2	(c)(1) A transfer petition received by a school district under this		
3	section shall be placed on the agenda of the next regular monthly meeting of		
4	the school district board of directors or a specially called meeting of the		
5	school district board of directors, whichever occurs first, unless otherwise		
6	provided by this section.		
7	(2) At least five (5) days before a regular monthly meeting of a		
8	school district board of directors or a specially called meeting of a school		
9	district board of directors, whichever occurs first, the superintendent of		
10	the school district shall notify the school district board of directors		
11	regarding:		
12	(A) All transfer petitions received under this section;		
13	<u>and</u>		
14	(B)(i) The superintendent's recommendation concerning each		
15	transfer petition received under this section.		
16	(ii) If a student's transfer petition is recommended		
17	by a school district superintendent for denial, the school district		
18	superintendent shall provide a written explanation of the reasons for the		
19	recommendation to the:		
20	(a) School district board of directors; and		
21	(b) Parent, legal guardian, or person standing		
22	in loco parentis to the student.		
23	(3) Each transfer petition received by a school district under		
24	this section and placed on the agenda of a school district board of directors		
25	as required under subdivision (c)(l) of this section shall:		
26	(A) Be considered individually; and		
27	(B) Receive a separate vote by the school district board		
28	of directors.		
29	(4) A parent, legal guardian, or person standing in loco		
30	parentis to a student who submits a petition for a transfer under this		
31	section shall be given at least five (5) minutes to present the student's		
32	case for a transfer to a school district board of directors.		
33	(5)(A) A school district board of directors may adopt a		
34	resolution that delegates its authority to approve a petition for a transfer

9	appeal the decision of the school district board of directors to the State

14	transfers shall be filed by the receiving district with the office:		
15	(1) Office of the county clerk, with the administrative;		
16	(2) Administrative offices of the respective school districts;

20	district to another places:		
21	(1) Places the responsibility for the education of the student		
22	on the receiving district; and <del>permits</del>		
23	(2) Permits the receiving district to count these children in $\underline{a}$		
24	student who transfers under this section for purposes of average daily		
25	membership for state aid purposes.		
26	$\frac{(e)(f)}{(f)}$ This section does not transfer the local tax money from the <u>a</u>		
27	resident district.		
28	$\frac{(f)(1)(g)(1)}{(g)(g)}$ Upon approval of the a petition to transfer by the a		
29	resident district, the receiving district may also enter into a tuition		
30	agreement with either the resident district or the <del>parents of the child or</del>		
31	children parent, legal guardian, or person standing in loco parentis to the		
32	transferring student involved whereby the resident district or the parents		
33	parent, legal guardian, or person standing in loco parentis to the		
34	transferring student will make tuition payments to the receiving district to		
35	compensate the <u>receiving</u> district for local taxes not received on behalf of		
36	the <del>child or children involved</del> <u>transferring student</u> .		

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1	(2) The annual amount of the tuition shall not exceed the		
2	average amount of local property tax per pupil collected in the receiving		
3	district in the preceding year.		
4	(g)(h) Student petitions for transfers granted under the provisions of		
5	this section shall be reviewed at the end of four (4) years by the ${ m school}$		
6	districts involved to determine whether the a tuition agreement, if one		
7	exists, should be renewed.		
8	(h)(i) Student petitions for transfers granted under this section		
9	constitute an independent agreement between the resident district and the		
10	receiving district and are not subject to the provisions and limitations of		
11	other student transfer laws.
