- 2 (2) A county that chooses to hand-count paper ballots shall be
- $\frac{1}{2}$ eligible to receive the amount of reimbursement as if the county performed a
- 4 machine tabulation of the votes.
- 5 (h) The county board of election commissioners of any county that
- 6 chooses to use hand count paper ballots instead of approved voting machines
- 7 shall be responsible for compliance with § 7-5-311 and with the Equal Access
- 8 to Voting Rights Act, Pub. L. No. 98-435, the Americans with Disabilities
- 9 Act, Title II of Pub. L. No. 101-336, and the Help America Vote Act of 2002,
- 10 Pub. L. No. 107-252 regarding the accessibility of voting locations for
- ll voters with disabilities.
- 12 <u>(i) Each paper ballot to be hand counted shall contain a watermark on</u>
- 13 the ballot with a unique placement of the watermark for each election cycle.

- SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 7-5-602(b) and (c), concerning ballots,
- 16 number of ballots, marking devices, spoiled ballots, and official ballots,
- 17 are amended to read as follows:
- 18 (b) A ballot shall not be received or counted in any election to which
- 19 this subchapter applies unless it is <u>approved and</u> provided by the county
- 20 board of election commissioners under this section.
- 21 (c) At all elections in counties that use paper ballots and in which
- 22 those ballots are counted by hand, the ballots shall:
- 23 (1) First be marked using permanent ink; and
- 24 (2)(A) Be run through an electronic vote tabulation device
- 25 <u>before a hand count is conducted.</u>
- 26 (B)(i) The requirement under subdivision (c)(2)(A) of this
- 27 section shall be required in the general election and the preferential
- 28 primary election.
- 29 <u>(ii) If an election, other than the general election</u>
- 30 or the preferential primary election, involves less than five thousand
- 31 (5,000) registered voters, the requirement under subdivision (c)(2)(A) of
- 32 this section is optional.

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- 34 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 7-5-603 is amended to read as follows:
- 35 7-5-603. Counting paper ballots at the polling site.
- When paper ballots are to be counted at the polling site, the following

- procedures shall be followed:
- 2 (1)(A) In counting the paper ballots, the ballot box shall be
- 3 opened and each paper ballot shall be counted in turn or by counting by
- 4 offices and issues by first being run through a tabulation device before any
- 5 hand count is conducted.
- 6 (B) The poll workers shall witness the counting of the
- 7 paper ballots and shall keep separate tally lists of the votes cast for each
- 8 candidate or issue on the paper ballot by precinct.
- 9 (C) The tabulated results shall be posted at each polling
- 10 site prior to the completion of the hand count of the paper ballots;
- 11 (2)(A) After being run through a tabulation device, the paper
- 12 <u>ballots shall be placed in a sealed double-locking hard shell ballot box for</u>
- 13 transport to the designated hand count location.
- 14 (B) Each county board of election commissioners shall
- 15 designate the hand count location thirty (30) days before an election.
- 16 (C) A minimum of two (2) election officials shall
- 17 transport the paper ballots to the hand count location.
- 18 (D) All results from voting machines used for compliance
- 19 with the Equal Access to Voting Rights Act, Pub. L. No. 98-435, the Americans
- 20 with Disabilities Act, Title II of Pub. L. No. 101-336, and the Help America
- 21 Vote Act of 2002, Pub. L. No. 107-252 shall be counted with the hand-counted
- 22 paper ballots.
- 23 (E) All paper ballots shall be stored in a secure location
- 24 approved by the county board of election commissioners when not in use by a
- 25 poll worker performing the hand count of the paper ballots;
- 26 (3)(A) When two (2) or more paper ballots are found folded
- 27 together, it shall be considered as conclusive evidence the paper ballots are
- 28 fraudulent and neither of the paper ballots shall be counted.
- 29 (B) If a paper ballot is found to contain marks for more
- 30 than the maximum allowable number of candidates in any one (1) contest, the
- 31 contest shall be considered overvoted, and it shall be the responsibility of
- 32 the poll workers to determine the voter's intent;
- 33 $\frac{(3)(A)}{(4)}(4)(A)$ Upon the close of the polls, the poll workers
- 34 immediately shall certify and attest the list of voters and continue the
- 35 count to completion.
- 36 (B)(i) A hand count of paper ballots shall be completed a

