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28	SECTION 1. Arkan	sas Code § 6-15-2006(a)(1)(B),	concerning an annual
29	reporting of a student's statewide assessment test results, is amended to		
30	read as follows:

32	school district board o	of directors shall report to the	e parent, guardian, or
33	the student, if the student is eighteen (18) years of age or older, the		
34	student's results on ea	ch statewide assessment test.	
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36	SECTION 2. Arkan	sas Code § 6-15-2907(a), concer	rning the implementation

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- of a statewide student assessment system, is amended to read as follows:
- 2 (a) The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education shall implement
- 3 a statewide student assessment system to be administered by Arkansas public
- 4 schools <u>and private schools</u> on a schedule determined by the State Board of
- 5 Education that includes the following components:
- 6 (1) Developmentally appropriate measurements or assessments for 7 kindergarten through grade two (K-2) in literacy and mathematics;
- 8 (2) Assessments to measure English language arts, mathematics,
- 9 and science as identified by the state board;
- 10 (3) Assessments of English proficiency of all English learners;
- 11 and
- 12 (4)(A) Assessments to measure college and career readiness.
- 13 (B) A public school or private school that serves a
- 14 student in grades ten through twelve (10-12) shall administer college and
- 15 career readiness assessments, including a career readiness assessment that
- leads to a nationally recognized work readiness certificate, as determined by
- 17 the state board, to each student before he or she graduates from high school.
- 18 (C) Public school districts may offer additional college
- 19 and career readiness assessments for students in grades ten through twelve
- 20 (10-12) at no cost to the student by using public school district funding,
- 21 including without limitation Enhanced Student Achievement Funding under § 6-
- 22 20-2305.

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- SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-15-2907(d)-(f), concerning requirements
- 25 regarding the statewide student assessment system, are amended to read as
- 26 follows:
- 27 (d) A public school district or private school, at its own expense,
- 28 may assess the academic achievement and growth of students by other means in
- 29 addition to the required statewide student assessment system.
- 30 (e) All students enrolled in a public school district or private
- 31 school shall participate in the statewide student assessment system.
- 32 (f) Public school district boards of directors and private schools
- 33 shall not establish school calendars that limit or interfere with student
- 34 participation in the statewide student assessment system.

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36 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-15-2907(h), concerning requirements

- l regarding the statewide student assessment system, is amended to read as
- 2 follows:
- 3 (h) The division shall provide for statewide student assessments that 4 are:
- 5 (1) Valid and reliable;
- 6 (2) Obtained or developed, as appropriate, through contracts and 7 project agreements;
  - (3) Aligned to the Arkansas academic standards; and
- 9 (4) Scored and returned for public school, and public school
  10 district, and private school use by August 1 of each year.

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- SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 6-15-2907(i)(1), concerning statewide student assessment system security and confidentiality, is amended to read as follows:
- 15 (i)(1) Public schools, <u>public</u> school districts, <u>private schools</u>, and 16 educators shall maintain assessment security and confidentiality.

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- SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 6-15-2907(i)(3), concerning breach of security and confidentiality requirements for the statewide student assessment system, is amended to read as follows:
  - (3) A violation by a public school, a public school district, <u>a</u> <u>private school</u>, or an educator of the security or confidential integrity of any test or assessment may result in action by the state board under  $\S\S$  6-17-410 and 6-17-428 or under the rules promulgated by the state board to implement this subchapter.

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- SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 6-15-2907(1), concerning the analysis and reporting of student performance data, is amended to read as follows:
- 29 (1) Public school districts <u>and private schools</u> shall analyze and 30 report student performance data to students, parents, and the community, if 31 the disclosures are not in conflict with applicable federal law and state 32 law.

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SECTION 8. Arkansas Code § 6-15-2907, concerning the implementation of a statewide student assessment system, is amended to add additional subsections to read as follows:

T	(m) As used in this section, "private school" means a nonpublic school		
2	that:		
3	(1) Offers instruction for students in grades kindergarten		
4	through twelve (K-12) in this state;		
5	(2) Receives any form of state funding in any amount; and		
6	(3) Does not serve exclusively students with disabilities		
7	identified under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. §		
8	1400 et seq., as it existed on January 1, 2023.		
9	(n) A private school student with a disability identified under the		
10	Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. § 1400 et seq., is		
11	exempt from the statewide student testing system requirements under this		
12	section.		
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14	SECTION 9. Arkansas Code § 6-15-2909(a), concerning dissemination of		
15	personally identifiable information with regard to the public availability of		
16	test instruments and scores, is amended to read as follows:		
17	(a) Any material containing the personally identifiable information,		
18	including without limitation identifiable scores, of individual students on		
19	any test taken under the provisions of this subchapter shall not be:		
20	(1) Considered a public record within the meaning of the Freedom		
21	of Information Act of 1967, § 25-19-101 et seq.; or		
22	(2) Disseminated or otherwise made available to the public by a		
23	member of the State Board of Education, an employee of the Division of		
24	Elementary and Secondary Education, a member of the board of directors of a		
25	school district, an employee of a school district, an administrator or		
26	employee of a private school, or any other person, except as permitted under		
27	the provisions of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, 20		
28	U.S.C. § 1232g, as it existed on January 1, 2017.		
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30	SECTION 10. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 18, Subchapter 2, is		
31	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:		
32	6-18-234. Private school — Admittance requirements.		
33	(a) A private school shall admit each student who:		
34	(1) Applies for admission to the private school; and		
35	(2) Intends to use state funds to cover the costs associated		
36	with admittance and attendance at the private school.		

T	(b) As used in this section, "state lunds" shall include without		
2	limitation the use of any form of state funds awarded to a student, includin		
3	without limitation state funds awarded to a student under the following		
4	programs:		
5	(1) The Philanthropic Investment in Arkansas Kids Program Act, §		
6	6-18-2301 et seq.; and		
7	(2) The Succeed Scholarship Program, § 6-41-901 et seq.		
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
