) members. 31 (2) Candidates for the executive committee, if one is formed, 32 shall be chosen so that the school districts within the education service 33 cooperative are equitably represented.

(3) All subsequent members of the executive committee shall be

1	(b) The function of the executive committee shall be to carry out			
2	those duties delegated to it by the governing board of directors, the			
3	provisions of § 6-13-1006 notwithstanding.			
4	(c) Terms of executive committee members shall be three (3) years			
5	except for the initial members which shall have terms assigned by lot so as			
6	to stagger terms to equalize as nearly as possible the number of members to			
7	be elected each year. Vacancies occurring after the annual meeting shall be			
8	filled by the executive committee until the next annual meeting.			
9	(d) Should an executive committee be established in any education			
10	service cooperative, it shall meet at least nine (9) times per year, and the			
11	requirements for board of directors meetings shall be reduced to three (3)			
12	times annually. The president of the board of directors shall serve as chair			
13	of the executive committee. No person, however, may serve in this position			
14	for more than two (2) consecutive years.
