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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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21	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 17-3-102(h)(4), concerning licensing	
22	restrictions based on criminal records, is repealed.	
23	(4) Of body artists under § 17-26-601 et seq.	
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25	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-26-201(c), concerning the creation and	
26	members of the Cosmetology Technical Advisory Committee, is amended to rea	d
27	as follows:	
28	(c) The committee shall be composed of the following representative	s
29	from within the cosmetology industry who are at least twenty-five (25) year	rs
30	of age:	
31	(1) One (1) member shall be a licensed cosmetologist actively	
32	engaged in practicing the art of cosmetology for at least five (5) years a	t
33	the time of appointment;	
34	(2) One (1) member shall be a licensed nail technician;	
35	(3) One (1) member shall be an owner of a licensed school of	
36	cosmetology or shall be a director of cosmetology at a state-supported	

T	school;
2	(4) One (1) member shall be a licensed aesthetician;
3	(5) Three (3) members One (1) member shall represent the
4	cosmetology industry at large or a related field;
5	(6) One (1) member shall represent the permanent and
6	semipermanent cosmetic industry be a licensed permanent cosmetic artist
7	actively engaged in the practice of permanent cosmetics for a minimum of five
8	(5) years in the State of Arkansas at the time of the appointment; and
9	(7) One (1) member shall represent the body art industry;
10	(8) One (1) member shall be a licensed tattoo artist actively
11	engaged in the practice of tattooing for a minimum of five (5) years in the
12	State of Arkansas at the time of the appointment;
13	(9) One (1) member shall be a licensed piercing artist actively
14	engaged in the practice of piercing for a minimum of five (5) years in the
15	State of Arkansas at the time of the appointment.
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17	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 17-26-601(1)-(3), concerning the
18	definitions in relation to body art, are amended to read as follows:
19	(1) "Artist" means any person other than a licensed physician
20	who performs body art on a human and is licensed in this state;
21	(2) "Artist in training Student artist" means a person who:
22	(A) Is in training under the supervision of an artist
23	trainer instructor or a physician; and
24	(B) Shall not perform body art independently without the
25	supervision of an artist instructor;
26	(3) "Artist trainer instructor" means an artist who:
27	(A) Has been licensed by the Department of Health as an
28	artist for at least five (5) years in the specified field of body art in
29	which he or she will offer training;
30	(B) Has worked in a body art establishment licensed by the
31	department for at least five (5) years and been in compliance with department
32	rules governing body artists;
33	(C) Has completed the course required under § 17-26-606;
34	and and
35	(D) Is a registered instructor for the specified field of
36	body art with the department;

1	(E) Has completed a course in safety and sanitation
2	guidelines and requirements by the department;
3	(F) Shall not exceed a ratio of one (1) instructor to
4	eight (8) students per instruction hour;
5	(G) Is at least twenty-one (21) years of age; and
6	(H) Has completed two hundred and fifty (250)
7	instructional hours from a state approved instructor program.
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9	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 17-26-601, concerning definitions in
10	relation to body art, is amended to add additional subdivisions to read as
11	follows:
12	(15) "Host" means an individual or business entity, including an
13	event coordinator or manager, responsible for the organization of a
14	convention, tradeshow, or other temporary event that includes a body art
15	demonstration booth;
16	(16) "Institution" means an establishment that is licensed by
17	the department to offer postsecondary education to student artists in
18	training through artist instructors in the field of body art;
19	(17)(A) "Permanent cosmetics" means the application of pigment
20	placed in the skin by a needle or other instrument to beautify the body,
21	including without limitation for the purposes of:
22	(A) Scar camouflaging;
23	(B) Scalp micropigmentation;
24	(C) Pigment lightening;
25	(D) Applying permanent eyebrows, including without
26	limitation:
27	(i) Microblading; and
28	(ii) Manual methods;
29	(E) Applying permanent eyeliner;
30	(F) Applying permanent lip liner or lip color; and
31	(G) Applying three-dimensional nipples and areola.
32	(B) "Permanent cosmetics" does not include tattooing or a
33	tattooing procedure.
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35	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 17-26-602(b) and (c), concerning
36	documentation and consent to perform body art on person under eighteen years

- 1 of age, are amended to read as follows:
- 2 (b) A person shall not perform body art on a person under sixteen (16)
- 3 years of age, regardless of parental consent, except when piercing the
- 4 earlobe or when the person is given medical consent due to medical necessity
- 5 from a physician in addition to parental consent.
- 6 (c) It is unlawful <u>for a person</u> to perform body art on the <u>nipple</u>
- 7 <u>areola</u> or genitalia of a person under eighteen (18) years of age regardless
- 8 of parental consent unless given medical consent due to medical necessity
- 9 from a physician in addition to parental consent.

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- 11 SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 17-26-603(a)(2), concerning the authority
- 12 of the Department of Health to license, regulate, and inspect for health
- 13 hazards of body art establishments, is amended to read as follows:
- 14 (2) A body art training facility An institution shall be
- 15 licensed by the department as an establishment and as an approved body art
- 16 training facility institution.

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- SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 17-26-603(a)(4), concerning the authority
- 19 of the Department of Health to license, regulate, and inspect for health
- 20 hazards of body art establishments, is amended to read as follows:
- 21 (4) The business premises, equipment, procedures, techniques,
- 22 and conditions of those businesses shall be subject to at least one (1)
- 23 inspection by the department annually.

