7	every two (2) years to principals, guidance counselors, teachers, and other		
8	relevant school personnel with direct contact and supervision of children on		
9	the recognition of signs and symptoms of seizures and the appropriate steps		
10	for seizure first aid.		
11	(e)(1) Any training programs or guidelines adopted by any state agency		
12	for the training of school personnel in the healthcare needs of any student		
13	diagnosed with a seizure disorder shall be fully consistent with training		
14	programs and guidelines developed by the Epilepsy Foundation of America or		
15	any successor organization.		
16	(2) Notwithstanding any state agency requirement or other law to		
17	the contrary, for the purposes of training under subdivision (e)(l) of this		
18	section, a school district may use any adequate and appropriate training		
19	programs or guidelines for training of school personnel in the seizure		
20	disorder protocols covered under this section.		
21	(f) Before a seizure rescue medication can be administered to a		
22	student to treat seizure disorder symptoms, the student's parent or legal		
23	guardian shall:		
24	(1) Provide the school with written authorization to administer		
25	the medication at school;		
26	(2) Provide a written statement from the student's healthcare		
27	provider that shall contain the following information:		
28	(A) The student's name;		
29	(B) The name and purpose of the medication;		
30	(C) The prescribed dosage;		
31	(D) The route of administration;		
32	(E) The frequency that the medication should be		
33	administered; and		
34	(F) The circumstances under which the medication should be		
35	administered;		
36	(3)(A) Provide the prescribed medication to the school in its		

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1	unopened, sealed package with the label affixed by the dispensing pharmacy
2	intact.
3	(B) The school shall store the medication under
4	subdivision (f)(3)(A) of this section in a safe and secure location
5	accessible only by school personnel or volunteers with training to administer
6	seizure medication; and
7	(4) Collaborate with school personnel to create a seizure action
8	plan.
9	(g) The written authorization, written statement, and seizure action
10	plan required in subdivision (f) of this section shall be:
11	(1) Kept on file in the office of the school nurse or school
12	administrator; and
13	(2) Distributed to any school personnel or volunteers
14	responsible for the supervision or care of the student.
15	(h) The written authorization for the administration of seizure rescue
16	medications provided for in subdivision (f)(1) of this section is effective
17	for the school year in which it is granted and may be renewed each following
18	school year upon fulfilling the requirements of subsections (f) and (g) of
19	this section.
20	(i) This section shall apply only to a school that has a student
21	enrolled who has a seizure disorder and has a seizure rescue medication or
22	other medication prescribed by the student's healthcare provider to treat
23	seizure disorder symptoms approved by the United States Food and Drug
24	Administration or any successor agency.
25	(j) The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education may promulgate
26	rules for the development and implementation of the seizure education program
27	and the procedures for the development and content of seizure action plans.
28	(k)(l)(A) A school employee may not be subject to any disciplinary
29	proceeding resulting from an action taken in compliance with this section.
30	(B) Any employee acting in accordance with the provisions
31	of this act is immune from civil liability unless the actions of the employee
32	rise to a level of reckless or intentional misconduct.
33	(2) A school nurse is not responsible for or subject to
34	disciplinary action for actions performed by a volunteer.
35	(1) Each public school shall provide an age-appropriate seizure
36	education program to all students on seizures and seizure disorders

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1	consistent with training programs and guidelines developed by the Epilepsy
2	Foundation of America and any successor organization.
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
