29	(a) Upon the peti	tion of a student residing in one	(1) school

2	(c)(l) A transfer petition received by a school district under this
3	section shall be placed on the agenda of the next regular monthly meeting of
4	the school district board of directors, unless otherwise provided by this
5	section.
6	(2) At least five (5) days before a regular monthly meeting of a
7	school district board of directors, the superintendent of the school district
8	shall notify the school district board of directors regarding:
9	(A) All transfer petitions received under this section;
10	and
11	(B)(i) The superintendent's recommendation concerning each
12	transfer petition received under this section.
13	(ii) If a student's transfer petition is recommended
14	by a school district superintendent for denial, the school district
15	superintendent shall provide a written explanation of the reasons for the
16	recommendation to the:
17	(a) School district board of directors; and
18	(b) Parent, legal guardian, or person standing
19	in loco parentis to the student.
20	(3) Each transfer petition received by a school district under
21	this section and placed on the agenda of a school district board of directors
22	as required under subdivision (c)(l) of this section shall:
23	(A) Be considered individually; and
24	(B) Receive a separate vote by the school district board
25	<u>of directors.</u>
26	(4) A parent, legal guardian, or person standing in loco
27	parentis to a student who submits a petition for a transfer under this
28	section shall be given at least five (5) minutes to present the student's
29	case for a transfer to a school district board of directors.
30	(5)(A) A school district board of directors may adopt a
31	resolution that delegates its authority to approve a petition for a transfer
32	received under this section to:
33	(i) The school district superintendent; or
34	(ii) An individual member of the school district

1	(g)<u>(</u>h) Student <u>petitions for</u> transfers granted under the provisions of
2	this section shall be reviewed at the end of four (4) years by the <u>school</u>
3	districts involved to determine whether the <u>a tuition</u> agreement, if one
4	exists, should be renewed.
5	(h)(i) Student petitions for transfers granted under this section
6	constitute an independent agreement between the resident district and the
7	receiving district and are not subject to the provisions and limitations of
8	other student transfer laws.
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
