34	(b) As used in	this section:	
35	<u>(1) "Able</u>	e-bodied adult" means an individual	who is not:
36	<u>(A)</u>	Under nineteen (19) years of age;	

1	(B) Over sixty-four (64) years of age;		
2	(C) Medically certified as physically or mentally unfit		
3	<pre>for employment;</pre>		
4	(D) Pregnant;		
5	(E) A parent or caretaker who is responsible for the care		
6	of a dependent child under four (4) months of age;		
7	(F) A parent or caretaker who is personally providing the		
8	care for a dependent child with a serious medical condition or disability;		
9	(G) Receiving unemployment compensation and in compliance		
10	with work requirements that are part of the unemployment compensation benefit		
11	program; or		
12	(H) Participating in a drug addiction or alcoholic		
13	treatment and rehabilitation program;		
14	(2) "Public housing authority" means a housing authority created		
15	under § 14-169-207; and		
16	(3) "Work requirement" means a requirement that able-bodied		
17	adults are required to do at least one (1) of the following as a condition of		
18	eligibility:		
19	(A) Work an average of twenty (20) hours or more per week;		
20	(B) Participate in and comply with the requirements of a		
21	work program for twenty (20) hours or more per week;		
22	(C) Volunteer at least twenty (20) hours per week;		
23	(D) Meet any combination of working and participating in a		
24	work program for a total of twenty (20) hours or more per week; or		
25	(E) Participate in and comply with the requirements of a		
26	workfare program.		
27	(c)(l) As a condition of being chartered and operating in this state,		
28	a public housing authority shall implement a work requirement for able-bodied		
29	adults in households that receive housing assistance.		
30	(2) To ensure the requirement under subdivision (c)(1) of this		
31	section is met, a public housing authority shall:		
32	(A) Conduct a screening to determine whether each		
33	applicant or tenant in public housing administered by the housing authority		
34	is an able-bodied adult who is compliant with the work requirement;		
35	(B) Create an employability plan for each able-bodied		
36	adult in a household that receives housing assistance consistent with the		

1	work requirement; and			
2	(C) Terminate assistance for any household with an able-			
3	bodied adult who fails to comply with the work requirement within sixty (60)			
4	days of noncompliance with the work requirement.			
5	(d)(1) As a condition of being chartered and operating in this state,			
6	a public housing authority shall operate, among eligible households on a			
7	waiting list for benefits, a housing-authority-wide local preference			
8	prioritizing the admission of a household in which all able-bodied adults in			
9	the household are compliant with the work requirement, whether or not the			
10	able-bodied adult is compliant with a work requirement in another public			
11	assistance program.			
12	(2) Notwithstanding subdivision (d)(1) of this section, a public			
13	housing authority is not required to give priority to a household in which			
14	there are able-bodied adults compliant with a work requirement over a			
15	household in which there are no able-bodied adults subject to a work			
16	requirement.			
17	(e)(1) To the extent necessary to carry out this section under federal			
18	law, each public housing authority shall request federal approval from the			
19	United States Department of Housing and Urban development by January 1, 2025.			
20	(2) If federal approval is denied, each public housing authority			
21	shall resubmit a request for approval within twenty-four (24) months of each			
22	denial.

24	SECTION 3. DO NOT CODIFY. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE</u> . This act is effective on			
25	and after January 1, 2024.
