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27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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29	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-85-204(3), concerning the definition of
30	an "approved institution of higher education" under the Arkansas Academic
31	Challenge Scholarship Program, is amended to read as follows:
32	(3)(A) "Approved institution of higher education" means an
33	institution of higher education approved by the division to participate in
34	the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program and that is:
35	(A)(i) A state-supported two-year or four-year college or
36	university;



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1	(B)(ii) A private, nonprofit two-year or four-year college
2	or university with its primary headquarters located in Arkansas that is
3	eligible to receive Title IV federal student aid funds; or
4	(C)(iii) An approved school of nursing, subject to the
5	provisions of § 6-85-213(c);
6	(iv)(a) A public or private vocational-technical school.
7	(b) A public or private vocational-technical
8	school shall be bonded and insured; or
9	(v)(a) A public or private technical institute.
10	(b) A public or private technical institute
11	shall be bonded and insured.
12	(B) An approved institution of higher education that is a
13	private, nonprofit two-year or four-year college or university shall be
14	eligible to receive Title IV federal student aid funds;
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16	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 85, Subchapter 2, is amended
17	to add an additional section to read as follows:

20	(a) An applicant for a scholarship under this subchapter who has
21	applied to or is currently enrolled in a public or private vocational-
22	technical school or a public or private technical institute shall, in
23	addition to the relevant eligibility requirements under this subchapter, be
24	accepted for admission in a program of study that leads to an associate
25	degree or a certificate program in one (1) of the following high-demand
26	<u>fields:</u>
27	(1) Industry;
28	(2) Health care; or
29	(3) Information technology.
30	(b) The Division of Higher Education shall file annually by November 1
31	a report to the Legislative Council in the manner and format that the
32	Legislative Council requires regarding:
33	(1) All state-supported student financial assistance awarded by

2	Annually by November 1, the Division of Higher Education shall report

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8	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 6-85-402(1), concerning the definition of
9	"approved institution of higher education" under the Arkansas Concurrent
10	Challenge Scholarship Program, is amended to read as follows:
11	(1)(A) "Approved institution of higher education" means an
12	institution of higher education that:
13	(A)<u>(</u>) Is approved by the Division of Higher Education to
14	participate in the Arkansas Concurrent Challenge Scholarship Program;
15	(B)(ii) Offers at least a fifty-percent discount on the
16	tuition and mandatory fees of an endorsed concurrent enrollment course or
17	certificate program to a student who is enrolled in an endorsed concurrent

17	admission in a program of study that leads to an associate degree or a
18	certificate program in one (1) of the following high-demand fields:
19	(1) Industry;
20	(2) Health care; or
21	(3) Information technology.
22	(b) The Division of Higher Education shall file annually by November 1
23	a report to the Legislative Council in the manner and format that the
24	Legislative Council requires regarding:
25	(1) All state-supported student financial assistance awarded by
26	the division under this section to students enrolled in vocational-technical

28	(2) The permissible high-demand fields under subsection (a) of
