9	AN ACT TO OFFER TRAUMATIC EVENT LICENSED COUNSELING
10	FOR PUBLIC SAFETY EMPLOYEES; TO ENSURE COVERAGE OF
11	TRAUMATIC EVENT LICENSED COUNSELING FOR PUBLIC SAFETY
12	EMPLOYEES; TO REQUIRE A STUDY OF AVAILABILITY FOR
13	PEER SUPPORT ACCESS FOR VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS; AND
14	FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

18	TO OFFER AND ENSURE COVERAGE OF TRAUMATIC
19	EVENT LICENSED COUNSELING FOR PUBLIC
20	SAFETY EMPLOYEES; AND TO REQUIRE A STUDY
21	OF AVAILABILITY FOR PEER SUPPORT ACCESS
22	FOR VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS.
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25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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27	SECTION 1. DO NOT CODIFY. <u>Traumatic event licensed counseling for</u>
28	<pre>public safety employees - Exceptions - Definitions.</pre>
29	(a) As used in this section:
30	(1) "Firefighter" means:
31	(A) A paid, full-time member of a fire department or
32	firefighting unit of a city of the first class, city of the second class,
33	fire protection district, or an incorporated town or an unincorporated rural
34	area of this state who actively engages in the fighting of fires on a regular
35	<u>basis; or</u>
36	(B) A paid, full-time instructor of the Arkansas Fire

1	Training Academy or a member of the firefighting organization of the Arkansas
2	National Guard Robinson Maneuver Training Center or of the Arkansas National
3	Guard Fort Chaffee Joint Maneuver Training Center;
4	(2) "Licensed counseling" means counseling provided by a
5	licensed mental health professional;
6	(3) "Licensed mental health professional" means a licensed
7	individual who:
8	(A) Specializes in trauma and crisis;
9	(B) Uses evidence-based treatment options; and
10	(C) Is one (1) of the following:
11	(i) A psychiatrist;
12	(ii) A psychologist;
13	(iii) A mental health professional who holds either
14	a master's or doctoral degree related to the mental health profession;
15	(iv) A mental health nurse practitioner or mental
16	health clinical nurse who is:
17	(a) A registered nurse licensed and certified
18	by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing as an advanced practice nurse; and
19	(b) Working within the scope of practice as
20	authorized by law; or
21	(v) A psychiatric physician assistant who is working
22	under the supervision of a licensed physician;
23	<pre>(4) "Police officer" means:</pre>
24	(A) A paid, full-time law enforcement officer engaged in
25	official duty who is a member of:
26	(i) A regular police force;
27	(ii) The Division of Arkansas State Police; or
28	(iii) The law enforcement organization of the:
29	(a) Arkansas National Guard Robinson Maneuver
30	Training Center; or
31	(b) Arkansas National Guard Fort Chaffee Joint
32	Maneuver Training Center;
33	(B) A paid, full-time sheriff or deputy sheriff of a
34	county of this state who is engaged in official duty; or
35	(C) A paid, full-time constable or night marshal of a town
36	of this state who is engaged in official duty;

1	(5) "Public safety employee" means a public employee who is:
2	(A) A member of a state-supported retirement system;
3	(B) A probation officer, surveillance officer, or juvenile
4	detention officer employed by this state or a political subdivision of this
5	state;
6	(C) A firefighter; or
7	(D) A police officer; and
8	(6) "Traumatic event" means an individual's direct exposure in
9	the line of duty to an incident involving:
10	(A) The extraordinary traumatic bodily injury or death of
11	a person;
12	(B) The serious injury, death, abuse, or exploitation of a
13	minor;
14	(C) An immediate threat to the life of the individual or
15	another person; or
16	(D) A mass casualties event.
17	(b)(1) A public employer that employs a public safety employee shall
18	provide coverage for licensed counseling for a public safety employee who
19	experiences a traumatic event while in the course of duty.
20	(2)(A) The coverage under subdivision (b)(1) shall allow for up
21	to twelve (12) licensed counseling visits.
22	(B) The public employer shall pay for the licensed
23	counseling visits.
24	(C) The licensed counseling visits may be provided through
25	telehealth.
26	(c) Payment by a public employer for licensed counseling under this
27	section does not create a presumption that a claim is compensable under §§
28	11-9-113 or 11-9-114.
29	(d)(1) A public employer that provides coverage under subdivision
30	(b)(1) of this section shall ensure that the following data is compiled as
31	part of the coverage:
32	(A) The number of public safety employees who have
33	participated in licensed counseling;
34	(B) The average number of visits of licensed counseling
35	per public safety employee;
36	(C) The average number of months that a public safety

