1 (b) School districts that utilize an amount of 2 state funds equal to one hundred percent (100%) or more of the amount allocated for teacher salaries, according to the most recent adequacy funding 3 4 matrix recommended by the Senate Committee on Education and the House 5 Committee on Education for the previous school year, for salaries for 6 teachers employed by the school districts. 7 (ii) For the 2021-2022 2023-2024 and 2022-2023 2024-8 2025 school years, the statewide target average annual salary shall be fifty-9 one thousand eight hundred twenty-two dollars (\$51,822). 10 (iii) The House Committee on Education and the 11 Senate Committee on Education shall set jointly the statewide target average 12 annual salary for the 2023-2024 2025-2026 and 2024-2025 2026-2027 school 13 years, and each biennium thereafter, as part of the adequacy review process 14 required under § 10-3-2102. 15 (B)(i) On or before October 31 of each year, the Division 16 of Elementary and Secondary Education shall determine if a school district is 17 eligible to receive teacher salary equalization funds by reviewing certified 18 salary data submitted by the school district for the immediately preceding fiscal year. 19 20 (ii) A school district with an average annual 21 teacher salary meeting or exceeding the statewide target average annual 22 teacher salary for the year that qualifies for teacher salary equalization 23 funds under subdivision (b)(6)(A)(i) of this section is ineligible to receive 24 teacher salary equalization funds exceeding the amount received by the school 25 district in the previous year. 26 (iii) A school district that receives funds from the 27 Educator Compensation Reform Fund is ineligible to receive teacher salary 28 equalization funds for the year in which the school district receives funds 29 from the Educator Compensation Reform Fund. 30 (iv) A school district shall continue to receive 31 teacher salary equalization funds in the same amount as the preceding fiscal 32 year in addition to the amount eligible for the current fiscal year. 33 (C) Teacher salary equalization funding provided to a 34 school district under this subchapter shall be expended only for teacher salaries and benefits. 35 36

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
