2	recess time required under this section due to special circumstances or
3	programs that interrupt a regular school day.
4	(E)(i) A public elementary school may seek a waiver from
5	the requirements under this subdivision (a)(5) if the public elementary
6	school:
7	(a) Submits to the Division of Elementary and
8	Secondary Education for approval an alternative plan for recess that:
9	(1) Exceeds the required minimum amount
10	of minutes combined for physical activity under § 6-16-132 and recess under
11	this section; and
12	(2) Provides for both structured and
13	unstructured social time; or
14	(b) Is approved by the division to operate as
15	a virtual school.
16	(ii) Beginning with the 2019-2020 school year, the
17	division shall provide to the House Committee on Education and the Senate

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25	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-16-102(b), concerning the State Board of
26	Education rules promulgated regarding credit given to students for attending
27	a portion of a school day, is repealed.
28	(b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, the State Board of
29	Education shall promulgate rules to prescribe the credit to be given students
30	for attending school for only a portion of a school day because the school is
31	closed due to emergency circumstances which would be hazardous to the health
32	of the students. The state board shall also identify the emergency
33	circumstances.
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35	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-16-132(b)(1)(A), concerning physical
36	education curriculum and physical activity requirements for public school

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1 students, is amended to read as follows: 2 (b)(1)(A) The physical education curriculum and physical activity 3 requirements for every public school student who is able to participate are: 4 (i) Except as provided in subdivision (b)(l)(A)(ii) 5 of this section, for students in kindergarten through grade six (K-6): (a) At least forty (40) minutes, as determined 6 7 by the superintendent of the school district, of physical education training 8 and instruction each calendar week of the school year; and 9 (b) Ninety (90) One-hundred forty (140) minutes of physical activity each calendar week of the school year, which may 10 count toward the hours of instructional time required for a school day under 11 12 *§* 6-16-102, and which may include without limitation daily: 13 (1) Daily recess, physical; 14 (2) Physical education instruction in 15 addition to, including the requirement of subdivision (b)(1)(A)(i)(a) of this 16 section, or intramural; and 17 (3) Intramural sports; and 18 (c)(1) Twenty (20) minutes of recess each 19 school day. 20 (2) Recess required under subdivision 21 (b)(l)(A)(i)(c)(l) of this section shall: 22 (A) Consist of supervised, 23 unstructured social time during which public school students may communicate 24 with each other; 25 (B) Occur outdoors when weather and other relevant conditions permit; and 26 27 (C) Include without limitation opportunities for free play and vigorous physical activity, regardless of 28 29 whether recess occurs indoors or outdoors; (ii) For students in grades five through eight (5-8) 30 31 who attend a public school organized to teach grades five through eight (5-8), or any combination thereof, at least forty (40) minutes, as determined by 32 33 the superintendent of the school district, of physical education training and instruction each calendar week of the school year or an equivalent amount of 34 35 time in each school year with no additional requirement for physical 36 activity; and

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1	(iii) For students in grades nine through twelve (9-
2	12), one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) unit of physical education as required for high school
3	graduation with no additional requirement for physical activity.
