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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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22 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established
23 for the Henderson State University for the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the
24 following maximum number of regular employees.

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29 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for
30 the Henderson State University for the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the following
31 maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra
32 Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: five
33 hundred (500) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay
34 not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation
35 Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

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SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - STATE OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Henderson State University, to be payable from the Henderson State University Fund, for personal services and operating expenses of the Henderson State University for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, the following:

SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - CASH FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Henderson State University, to be payable from cash funds as defined by Arkansas Code 19-4-801, for personal services and operating expenses of the Henderson State University for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, the following:

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10 SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE – CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code Title 6,
 11 Chapter 65, Subchapter 2, is amended to add an additional section to codify
 12 special language in appropriation acts to read as follows:

13 6-65-227. Henderson State University – Community Education Center
 14 funding.

15 Funds allocated by the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas State
 16 University System for the Community Education Center at Henderson State
 17 University shall be used exclusively for:

18 (1) The operation and maintenance of the Community Education
 19 Center; and

20 (2) To teach technical and industrial subjects to citizens and
 21 employers.

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23 SECTION 6. DO NOT CODIFY. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FISCAL
 25 YEAR 2020 BUDGET STABILIZATION LOAN REPAYMENT.

26 (a) It is the intent of this section to provide for the repayment by
 27 Henderson State University of a loan received from the Budget Stabilization
 28 Trust Fund in fiscal year 2020.

29 (b) As repayment for the outstanding loan received from the Budget
 30 Stabilization Trust Fund in fiscal year 2020, Henderson State University
 31 shall make payments of nine hundred fifty-eight thousand three hundred
 32 thirty-three dollars and thirty-three cents (\$958,333.33) from any legal fund
 33 of Henderson State University to the Budget Stabilization Trust Fund on the
 34 following dates unless modifications are made under subsection (d) of this
 35 section:

36 (1) December 1, 2024;

1 (2) December 1, 2025;

2 (3) December 1, 2026;

3 (4) December 1, 2027;

4 (5) December 1, 2028; and

5 (6) December 1, 2029.

6 (c) Henderson State University shall provide a report to the
7 Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in regular, fiscal, or
8 extraordinary session, the Joint Budget Committee, no later than June 30 of
9 each year regarding the status of the loan received from the Budget
10 Stabilization Trust Fund.

11 (d)(1) Loan payments under subsection (b) of this section may be
12 modified by the Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in
13 regular, fiscal, or extraordinary session, the Joint Budget Committee, based
14 upon its review of the status of the loan received from the Budget
15 Stabilization Trust Fund.

16 (2) A modification to a loan payment under subdivision (2)(A) of
17 this section may include without limitation:

18 (A) The amount of one (1) or more loan payments; and

19 (B) The timing of one (1) or more loan payments.

20 (e) This section shall expire upon the final payment by Henderson
21 State University to the Budget Stabilization Trust Fund under subsection (b)
22 of this section.

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24 SECTION 7. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
25 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
26 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
27 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
28 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
29 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditure Restriction
30 Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where
31 applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and
32 Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in
33 disbursement of said funds.

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35 SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
36 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations

1 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
2 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
3 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
4 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
5 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
6 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
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8 SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
9 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
10 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
11 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2023 is essential to the operation of
12 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
13 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
14 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2023 could work irreparable harm
15 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
16 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
17 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
18 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2023.