1	employee participated in licensed counseling;
2	(D) The average number of days that a public safety
3	employee who participated in licensed counseling missed work;
4	(E)(i) The total number of public safety employees who
5	participated in licensed counseling and who subsequently filed a workers'
6	compensation claim.
7	(ii) The data compiled under subdivision
8	(d)(l)(E)(i) of this section shall include the number of claims that were
9	approved and the number of claims that were denied; and
10	(F) For each public employer:
11	(i) The total amount of work missed by public safety
12	employees who participated in licensed counseling; and
13	(ii) How missed work was accounted for by the public
14	employer or through employee benefits.
15	(2) In implementing subdivision (d)(1) of this section, a public
16	employer shall not compile and report data that is protected under the Health
17	Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, Pub. L. No. 104-191.
18	(e)(l)(A) A public employer shall allow a public safety employee
19	to select the public safety employee's own licensed mental health
20	professional.
21	(B) However, if a licensed mental health professional
22	declines to provide licensed counseling under this section, then the public
23	employer is not required to secure the services of that licensed mental
24	health professional under subdivision $(e)(1)(A)$ of this section.
25	(2) The public employer shall pay the licensed mental health
26	professional subject to the deductibles and conditions under the public
27	safety employee's current health benefit plan.
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29	SECTION 2. DO NOT CODIFY. Study of availability of peer support
30	access and licensed counseling for volunteer firefighters — Legislative
31	<u>findings - Reporting requirements - Definitions.</u>
32	(a) As used in this section:
33	(1) "Licensed counseling" means counseling provided by a
34	licensed mental health professional;
35	(2) "Licensed mental health professional" means a licensed
36	individual who:

1	(A) Specializes in trauma and crisis;
2	(B) Uses evidence-based treatment options; and
3	(C) Is one (1) of the following:

29	(B) Receives less than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) in
30	total compensation during the taxable year from the volunteer fire department
31	or firefighting unit that the volunteer firefighter services.
32	(b) The General Assembly finds that:
33	(1) Volunteer firefighters provide a valuable and important
34	service to the citizens and communities in this state by participating in a
35	firefighting unit that actively engages in fire suppression, rescue, pump
36	operation, or other firefighting activities;

1	(2) Volunteer lirelighters may experience traumatic events that
2	experience and training has not adequately prepared the volunteer
3	firefighters to handle and address in a healthy way;
4	(3) A volunteer firefighter who experiences a traumatic event
5	should have access to licensed counseling and other available resources;
6	(4) Coverage for licensed counseling should be made available to
7	a volunteer firefighter who experiences a traumatic event; and
8	(5) In order to demonstrate the effectiveness of licensed
9	counseling for volunteer firefighters and benefits or difficulties in the
10	providing coverage for licensed counseling to volunteer firefighters,
11	additional data is needed.
12	(c) The State Fire Prevention Commission with the cooperation of local
13	governments interested in participating shall study the availability of peer
14	support access and licensed counseling for volunteer firefighters to evaluate
15	the viability and sustainability of providing coverage for licensed
16	counseling and peer support access for volunteer firefighters.
17	(d) The study under subsection (c) of this section shall include:
18	(1) Evaluating possible ways to fund coverage for licensed
19	counseling for a traumatic event for volunteer firefighters; and
20	(2) Developing recommendations for potential legislation that is
21	necessary to implement coverage for licensed counseling for volunteer
22	<u>firefighters.</u>
23	(e) A report summarizing the results of the study under this section
24	shall be filed with the Legislative Council no later than July 1, 2024.
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26	SECTION 3. DO NOT CODIFY. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE</u> . <u>Section 1 of this act is</u>
27	effective January 1, 2024.
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29	SECTION 4. DO NOT CODIFY. Expiration. This act expires January 1,
30	2025, unless extended by the General Assembly.
