- 3 (3) To the sales of those drugs commonly known as "grocers' 4 drugs" in original packages when put up under the direction of a licensed 5 pharmacist of this or some other state; or
- 6 (4) To the sale or shipping of antibiotics and microbials for
 7 veterinary medical use directly from a wholesaler, distributor, pharmacy, or
 8 farm store to a client if the veterinary drugs and medicine are dispensed
 9 based only on a prescription of a licensed veterinarian who has an existing
 10 veterinary-client-patient relationship with the client.

- 12 SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the United States Food and 13 Drug Administration has issued guidance that as of June 2023 all medically 14 15 important antibiotics that were previously available over the counter shall require a prescription from a veterinarian for legal use in animals; that it 16 17 is possible that some of the antibiotics may include common antibiotics and 18 microbials used in the production of livestock and feed, as authorized under 19 the Veterinary Feed Directive issued by the United States Food and Drug 20 Administration; that stores across this state that specialize in agricultural needs, including those that produce livestock for human consumption, may be 21 22 prohibited from the sale of these antibiotics for animals if an exemption to 23 the licensure of a pharmacist or pharmacy is not provided in state law; and that this act is immediately necessary to ensure this state maintains access 24 25 to antibiotics that were previously available over the counter for animals to avoid any issues in food production in this state. Therefore, an emergency is 26 27 declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective 28 29 on:
 - (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
- 31 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
- 32 <u>the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the</u>
- 33 bill; or
- 34 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is 35 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
