9	(a)(l) A nursing program may establish a nursing earn-to-learn program			
10	to allow a nursing student who is seeking an initial licensure as a licensed			
11	practical nurse or a registered nurse to earn direct patient care clinical			
12	credit hours while working in a healthcare facility as a certified nursing			
13	assistant, patient care technician, or other job with a similar title.			
14	(2) A nursing student may not work greater than twenty (20)			
15	hours per week as a certified nursing assistant, patient care technician, or			
16	other job with a similar title.			
17	(3) The direct patient clinical credit hours earned under this			
18	section shall not exceed fifty percent (50%) of the direct patient care			
19	clinical credit hours outlined in the foundational curricula of the nursing			
20	program or the senior level curricula of the nursing program.			
21	(b)(l) If a healthcare facility offers an advanced patient care			
22	position within the roles listed in subdivision (a)(1) of this section or			
23	with an additional position specifically for senior-level nursing students,			
24	then a senior-level nursing student may be allowed to receive credit for			
25	senior-level direct patient care clinical hours.			
26	(2) A senior-level nursing student who is working in an advanced			
27	nursing role shall work with at least one (1) nurse but not more than two (2)			
28	nurses to protect patient safety and to allow for a focused, quality student

30	(3) The nursing program and the healthcare facility shall			
31	establish boundaries and expectations of the senior-level nursing student			
32	based on accreditation standards and rules of the Arkansas State Board of
