- 27 Arkansas for Medical Sciences.

- 29 SECTION 45. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 30 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ABUSED
- 31 CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS SERVICES PROGRAM FUNDING PROVISION. In the event
- 32 the amount of general revenue distributed to the University of Arkansas
- 33 Medical Center Fund for the Department of Pediatrics and the Psychiatric
- 34 Research Institute each fiscal year is at least equal to the amount
- 35 distributed during the 2012-13 fiscal year, an amount not less than seven
- 36 hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) shall be allocated and made available as

- 1 follows: four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) each fiscal year
- 2 shall be made available exclusively to support the purposes and goals to
- 3 improve screening, monitoring and care for abused children and adolescents
- 4 through the Child Safety Centers or the University of Arkansas for Medical
- 5 Sciences as referred by the Child Safety Centers. Maintenance of statewide
- 6 screening and assessment protocols as well as evidence-based training of
- 7 mental health professionals are to be considered critical components of the
- 8 overall goals. For the provision of assessment and therapeutic services,
- 9 these funds are to be provided to the Child Safety Centers through contracts
- 10 from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. The contracts will
- 11 stipulate the terms of the agreement and reporting requirements; an amount
- 12 not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) may be utilized for
- 13 administrative costs as may be necessary to administer the program or if
- 14 determined not to be needed for administrative costs may be placed in reserve
- 15 for future needs of the program. The remaining two hundred thousand dollars
- 16 (\$200,000) shall be allocated and made available to the Department of
- 17 Pediatrics for expenses for medical examinations, consultation, education and
- 18 training as stipulated in the terms of agreement between the Chancellor of
- 19 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Department of
- 20 Pediatrics.
- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2022
- 22 2023 through June 30, <del>2023</del> 2024.

- 24 SECTION 46. SPECIAL LANGUAGE CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code Title 6,
- 25 Chapter 64, Subchapter 4, is amended to add an additional section to codify
- 26 special language in appropriation acts to read as follows:
- 27 6-64-423. Medicaid memorandum of understanding.
- 28 Upon prior review of the Legislative Council or, if the General
- 29 Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget Committee, the University of
- 30 Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Department of Human Services shall
- 31 enter into a memorandum of understanding to determine any reimbursement,
- 32 administrative charges, or fees for:
- 33 (1) The State Olmstead plan;
- 34 (2) Processing or administration of state match funds charges as
- 35 reimbursement funding for federal financial participation under the Medicaid
- 36 <u>Disproportionate Share Hospital program; or</u>

(3) Any other arrangements or agreements that could benefit the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences.

SECTION 47. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditure Restriction Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 49. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2023 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2023 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2023.
