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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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20	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 17, Chapter 87, Subchapter 2, is	
21	amended to add additional sections to read as follows:	
22	17-87-208. Clinical Nurse Education Portal.	
23	(a) The Department of Health, in coordination with the Arkansas Stat	<u>te</u>
24	Board of Nursing, shall establish the "Clinical Nurse Education Portal".	
25	(b) The portal shall:	
26	(1) Be a statewide management software system that contains	
27	information for all nursing programs in Arkansas in relation to clinical	
28	nursing placement access for nursing students and healthcare facilities;	
29	(2) Be compliant with the Family Educational Rights and Privac	<u>су</u>
30	Act of 1974, 20 U.S.C. § 1232g, and the Health Insurance Portability and	
31	Accountability Act of 1996;	
32	(3) Provide clinical access and utilization data to the board	to
33	inform future quality improvement initiatives;	
34	(4) Contain compliance, orientation, clinical schedules, and	
35	affiliation information for a clinical nursing placement; and	
36	(5) Be accessible to all healthcare providers and nursing	

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1	programs with clinical hour requirements, including simulation laboratory
2	hours.
3	(c) The department may contract with a non-state entity to establish
4	and maintain the portal.
5	(d)(l) All nursing programs and healthcare providers participating or
6	desire to participate in providing nursing clinical experiences shall have
7	access to the portal and the ability to manage clinical requests,
8	affiliations, and clinical compliance utilizing the software.
9	(2) A nursing program or healthcare provider is not required to
10	adopt the use of the portal as their primary clinical experience management
11	software.
12	(3) However, a nursing program or a healthcare provider may not
13	refuse onboarding or compliance information shared via the portal once
14	agreements are made for a clinical experience placement.
15	(e)(1) On the year-anniversary of the effective date of this section
16	and annually thereafter, the department shall report on the implementation,
17	progress, and activity of the portal to the:
18	(A) Senate Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor;
19	<u>and</u>
20	(B) House Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor.
21	(2) The Chair of the Senate Committee on Public Health, Welfare,
22	and Labor or the Chair of the House Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and
23	Labor may request any additional reports at their discretion.
24	(f)(l) The portal may be funded by one-time funds under the American
25	Rescue Plan Act, if available and eligible, to fund personnel and build
26	software programs.
27	(2) In order to maintain the portal, the department may charge a
28	fee to nursing programs or healthcare providers, or both, that use the
29	portal.
30	(g) The department may expand the portal to include other disciplines
31	of healthcare professionals.
