34	appropriated, to the Depar	rtment of Education, to be pay	yable from the Division

APPROPRIATION - EDUCATOR COMPENSATION REFORM PROGRAM. There 9 is hereby appropriated, to the Department of Education, to be payable from 10 the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education Public School Fund 11 Account, for grants and aid to provide additional funding to school districts 12 currently below the statutory minimum teacher salary schedule as defined in 13 Arkansas Code § 6-17-2403(b) and revised by this act of the Department of 14 Education - Educator Compensation Reform Program for the fiscal year ending 15 June 30, 2024, the following: 16 17 ITEM FISCAL YEAR 18 NO. 2023-2024 19 (01) EDUCATOR COMPENSATION REFORM GRANTS 20 AND AID \$30,000,000 21 22 SECTION 4. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ARKANSAS TEACHER RAISES FUNDING. Upon the effective date of this Act, or as soon 24 25 thereafter as practical, the Department of Education shall provide raises to all full-time equivalent teachers in the state as defined by Arkansas Code § 26 27 6-17-2402(3) at the amount of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per full-time equivalent teacher working in a public school district. The Department of 28 29 Education may promulgate rules for the distribution of these funds and shall 30 fully budget, allocate, and expend the total amount necessary to provide the 31 full raise amount of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for each full-time equivalent teacher as defined by Arkansas Code § 6-17-2402(3). 32 33 SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 34 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 35 EDUCATOR COMPENSATION REFORM PROGRAM SUB-FUND. Upon the effective date of this Act, 36

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1	or as soon thereafter as practical, the Arkansas State Treasurer shall
2	transfer thirty million (\$30,000,000) from the Educational Adequacy Fund to
3	the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education Public School Fund Account
4	to be used solely for the implementation of the Educator Compensation Reform
5	Program. Funds shall be kept separate from all other monies in the Division
6	of Elementary and Secondary Education Public School Fund Account in the
7	Educator Compensation Reform Program Sub-Fund and are to be utilized over a
8	one-year period, effective on July 1, 2023 to assist school districts in
9	ensuring that all full-time equivalent educators as defined by Arkansas Code
10	§ 6-17-2402(3) in Arkansas public school districts receive a minimum annual
11	salary of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) by June 30, 2024. The Educator
12	Compensation Reform Sub-Fund shall not be considered part of a school
13	district's net legal balance or net legal balance revenues for the purpose of
14	meeting the requirements on limitation of fund balances pursuant to Arkansas
15	Code § 6-20-2210. The Arkansas Department of Education shall promulgate
16	rules to administer this section.

18	SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 6-17-
19	2402(3), concerning the definition of "teacher" under the Teacher
20	Compensation Program of 2003, is amended to read as follows:
21	(3) "Teacher" means:
22	(A) An individual who is required to hold a teaching license from the
23	Division of Elementary and Secondary Education and who is engaged directly in
24	instruction with students in a classroom setting for more than seventy
25	percent (70%) of the individual's contracted time;
26	(B) A guidance counselor <del>; or</del>
27	(C) A librarian <u>;</u>
28	(D) A curriculum specialist;
29	(E) An instructional facilitator; or
30	(F) Any other full-time employee of a public school district who is
31	not in an administrator or director-level role and who is required to hold a
32	teaching license issued by the State Board of Education as a condition of
33	employment.

35	SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 6-17-

7 SECTION 8. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 8 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 9 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 10 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 11 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 12 13 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 14 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 15 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

17 SECTION 9. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 18 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 19 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 20 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 21 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 22 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 23 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 24 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 25

26 SECTION 10. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 27 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the 28 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2023, is essential to the operation of 29 30 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the 31 32 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2023, could work irreparable harm 33 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental 34 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act 35 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health 36 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2023.

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
