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28	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL
29	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

31	WHEREAS, there are over one hundred thousand (100,000) American service
32	members and dependents stationed in Japan, more than any other place in the
33	world other than the United States; and
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35	WHEREAS, active-duty Arkansans are, and will continue to be, stationed
36	abroad in Japan while serving in the United States Armed Forces; and



1	WHEREAS, Status of Forces Agreements are designed to ensure adequate
2	and fair legal treatment of American service members stationed abroad; and
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4	WHEREAS, in practice, the United States-Japan Status of Forces
5	Agreement does not appear to provide adequate legal protection for American
6	service members as there are reports that Japan regularly violates the Status
7	of Forces Agreement by detaining American service members without adequate
8	cause or necessity prior to charges; and
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10	WHEREAS, there are reports that Japanese authorities consistently deny
11	legal counsel to service members during police interrogations and fail to
12	provide adequate translation assistance during interrogations and trials,
13	which would violate Department of Defense policy regarding the legal rights
14	of service members overseas as outlined in Secretary of the Navy Instruction
15	5820.4G and Army Regulation 27-50; and
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17	WHEREAS, the case of Navy Lieutenant Ridge Alkonis embodies the
18	reported issues surrounding the United States-Japan Status of Forces
19	Agreement as Lieutenant Alkonis experienced prejudicial treatment during
20	Japanese police detainment and trial; and
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22	WHEREAS, there are numerous reports of Lieutenant Alkonis receiving
23	extremely suspect legal advice and inadequate support from United States Nav
24	personnel during legal proceedings; and
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26	WHEREAS, there is evidence of the United States Navy knowingly
27	misleading members of the United States Congress regarding Lieutenant
28	Alkonis's case; and
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30	WHEREAS, there is sufficient evidence to reasonably suspect that
31	Lieutenant Alkonis is wrongfully detained; and
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33	WHEREAS, the United States Congress through the United States House
34	Committee on Armed Services is responsible for conducting oversight of the
35	United States Navy and ensuring that international agreements are in the best
36	interest of the American people and abided by the parties entered therein,

GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN: 3 4 5 THAT the House of Representatives of the Ninety-fourth General Assembly 6 of the State of Arkansas, the Senate concurring, encourage the United States 7 Congress and the National Security Council to: 8 (a) Conduct a formal review of the Status of Forces Agreement between 9 the United States and Japan to ensure that the agreement is in the best 10 interest of the United States and adequately protects American service 11 members in accordance with constitutional rights and United States Department 12 of Defense policy; and 13 (b) Conduct an official investigation into the circumstances and 14 dealings surrounding the investigation, trial, and conviction of Navy 15 Lieutenant Ridge Alkonis to ensure that Lieutenant Alkonis was treated fairly 16 by Japan and that the United States Navy provided fair and adequate support; 17 and 18 (c) Refer Lieutenant Ridge Alkonis's case to the Special Presidential 19 Envoy for Hostage Affairs to be designated as a wrongfully detained case. 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT upon adoption of this resolution, an appropriate 22 copy be provided by the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives to the 23 majority leader of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States 24 House of Representatives, the Chairman of the United States House Committee 25 on Armed Services, the Chairman of the United States Senate Committee on 26 Armed Services, the Chairman of the United State Senate Committee on Foreign 27 Relations, the Chairman of the United States House Committee on Foreign 28 Affairs, the Chairman of the United States Senate Committee on the Judiciary, 29 the Chairman of the United States House Committee on the Judiciary, the 30 National Security Advisor, and the members of the Arkansas congressional 31 delegation. 32 33 34 35 36
