15 TO AMEND ARKANSAS LAW TO ALLOW A VOTER
16 APPEARING IN PERSON TO REQUEST A PAPER
17 BALLOT.
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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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22 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 7, Chapter 5, Subchapter 6, is amended
23 to add an additional section to read as follows:

24 7-5-617. Right to request paper ballot.

25 (a) A voter appearing to vote in person is entitled to cast his or her
26 vote on a paper ballot, which shall be handled and counted as provided in
27 this subchapter.

28 (b)(1) The county clerk, election official, or poll worker shall
29 provide a voter with a paper ballot upon the request of the voter.

30 (2) A voter who requests a paper ballot under this section shall
31 not be refused a paper ballot for any reason.

32 (c)(1) A person who negligently violates the provisions of this
33 section by refusing to provide a paper ballot to a voter upon request shall:

34 (A) Be guilty of a Class C misdemeanor;

35 (B) Be considered to have committed an infamous crime as
36 defined under § 7-1-101; and



1 (C) Not be permitted to serve as an election official at
2 subsequent elections.

3 (2) It is a defense to prosecution for a poll worker under
4 subdivision (c)(1) of this section that the County Board of Election
5 Commissioners or the county clerk did not provide sufficient paper ballots
6 for the poll worker to provide a paper ballot to a voter upon request.

7 (d)(1) A person who purposely violates the provisions of this section
8 by refusing to provide a paper ballot to a voter upon request shall:

9 (A) Be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor;

10 (B) Be considered to have committed an infamous crime as
11 defined under § 7-1-101; and

12 (C) Not be permitted to serve as an election official at
13 subsequent elections.

14 (2) It is a defense to prosecution for a poll worker under
15 subdivision (d)(1) of this section that the County Board of Election
16 Commissioners or the county clerk did not provide sufficient paper ballots
17 for the poll worker to provide a paper ballot to a voter upon request.

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