I	minimum of twenty-four (24) hours before the certification deadline.		
2	(ii) If the hand count of paper ballots is not		
3	completed a minimum of twenty-four (24) hours before the certification		
4	deadline, the machine tabulated results under subdivision (1) of this section		
5	shall be the certified results of the election.		
6	(C)(i) If a poll worker becomes sick or incapacitated from		
7	any other cause, the remaining poll workers shall continue the count until it		
8	is completed.		
9	(ii) The county board of election commissioners		
10	shall ensure there is a minimum of four (4) poll workers available to		
11	continue the count.		
12	(D) All hand-count paper ballot totals shall be recorded		
13	by race in each precinct, and posted at the designated hand-count location		
14	upon the completion of the hand count of the paper ballots;		
15	(5) A minimum of two (2) poll workers are required to verify the		
16	vote on each hand-counted paper ballot;		
17	$\frac{(4)(6)}{(6)}$ After the count is completed, the poll workers shall make		
18	out the certificates of election in triplicate and immediately post one (1)		
19	copy outside the polling site; and		
20	(5)(A)(7)(A)(i) The counting of paper ballots shall be open to		
21	the public.		
22	(ii) The public shall maintain a distance of three		
23	(3) feet from the poll workers counting the paper ballots.		
24	(iii) If sufficient room to maintain a distance of		
25	three (3) feet from the poll workers counting the paper ballots may not be		
26	achieved, the candidate, the candidate's designated or authorized		
27	representative, and designated or authorized representatives of the political		
28	parties shall be given priority viewing by the county board of election		
29	<pre>commissioners.</pre>		
30	(B) Any candidate or political party may be present in		
31	person or by representative designated in writing under $\$$ 7-5-312 at the		
32	count of the paper ballots in any election for the purpose of determining		
33	whether or not the <u>paper</u> ballots in any election precinct are fairly and		
34	accurately counted.		
35	(C) The candidate in person or an authorized		

representative of the candidate or political party shall be permitted, upon a

- 1 request's being made to a poll worker, to inspect any or all paper ballots 2 after the paper ballots have been counted. 3 4 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 7-5-701(a)(3)(A), concerning the 5 declaration of results, and certification, delivery, and custody of returns, 6 is amended to read as follows: 7 (3)(A) As results are received and tabulated on election night 8 for all state and federal elections, the county board of election 9 commissioners shall declare preliminary and unofficial results of the 10 election as soon as early voting, absentee, or individual precinct results 11 are tabulated within twenty-four (24) hours after polls close on election 12 night and immediately shall transmit the results by precinct to the Secretary 13 of State through the election night reporting interface provided by the 14 Secretary of State. 15 16 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 7-5-701(a)(3)(C), concerning the 17 declaration of results, and certification, delivery, and custody of returns, 18 is amended to read as follows: 19 (C) On election night for all state and federal elections, 20 immediately after the count of the vote is complete within twenty-four (24) 21 hours after polls close on election night, the county board of election 22 commissioners shall: 23 (i) Declare preliminary and unofficial results of 24 the election, including a statement of the number of outstanding: 25 (a) Ballots of voters who requested ballots 26 under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act, 52 U.S.C. § 27 20301 et seq.; and 28 (b) Provisional ballots; and 29 (ii) Immediately transmit the results by precinct to the Secretary of State through the election night reporting interface 30 31 provided by the Secretary of State. 32 33 SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 7-5-702(a), concerning the preservation of 34 ballots, stubs, certificates, and other election material, is amended to read
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(a) After the election has been finally certified by the county board

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as follows:

- 1 of election commissioners, the county board of election commissioners shall
- 2 retain the custody of and safely keep in a sealed container appropriately
- 3 marked in a secure location in the county courthouse or other county storage
- 4 facility all ballots, ballot stubs, and certificates returned to it from the
- 5 several precincts for a period of twenty (20) days, after which time the
- 6 ballots and certificates shall be stored in a secure location in the county
- 7 courthouse or other county storage facility for a period of two (2) four (4)
- 8 years from the date of the election, unless the county board of election
- 9 commissioners shall be sooner notified in writing that:
- 10 (1) The election of some person voted for at the election and
- 11 declared to have been elected has been contested;
- 12 (2) Criminal prosecution has begun before a tribunal of competent
- 13 jurisdiction against any officer of election or person voting thereat for any
- 14 fraud in the election; or
- 15 (3) The results of the election will be audited by the State
- 16 Board of Election Commissioners under § 7-4-121.

- 18 SECTION 7. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
- 19 Assembly of the State of Arkansas that sufficient laws to ensure the
- 20 integrity of paper ballot elections do not currently exist; that this act is
- 21 immediately necessary to establish adequate guidelines and requirements to
- 22 ensure that elections conducted by paper ballot are safe and secure and to
- 23 fortify the integrity of each and every election conducted within the State
- 24 of Arkansas; that adequate guidelines are required to ensure elections
- 25 <u>conducted by paper ballots accommodate disabled Arkansas citizens and are in</u>
- 26 compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act; and that the
- 27 preservation of safe and secure elections is necessary to preserve the public
- 28 peace, health and safety. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and
- 29 this act being immediately necessary to preserve the public peace, health and
- 30 <u>safety shall become effective on:</u>
- 31 <u>(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;</u>
- 32 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
- 33 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the

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- 34 bill; or
- 35 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
- 36 <u>overridden</u>, the date the last house overrides the veto.
