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27	SECTION 1. Arka	nsas Code Title 20, Chapter 13, Subch	napter l, is
28	amended to add an addi	tional section to read as follows:

31	(a) This section	n shall be known and may be cited as	the "Vincent Parks
32	Law".		
33	(b) As used in	this section:	
34	<u>(1) "Cade</u>	t" means a law enforcement cadet, a f	firefighter cadet
35	or trainee, or a train	ee to be an uniformed employee for th	ne Arkansas State
36	Game and Fish Commissi	on;	

1	(2) "Instructor" means a physical fitness instructor for the		
2	purpose of physical fitness, including a law enforcement instructor,		
3	firefighter instructor, or an instructor for the Arkansas State Game and Fish		
4	Commission at any location; and		
5	(3) "Officer" means a law enforcement officer, firefighter, or		
6	uniformed employee for the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission.		
7	(c) An instructor shall complete training and receive a certification		
8	on the recognition and management of the following events or conditions that		
9	may be encountered by a person:		
10	(1) A concussion, dehydration, or other health emergency;		
11	(2) An environmental issue that threatens the health or safety		
12	of a person, including without limitation heat exhaustion; and		
13	(3) A sudden cardiac arrest, including the nature and warning		
14	signs of a sudden cardiac arrest and the risks associated with continuing to		
15	participate or engage in physical activity when experiencing any of the		
16	<pre>following symptoms:</pre>		
17	(A) Fainting or seizures during physical activity;		
18	(B) Unexplained shortness of breath;		
19	(C) Chest pain;		
20	(D) Dizziness;		
21	(E) Racing heart beat; or		
22	(F) Extreme fatigue.		
23	(d) An instructor shall maintain certification under subsection (c) of		
24	this section.		
25	(e)(1) If a cadet or officer receiving training from an instructor		
26	faints or loses consciousness while participating in or immediately following		
27	a physical activity, the instructor shall remove the cadet or officer from		
28	participation in the physical activity at that time.		
29	(2) If a cadet or officer exhibits any symptom described in		
30	subdivision (c)(3) of this section while participating in or immediately		
31	following a physical activity and an instructor reasonably believes that the		
32	symptom is cardiac-related, the instructor may remove the cadet or officer		
33	from participation in the physical activity at that time.		
34	(3) A cadet or officer who is removed from participation in a		
35	physical activity shall not be permitted to return to participation in a		
36	physical activity until the cadet or officer is evaluated and cleared for		

1	return to participation in writing by a physician licensed in this state.
2	(4) An instructor acting in good faith under this subsection is
3	not liable for any act or omission unless the act or omission is intentional,
4	reckless, or grossly negligent.
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6	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
7	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that instructors do not currently
8	have training or certification regarding concussions, dehydration,
9	environmental issues that threaten the health or safety of a person, or
10	sudden cardiac arrests; that in the past year, a cadet died due to this lack
11	of education on health conditions; that without immediate action, cadets or
12	officers who are required to receive training will be in danger of having
13	instructors without education or training on these serious conditions; and
14	that this act is immediately necessary to protect the health and safety of
15	cadets and officers who are required to receive training from these
16	instructors. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being
17	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and
18	safety shall become effective on:
19	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
20	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
21	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
22	bill; or
23	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
24	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
