25	(a) This section sh	nall be known and may be cited	as the "Right to Play

27	(b) The General Ass	sembly finds and declares that	<u>:</u>

2	(3) The National Federation of State High School Associations		
3	has emphasized the important role that coaches play in students' lives,		
4	referencing a 2012 study of model high school coaches and their athletes		
5	finding that coaches teach "life skills, their student athletes [learn] the		
6	skills and [are] able to transfer them to other areas of their lives"; and		
7	(4) Students have only four (4) years to participate in sports		
8	and other extracurricular activities, and it is therefore paramount to ensure		
9	there are no barriers that restrict their ability to fully participate in		
10	sports and other extracurricular activities.		
11	(c) As used in this section:		
12	(1) "Interscholastic activity" means an interschool activity		
13	that is not included in a regular curriculum, including without limitation		
14	sports and special interest clubs or groups that are subject to regulations		
15	of the Arkansas Activities Association;		
16	(2) "Non-school athletic activity" means an organized athletic		
17	activity that is not sponsored by or associated with a school and in which		
18	participants are:		
19	(A) Engaged in an athletic game or competition against		
20	another team, club, or entity; or		
21	(B) In practice or preparation for an organized athletic		
22	game or competition against another team, club, or entity;		
23	(3) "Participate" means to:		
24	(A) Try out for an interscholastic activity or athletic		
25	team;		
26	(B) Practice with an athletic team or a group or team		
27	associated with an interscholastic activity;		
28	(C) Be a member of an athletic team or a group or team		
29	associated with an interscholastic activity; or		
30	(D) Play with an athletic team or a group or team		
31	associated with an interscholastic activity;		
32	(4) "School" means:		
33	(A) A public school or public school district;		
34	(B) An open-enrollment public charter school; or		
35	(C) A private or parochial school;		
36	(5) "School athletic activity" means an organized athletic		

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1	activity that is sponsored by or associated with a school and in which		
2	participants are:		
3	(A) Engaged in an athletic game or competition against		
4	another team, club, or entity; or		
5	(B) In practice or preparation for an organized athletic		
6	game or competition against another team, club, or entity; and		
7	(6) "Season" means the official period of time during which an		
8	interscholastic activity is played, including a playoff game.		
9	(d)(1) A student who is considered homeless under the McKinney-Vento		
10	Homeless Assistance Act, 42 U.S.C. § 11431 et seq., as it existed on January		
11	1, 2023, shall be immediately eligible to participate in interscholastic		
12	activities at the school in which he or she is enrolled.		
13	(2) The determination regarding whether a student qualifies for		
14	immediate eligibility under subdivision (d)(1) of this section shall be made		
15	by the local homeless liaison appointed under the McKinney-Vento Homeless		
16	Assistance Act, 42 U.S.C. § 11431 et seq., as it existed on January 1, 2023,		
17	at the school in which the student is enrolled.		
18	(e)(1)(A) Except as provided under subdivision (e)(2) of this section,		
19	a student who is a member of a school athletic activity and who has engaged		
20	in a competition for an interscholastic activity may participate with a non-		
21	school athletic activity that is of the same sport as the school athletic		
22	activity of which the student is a member during the season in which the		
23	student participates on the school athletic activity without losing		
24	eligibility to participate on the school athletic activity of which the		
25	<u>student is a member.</u>		
26	(B) A student shall not participate with a non-school		
27	athletic activity as permitted under subdivision (e)(1)(A) of this section on		
28	days when the school athletic activity of which the student is a member is		
29	scheduled to practice, compete, or otherwise play.		
30	(2) However, subdivision (e)(1)(A) of this section shall not		
31	apply to the following school athletic activities:		
32	(A) Football;		
33	(B) Basketball;		
34	(C) Baseball;		
35	(D) Softball; and		
36	(E) Volleyball.
