EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the

13 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the 14 15 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2023 is essential to the operation of 16 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 17 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2023 could work irreparable harm 18 19 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental 20 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health 21 22 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2023.
