2	(4) Amateur radio operators provide invaluable services by		
3	carrying on communications that save lives and property and make important		
4	contributions to local communities during emergencies and natural disasters;		
5	(5) Amateur radio service is regulated by federal law;		
6	(6)(A) Federal law under 47 C.F.R. § 97.15 provides that an		
7	amateur radio service station antenna structure may be erected at heights and		
8	dimensions sufficient to accommodate amateur service communication.		
9	(B) State and local government regulation of an amateur

1	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 18, Chapter 12, Subchapter 1, is		
2	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:		
3	<u>18-12-109. Amateur radio service station antenna structures —</u>		
4	Restrictions on regulation - Definition.		
5	(a) As used in this section, "association" means a nonprofit,		
6	mandatory-membership organization:		
7	(1) Comprised of owners of homes, condominiums, units in a		
8	horizontal property regime, cooperatives, manufactured homes, or any other		
9	interest in real property; and		
10	(2) Created pursuant to declaration, covenant, bill of		
11	assurance, master deed, or other applicable law.		
12	(b) An association shall not regulate the installation of an amateur		
13	radio service station antenna structure through a contract or any recorded or		
14	unrecorded document if that regulation would preclude amateur radio service		
15	communications.
