16 WHEREAS, National Deaf History Month is celebrated nationally from
17 April 1st through April 30th; and

19 WHEREAS, National Deaf History Month was introduced in 1997 by the
20 National Association of the Deaf to help highlight significant events that
21 have impacted the deaf community over the course of history, including the
22 opening of the American School for the Deaf, the first public school for the
23 deaf and hard of hearing, on April 15, 1817, the unveiling of Gallaudet
24 University, the first secondary institution for the deaf and hard of hearing,
25 on April 8, 1864, as well as the nomination of Gallaudet's first deaf
26 president on March 13, 1988; and

28 WHEREAS, Arkansas has served as the home of many historic Deaf
29 changemakers, and this month is a time to celebrate their incredible
30 achievements as well as continue to raise awareness about the inequities
31 faced by members of these communities, and advocate for the rights of all
32 deaf and hard of hearing persons to thrive; and

34 WHEREAS, Arkansas School for the Deaf, established in 1849, continues
35 to serve persons of all ages who are deaf, deafblind, or hard of hearing from
36 early childhood to adulthood; and
