23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

25 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 23-18-504(a), concerning exemptions under
26 the Utility Facility Environmental and Economic Protection Act, is amended to
27 add an additional subdivision to read as follows:

28 (6) That is a gas pipeline constructed:

29 (A) Primarily for serving a single customer or a group of
30 customers that is under common ownership or control; and

31 (B) Entirely on land:

32 (i) Owned by the customer or group of customers to
33 be served; or

34 (ii) Leased by the customer or group of customers to
35 be served if the lease is entered to facilitate the issuance of bonds under
36 Chapter 164 of this title.

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the inflation rate is high, with the consumer price index for all items increasing six and five-tenths percent (6.5%) and food items increasing ten and four-tenths percent (10.4%) over the last twelve (12) months according to the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics; that many Arkansans are in need of jobs in this economy; and that this act is immediately necessary because commencement of construction on pipelines will make jobs available to the people of Arkansas. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
