(2) The withdrawal of prescription drug samples for free distribution from a stock or inventory, whether located within or outside the State of Arkansas, is exempt from the tax imposed by this chapter. (b) The Secretary of the Department of Finance and Administration shall adopt such appropriate rules as the secretary deems necessary to assume the effective and efficient administration of the exemption provided for in this section and to prevent abuse thereof. (c) As used in this section: (1) "Healthcare professional" means a physician, a dentist, a podiatrist, an osteopath, a physician assistant, a nurse practitioner, an advanced practice registered nurse, a pharmacist, and any other medical professional who has prescriptive authority; and (2) "Over-the-counter drug" means a drug that contains a label that identifies the product as a drug as required by 21 C.F.R. § 201.66, as it existed on January 1, 2023, and that includes: (A) A "Drug Facts" panel; or (B) A statement of the "active ingredient(s)" with a list of those ingredients contained in the compound, substance, or preparation. SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. Section 1 of this act is effective on the first day of the calendar quarter following the effective date of this act.
