18	TO REPEAL THE PUBLIC SCHOOL EDUCATIONAL
19	COOPERATIVE ACT OF 1981; AND TO AMEND THE
20	EDUCATION SERVICE COOPERATIVE ACT OF
21	1985.
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24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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26	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 13, Subchapter 9, is
27	repealed.
28	6-13-901. Title.
29	The title of this subchapter shall be "The Public School Educational
30	Cooperative Act of 1981".
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32	6-13-902. Definitions.
33	As used in this subchapter:
34	(1) "Educational cooperative" means a voluntary association of
35	school districts to share resources, personnel, materials, and equipment and
36	to provide and improve services and programs to students; and



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1	(2) "Public school district" means any public school district in
2	the state serving students in a kindergarten through grade twelve (K-12)
3	program or a grade one through twelve (1-12) program.
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5	6-13-903. Powers.
6	(a) Public school districts in the State of Arkansas are empowered to
7	voluntarily agree to share programs, personnel, materials, and equipment for
8	the purpose of enlarging curriculum or services or providing new services to
9	students in their respective school districts.
10	(b) The educational cooperatives are empowered to receive state,
11	local, and federal funds that have been assigned to the educational
12	cooperatives by the member school districts and are also empowered to spend
13	those funds on behalf of the school districts assigning those funds.
14	(c) The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education shall not
15	distribute state equalization aid directly to any educational cooperative.
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17	6-13-904. Agents for school districts.
18	(a) The educational cooperatives will act as an agency for all or some
19	of the member school districts in dealings with other governmental and
20	private agencies.
21	(b) The educational cooperatives will have the power to contract and
22	handle funds for the member school districts under conditions specified in
23	the agreement between the member school districts and federal law and
24	regulations and state law and rule.
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26	6-13-905. Board of directors.
27	(a) Each educational cooperative will be governed by a board of
28	directors consisting of one (1) representative appointed by the board of
29	directors of each cooperating school district.
30	(b) The board of directors shall be empowered to hire a director and
31	other employees and to contract for services, supplies, and equipment.
32	(c) Policies for the operation of the educational cooperative will be
33	developed by the board of directors and be filed with the Division of
34	Elementary and Secondary Education as required by law of school districts
35	generally.
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1	6-13-906. Rules and reports.
2	(a) The educational cooperative will:
3	(1) Abide by all rules of the Division of Elementary and
4	Secondary Education which apply to school districts generally; and
5	(2) Make all reports as required by law and rule which apply to
6	school districts generally to the division.
7	(b)(1) Records of the expenditures and receipts of the educational
8	cooperatives shall be kept in such manner and on such forms as may be
9	specified by the division or the School Audit Section of Arkansas Legislative
10	Audit.
11	(2) Reports on expenditures and receipts shall be made for the
12	cooperative as a single agency or shall be made separately by the school
13	districts to reflect the status of each member school district at such time
14	and in such manner as specified by the division.
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16	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-13-1006 is amended to read as follows:
17	6-13-1006. Board of directors.
18	(a) <u>(1)</u> Each education service cooperative shall be governed by a board
19	of directors consisting of one (1) representative member appointed by each
20	school district board of directors within the boundary of the education
21	service cooperative.
22	(2) A member appointed under subdivision (a)(1) of this section
23	<u>may include:</u>
24	(A)(i) An individual employed by a public school district
25	within the boundary of the education service cooperative.
26	(ii) However, the following employees of a public
27	school district shall not be appointed under subdivision (a)(1) of this
28	section:
29	<u>(a) A superintendent; or</u>
30	<u>(b) An assistant superintendent;</u>
31	(B) A member of a public school district board of
32	directors within the boundary of the education service cooperative; or
33	(C) A member of a community that is within the boundary of
34	the education service cooperative.
35	(b) No school district may have official representation on more than
36	one (1) education service cooperative board of directors.