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- SECTION 8. Arkansas Code § 17-26-603(b)(1), concerning the authority
- of the Department of Health to license, regulate, and inspect for health
- 27 hazards of body art establishments, is amended to read as follows:
- 28 (b)(1) The department may adopt appropriate rules regarding the
- 29 artists, premises, equipment, procedures, techniques, and conditions of
- 30 establishments which perform procedures subject to this subchapter to assure
- 31 that the premises, equipment, procedures, techniques, and conditions are
- 32 aseptic and do not constitute a health hazard.

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- 34 SECTION 9. Arkansas Code § 17-26-603(e)(2)(A), concerning the
- 35 authority of the Department of Health to license, regulate, and inspect for
- 36 health hazards of body art establishments, is amended to read as follows:

1	(2)(A) The department shall collect a one-time fee of five
2	hundred dollars (\$500) two hundred dollars (\$200) per artist licensed in a
3	state other than Arkansas or a country other than the United States who
4	applies for qualifications review by the department.
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6	SECTION 10. Arkansas Code § 17-26-606 is amended to read as follows:
7	17-26-606. Blood-borne pathogens course.
8	(a)(1) Each artist, artist <del>trainer</del> <u>instructor</u> , and <u>student</u> artist <del>in</del>
9	training shall complete United States Occupational Safety and Health
10	Administration blood-borne pathogens training approved by the Department of
11	Health.
12	(2) An approved online course may be used to satisfy the
13	requirement under subdivision (a)(l) of this section.
14	(b) Each artist trainer instructor shall complete the course before
15	training any <u>student</u> artist <del>in training</del> .
16	(c) Each <u>student</u> artist <del>in training</del> shall complete the course before
17	applying for the examination required under § 17-26-608.
18	(d)(1) After completion of a first United States Occupational Safety
19	and Health Administration blood-borne pathogens training approved by the
20	department, an artist, an artist trainer instructor, and an a student artist
21	in training shall renew the training annually.
22	(2) A copy of each annual certification under subdivision (d)(1)
23	of this section shall be submitted to the department with the license
24	renewal.
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26	SECTION 11. Arkansas Code § 17-26-607 is amended to read as follows:
27	17-26-607. Education of student artist in training.
28	(a) An artist <del>trainer</del> <u>instructor</u> shall be a registered instructor in a
29	school institution licensed by the Department of Health.
30	(b) The department shall develop standards to determine:
31	(1) The maximum number of <u>student</u> artists in training in a
32	training facility at any time shall be at a ratio of no more than eight (8)
33	students to one (1) artist instructor per instruction hour; and

  artist in training shall complete not less than three hundred seventy-five

- 13 hundred seventy-five (375) clock hours of supervised body art work and
- 14 classroom instruction in a period not less than six (6) months or more than
- twenty-four (24) months in an establishment licensed under § 17-26-603 and §
- $16 \quad 6-51-601 \text{ et seq.}$
- 17 (C) Additional fields of body art training may be added by
- 18 completing not less than two hundred fifty (250) clock hours of technical and
- 19 procedural training in each of the other fields of body art in which  $\frac{a}{a}$
- 20 <u>student</u> artist in training is to be licensed in no less than four (4) months.
- 21 (D) An A student artist in training studying multiple
- 22 fields of body art at the same time shall complete the total clock hours of
- 23 all fields in each specific field in not less than twelve (12) months or more
- 24 than twenty-four (24) months.
- 25 (2)(A) The artist trainer instructor shall maintain a training
- log of the clock hours completed by the <u>student</u> artist <del>in training</del> on forms
- 27 approved by the department.
- 28 (B) The training log shall include without limitation a
- 29 record of:
- 30 (i) Hours of both theory and practical education;
- 31 (ii) The procedures observed and completed; and
- 32 (iii) A list of resources used for training.
- 33 (C) The student artist in training shall keep available
- 34 for inspection a bound record book that is separate from the record book of
- 35 another artist or student artist in training.
- 36 (D) The completed training log shall be submitted to the

- 1 department at the time of the practical examination under § 17-26-608. 2 (d) An artist trainer instructor may offer training only in the area in which the artist trainer instructor holds a current license from the 3 4 department. 5 (e) The department shall adopt a minimum curriculum for each area of 6 body art training that shall be followed by all artist trainers instructors, 7 student artists in training, and body art training facilities. 8 9 SECTION 12. Arkansas Code § 17-26-609(c), concerning temporary 10 demonstration licenses, is amended to read as follows: 11 (c)(1) The sponsor host of a body art event for an educational 12 purpose, a trade show, a demonstration, or a combination of an educational 13 purpose, a trade show, and a demonstration of body art procedures where body 14 art is performed shall obtain the necessary permits to conduct business in 15 the jurisdiction in which the event will be held, including without 16 limitation a permit issued by the department. 17 (2) The department shall collect a nonrefundable sponsor host 18 fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00) per artist who performs body art at an event, 19 not to exceed two thousand dollars (\$2,000) per event. 20 (3) In addition to the penalties under § 17-26-602, a sponsor 21 host who violates this subsection is subject to closure of the temporary body 22 art event and a penalty not to exceed three (3) times the cost of the permit.
  - SECTION 13. Arkansas Code § 17-26-611(a)(5), concerning the prohibitions of the practice of body art, is amended to read as follows:
    - (5) In a procedure area that is not physically and permanently separated from beauty <u>facilities</u> <u>areas with a wall and a door</u>, such as <u>hair</u> cosmetology, aesthetics, and nail services; and

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
