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     the same office and a higher number than any other person If there are more
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     than two (2) candidates for election as a member of the Senate or the House
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     of Representatives of the General Assembly at any general election held in
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     this state and no candidate for the Senate or the House of Representatives of
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     the General Assembly receives a majority of the votes cast for the office,
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     the names of the two (2) candidates receiving the highest number of votes for
     any legislative or executive the office, except those offices named in
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     Arkansas Constitution, Article 6, § 3, and constables, shall be certified to
     a special runoff election which shall be held four (4) weeks from the day on

     which the general election is held.
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                 (2) The special runoff election shall be conducted in the same
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     manner as is now provided by law, and the election results thereof shall be
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     canvassed and certified in the manner provided by law.
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                 (3) If at the conclusion of the special runoff election the two
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     (2) candidates for election as a member of the Senate or the House of
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     Representatives of the General Assembly have an equal number of votes, the
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     State Board of Election Commissioners shall determine the winner of the
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     special runoff election by lot at an open public meeting and in the presence
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     of the two (2) candidates.

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3	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 7-5-705(a), concerning votes for		
4	constitutional officers, is amended to read as follows:		
5	(a) During the first week of the session after each election for		
6	Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Treasurer of State,		
7	Auditor of State, and Attorney General, and Commissioner of State Lands, and		
8	in the presence of both houses of the General Assembly, the Speaker of the		
9	House of Representatives shall open and publish the votes cast and given for		
10	each of the respective officers previously mentioned.		
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