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1	(c)(b) The board of directors of each established education service
2	cooperative shall:
3	(1) Function as a public corporate body;
4	(2) Meet, except as otherwise provided in § 6-13-1007, at least
5	eight (8) times each year; and
6	(3) Exercise general fiduciary responsibilities for the
7	education service cooperative with regard to policies and practices which
8	guard the integrity of the agency and maintain public trust in its operation.
9	(c) The first meeting of the board of directors shall be:
10	(1) Called by the member appointed by the Secretary of the
11	Department of Education under subdivision (a)(4) of this section; and
12	(2) Held within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this
13	act.
14	(d) At its first regular meeting, the board of directors shall elect a
15	chair.
16	(e)(1) The terms for the initial members appointed under subsection
17	(a) of this section shall be staggered as determined by lot and in compliance
18	with subdivision (e)(3) of this section with:
19	(A) One (1) member's term expiring December 31, 2025;
20	(B) Two (2) members' terms expiring December 31, 2026;
21	(C) Two (2) members' terms expiring December 31, 2027; and
22	(D) Two (2) members' terms expiring December 31, 2028.
23	(2) Each succeeding appointment to a board of directors shall be
24	for a term of four (4) years, with each appointed member serving until the
25	member's successor is appointed.
26	(3) Each member shall hold over after the expiration of his or
27	her term until his or her successor shall be duly appointed and qualified.
28	(d) Such responsibilities (f) Responsibilities of the board of
29	directors, consistent with funds available, shall include, but not be limited
30	to without limitation the following:
31	(1) Employment of a director of the education service
32	cooperative who shall serve as the nonvoting executive officer of the board
33	of directors;
34	(2) Establishment of policies and procedures for the operation
35	and management of the education service cooperative, which shall be in
36	written form and shall be filed with the State Board of Education;

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1 (3) Preparation of an annual budget estimating income and 2 expenditures for programs and services in accordance with procedures 3 established by the state board; 4 (4) Receipt and expenditure of funds needed to provide programs 5 and services in the area; 6 (5) Making such surveys or other inquiries which may be required 7 to determine the service needs of school districts in the education service 8 cooperative and developing plans to provide such needed services; 9 (6) Employment, upon the recommendation of the director of the 10 education service cooperative, of such personnel as may be required to 11 provide the services requested by the school districts in the area; 12 Implementation of policies established by the state board (7) 13 for the operation of education service cooperatives; 14 (8) Cooperation with other education service cooperatives, 15 school districts, and other agencies to provide programs and services for 16 children and adults residing within their respective areas; 17 (9) For facilities and buildings as may be required to provide 18 authorized programs and services: 19 Renting, leasing, purchasing, constructing, or (A) 20 receiving by gift; 21 (B) Borrowing from the Revolving Loan Fund under § 6-20-22 818; or 23 (C) Borrowing from other sources for limited or unusual 24 circumstances upon approval of the Commissioner of Elementary and Secondary 25 Education and the Secretary of the Department of Finance and Administration; 26 and 27 Carrying out such other duties as may be required for the (10)28 efficient operation of the education service cooperative for which the board 29 of directors is responsible. (g) Members of the board of directors shall be paid per diem and 30 mileage at the rate established by law for attending meetings of the board of 31 32 directors. 33 34 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-13-1007 is repealed. 6-13-1007. Executive committee. 35 36 (a)(1) In a meeting, with a majority of its members present and

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1	voting, the board of directors of an education service cooperative may elect
2	from its membership an executive committee of seven (7), nine (9), or eleven
3	(11) members.
4	(2) Candidates for the executive committee, if one is formed,
5	shall be chosen so that the school districts within the education service
6	cooperative are equitably represented.
7	(3) All subsequent members of the executive committee shall be
8	elected by a majority vote of the board of directors in attendance at the
9	annual meeting.
10	(b) The function of the executive committee shall be to carry out
11	those duties delegated to it by the governing board of directors, the
12	provisions of § 6-13-1006 notwithstanding.
13	(c) Terms of executive committee members shall be three (3) years
14	except for the initial members which shall have terms assigned by lot so as
15	to stagger terms to equalize as nearly as possible the number of members to
16	be elected each year. Vacancies occurring after the annual meeting shall be
17	filled by the executive committee until the next annual meeting.
18	(d) Should an executive committee be established in any education
19	service cooperative, it shall meet at least nine (9) times per year, and the
20	requirements for board of directors meetings shall be reduced to three (3)
21	times annually. The president of the board of directors shall serve as chair
22	of the executive committee. No person, however, may serve in this position
23	for more than two (2) consecutive years.
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25	SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This act is effective on and after January
