Arkansas Code § 11-6-103, concerning the penalties and 9 disposition of fines related to child labor violations, is amended to add 10 additional subsections to read as follows: 11 (h)(l) In addition to the civil penalties provided for in subsection 12 (a) of this section, an employer who knowingly violates this subchapter is, 13 upon conviction, guilty of a Class C misdemeanor. 14 (2) Upon a second or subsequent conviction, the employer is 15 guilty of a Class B misdemeanor.
