22	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 25, Chapter 43, Subchapter 9, is
23	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:
24	25-43-905. Dementia services coordinator.
25	(a) The Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services of
26	the Department of Human Services shall establish a Dementia Services
27	Coordinator as a full-time position.
28	(b) The Dementia Services Coordinator shall:
29	(1) Evaluate the coordination of dementia services within this
30	state;
31	(2) Coordinate information resources affecting Arkansans living
32	with dementia and their caregivers, including without limitation:
33	(A) Use dementia-related data to coordinate ways to
34	improve public health outcomes and service delivery of persons with
35	Alzheimer's disease or related dementia;
36	(B) Establish and maintain relationships with other

1	agencies, providers, and organizations within the State in order to meet the
2	needs of affected populations and prevent the duplication of services;
3	(C) Support the provision of dementia-specific staff
4	training across all relevant state agencies, including law enforcement, the
5	Department of Human Services, and other organizations; and
6	(D) Recommend strategies to improve coordination of
7	dementia related services and resources provided by public and private
8	entities;
9	(3) Streamline all applicable state government services to
10	increase efficiency and improve the quality of care in residential and home-
11	and community-based settings;
12	(4) Identify:
13	(A) Any duplicated services; and
14	(B) Grant opportunities to expand the scope of services
15	for persons living with dementia and their caregivers and apply for the grant
16	opportunities;
17	(5) Complete other duties relevant to supporting policy
18	development and implementation to enhance the quality of life for persons
19	affected by dementia and their caregivers;
20	(6) Promote public and professional awareness and education of
21	dementia and access to needed services and programs; and
22	(7) Collect and monitor data concerning the impact of dementia
23	<u>in Arkansas.</u>
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
