20	Arkansas, it is necessary for local entities to conduct due-diligence
21	business studies before applying for federal grants or loans for broadband

23	(3) Expenses associated with broadband due-diligence business
24	studies can be burdensome to rural Arkansas communities, and it is in the
25	best interest of all Arkansans to make an investment to develop broadband in
26	rural areas;
27	(4) Under current Arkansas law, only certain eligible
28	telecommunications carriers have benefited from the Arkansas High Cost Fund
29	under § 23-17-404, which underwrites broadband deployment; and
30	(5) It is necessary to provide funds to local entities to

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1 positions.

2 (c) If the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences requests 3 continuation of any "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" position(s) as 4 established herein during the next fiscal year, the position(s) must be 5 requested as a new position(s) in the agency's budget request.

6 (d) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency 7 is the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by 8 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying job titles and the 9 maximum grade or salary attached to those titles. The General Assembly has 10 determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be 11 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution. 12 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing a position pool in 13 Subsection (a) of this Section and since the General Assembly has granted the 14 agency broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary and 15 appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the utilization 16 of the position pool by requiring review of the Legislative Council or Joint 17 Budget Committee in the utilization of the position pool. Therefore, the 18 requirement of review by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is 19 not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of review by the 20 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a 21 court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

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25 SECTION 45. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code Title 6, 26 Chapter 63, Subchapter 3, is amended to add an additional section to codify 27 special language in appropriation acts to read as follows:

28 6-63-318. On-call compensation for patient care employees.

29 (a) The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences may provide on-30 call duty compensation or standby duty differential compensation for a classified or non-classified patient care employee whose job requires him or 31 32 her to provide patient care when there is no regularly scheduled staff 33 coverage. 34 (b) A classified or non-classified patient care employee shall not

exceed one hundred twenty-eight (128) hours during any seven (7) day period, 35 36

at rates of pay not to exceed the pay provided in the Uniform Classification

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6 SECTION 46. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ABUSED 8 CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS SERVICES PROGRAM FUNDING PROVISION. In the event 9 the amount of general revenue distributed to the University of Arkansas 10 Medical Center Fund for the Department of Pediatrics and the Psychiatric 11 Research Institute each fiscal year is at least equal to the amount 12 distributed during the 2012-13 fiscal year, an amount not less than seven 13 hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) shall be allocated and made available as 14 follows: four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) each fiscal year 15 shall be made available exclusively to support the purposes and goals to 16 improve screening, monitoring and care for abused children and adolescents 17 through the Child Safety Centers or the University of Arkansas for Medical 18 Sciences as referred by the Child Safety Centers. Maintenance of statewide 19 screening and assessment protocols as well as evidence-based training of 20 mental health professionals are to be considered critical components of the 21 overall goals. For the provision of assessment and therapeutic services, 22 these funds are to be provided to the Child Safety Centers through contracts 23 from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. The contracts will 24 stipulate the terms of the agreement and reporting requirements; an amount 25 not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) may be utilized for 26 administrative costs as may be necessary to administer the program or if 27 determined not to be needed for administrative costs may be placed in reserve 28 for future needs of the program. The remaining two hundred thousand dollars 29 (\$200,000) shall be allocated and made available to the Department of 30 Pediatrics for expenses for medical examinations, consultation, education and 31 training as stipulated in the terms of agreement between the Chancellor of 32 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Department of 33 Pediatrics. 34 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2022

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1 SECTION 47. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code Title 6, 2 Chapter 64, Subchapter 4, is amended to add an additional section to codify 3 special language in appropriation acts to read as follows: 4 6-64-423. Medicaid memorandum of understanding. 5 Upon prior review of the Legislative Council or, if the General 6 Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget Committee, the University of 7 Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Department of Human Services shall 8 enter into a memorandum of understanding to determine any reimbursement, 9 administrative charges, or fees for: 10 (1) The State Olmstead plan; 11 (2) Processing or administration of state match funds charges as 12 reimbursement funding for federal financial participation under the Medicaid 13 Disproportionate Share Hospital program; or (3) Any other arrangements or agreements that could benefit the 14 15 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. 16 17 SECTION 48. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 18 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 19 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 20 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 21 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 22 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditure Restriction 23 Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where 24 applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and 25 Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in 26 disbursement of said funds.

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SECTION 49. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 28 29 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 30 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 31 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 32 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 33 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 34 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 35 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 36

1	SECTION 50. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
2	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
3	appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
4	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2023, with the exception that Section 27
5	is effective upon passage and approval, is essential to the operation of the
6	agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the
7	event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective
8	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2023, with the exception that Section 27 is
9	effective upon passage and approval, could work irreparable harm upon the
10	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
11	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
12	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
13	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2023 with the
14	exception that Section 27 is effective upon passage and approval.
