| 17 | SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the |
| 18 | General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that maternity leave improves |
| 19 | maternal and infant health, improves the mental and physical health of state |
| 20 | employees after the birth of a child, and potentially reduces future use of |
| 21 | sick leave; that maternity leave for adoptive children and foster children |
| 22 | will encourage adoption and fostering by state employees; that paid maternity |
| 23 | leave can increase employee retention and attract and retain new talent; and |
| 24 | that this act is immediately necessary because state employees' maternal and |
| 25 | infant needs are ongoing and of vital importance. Therefore, an emergency is |
| 26 | declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the |
| 27 | preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective |
| 28 | <u>on:</u> |
| 29 | (1) The date of its approval by the Governor; |
| 30 | (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, |
| 31 | the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the |
| 32 | <u>bill; or</u> |
| 33 | (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is |
| 34 | overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto. |
